

VICTORY FOR SANTA CRUZ ATHLETES

Surf City Boys Carry Off the Hon-
ors of the Field and
Track Meet

SALINAS WINS SECOND PLACE

Summary of Events of the Sixth
Annual Contest of the Central
Counties League

The sixth annual field and track meet of the Central Counties Athletic league, held here last Saturday, was a hummer. Santa Cruz carried off the honors by a score of 54 points, Salinas second with 32 points, Watsonville third with 19 points. The other teams finished in the following order: Hollister, 10 points; Gilroy, 2 points; Pacific Grove and Monterey getting what the boys shot at.

Following is a summary of the events:

100 yard dash—Speckens, Watsonville, won; Harris, Salinas, second; H. Palmtag, Watsonville, third. Time, :10 4-5.

1 Mile run—Melon, Santa Cruz, won; Greer, Santa Cruz, second; Johannsen, Watsonville, third. Time, 5:00.

440 yard dash—Hinds, Santa Cruz, won; Archibald, Santa Cruz, second; H. Vanderhurst, Salinas, third. Time, :52 3.

880 yard run—Emery, Salinas, won; Hinds, Santa Cruz, second; Parker, Santa Cruz, third. Time, 2:12 (breaking the league record of 2:15, made by Bartlett of Santa Cruz in 1907).

220 yard low hurdles—First heat—Grover, Santa Cruz, won; V. Vanderhurst, Salinas, second. Second heat—Feliz, Salinas, won; Keast, Watsonville, second. Final heat—Grover, Santa Cruz, won; Feliz, Salinas, second; Vanderhurst, Salinas, third. Time, :27:4, breaking league record of :29:2 made by Grover of Santa Cruz in 1909.

Pole vault—Wing, Watsonville, won; Feliz, Salinas, second; Williams, Santa Cruz, third. Height, 10 feet. (Wing then tries for record, clearing 10 feet 4 inches, and breaking league record of 9 feet, 8 inches, made by McDougall and Tavernetti, both of Salinas, in 1908).

Shot put (12 pounds)—Scholefield, Hollister, won; Piazzoni, Salinas, second; Mosher, Santa Cruz, third. Distance, 44 feet, 7 inches, breaking the league record of 44 feet, 4 inches, made by Taylor of Santa Cruz in 1907.

Broad jump—V. Vanderhurst, Salinas, won; Lammiman, Watsonville, second; Archibald, Santa Cruz, third. Distance, 18 feet, 10 inches.

Hammer throw (12 pounds)—Scholefield, Hollister, won; Mosher, Santa Cruz, second; Wing, Watsonville, third. Distance, 145 feet, 3 inches, breaking the league record of 134 feet, 3½ inches, made by Palmtag of Watsonville in 1908.

220 yard dash—Archibald, Santa Cruz, won; Palmtag, Watsonville, second; Harris, Salinas, third. Time, :24.

High jump—Hinds and Berry, Santa Cruz, tied for first; Feliz, Salinas, second. Height, 5 feet, 5 inches.
