

COALINGA ATHLETES WIN HIGH SCHOOL TRACK MEET

Pasadena is Second in Prep Fight for Championship. Charlie Paddock Defeated in Hundred-yard Dash by Melville of Berkeley, but Comes Back and Takes Long Dash—Davis Jumps Some Distance.

SAN FRANCISCO BUREAU OF THE TIMES, April 23.—With Southern California schools predominating in competition, Coalinga High School won the honors of the California Interscholastic Federation this afternoon on Berkeley oval, outdistancing her rivals. The oil fields contingent rolled up a total of twenty-five points, while Pasadena, nearest rival, had but seventeen. Sacramento was the only one of the northern prep schools to make a showing, totaling fifteen when the count was made.

Close to thirty-five schools participated, and while the big entry list precluded a lot of points for any one team, there were some interesting events. Four C. I. F. records were smashed, by good margins, and one was tied.

Perhaps the prettiest race of the day was furnished in the final of the hundred, where Melville of Berkeley barely beat Paddock, the Pasadena speed marvel, to the tape. It was run in 16 flat, which sets up a new mark for the lads to shoot at in the future.

Paddock had his revenge later when he took the 220 in 22 flat, equaling the former federation performance made by L. Wark of Long Beach. Melville ran second.

Davis of Los Angeles Polytechnic jumped twenty-one feet ten and one-half inches, which is some better than the twenty-one feet five and one-fourth inches of H. Lamport of Manual Arts, and in the discus Evans of Chaffey did 122 feet 11 inches, ex-

ceeding the old record of 117 feet held by Weeks of Santa Rosa. In the javelin McCoy helped Coalinga to five points by making the distance 154 feet 5 inches, the former record being 149 feet 6 inches, held by Higelow of Modesto.

Southern California Carries Off Honors in C. I. F. Meet

Pasadena Takes Second Place in Event Featured by Many Thrills.

COALINGA High School's track and field machine, its joints nicely lubricated with the oil that thrives down Fresno county way, captured the California Interscholastic Federation championship yesterday at Berkeley, with a total of twenty-five wholesome markers. This was eight better than the seventeen accumulated by the young gentlemen who get their education and late sartorial hints at Pasadena High School.

The entire meet was marked indelibly with Central and Southern California footprints. The outside athletic talent accounted for most of the day's points the only institution,

thriving in bay county and peninsula ozone, that put up half a battle for the points being Berkeley. The college town was ably represented by a youngster called Melville. Melville accounted for first place in the century and was just nosed out for a win in the furlong by Paddock of Pasadena, who stepped into the worsted a stager to the good.

On the run of the day's performances, outside of the sprints, the track events were only mediocre. In the field it was better, three records falling by wayside. The federation people handled their meet in proper style, and what was wanting in the way of entertainment was compensated for by swiftness in urging the boys to their marks.

The best race of the day was the one-half mile relay, four men from each team going for two hundred and twenty yards. Los Angeles Polytechnic, the winner, started out a yard or so to the bad, but picked up in the second lap and battled neck and neck with Pasadena to the tape at the struggle's end, where the Polytechnic sash led by a mere two yards.
