

SACRAMENTO WINS TRACK MEET AT BIGGS

LOCAL SPRINTERS SHOW HEELS TO THE FIELD

BIGGS (Butte Co.), May 1.—Scoring five first and three second places and annexing several third places, the Sacramento High School track team won the annual meet for this section of the California Interscholastic Federation. The Sacramento athletes ran up a total of 49 points, and their nearest competitor was the Sutter City team with 25 points. The others finished as follows: Marysville 14, Stockton 12, and Chico 10.

Local Sprinters Win.

The feature of the meet was the sprinters for the Sacramento school. In the 220-yard dash the Purple and White team took first, second and third when Adams, Willi and Cole finished in the order named. The same would have happened in the 100-yard dash, but Willi was set back

for breaking. Adams took the race and Cole was second.

Kenneth Pollack, who is a Sophomore, showed the field the way as a surprise in the 440-yard dash. The Sacramento runner won the event easily, and was not figured in the race. The Purple and White relay team of Adams, Wilson, Cole and Willi took the half mile relay without being pressed.

Two Records Shattered.

Two interscholastic records for the Northern section were shattered. Kaer of Red Bluff clipped two-fifths of a second off the low hurdles time. He made the race in 27 1-5 seconds. Krenz of Stockton added three and seven-tenths feet to the discus record. He hurled the object 114 7-10 feet. Kaer's time under the condition of the track was considered very good. High School Track Teams Meet At Biggs To-morrow

ONE hundred and fifty-five athletes, representing nineteen high schools of Superior California, will meet at Biggs, Butte County, to-morrow for the championships of this part of the State of the California Interscholastic Federation. This will be one of the largest high school track meets ever held in Superior California. Prospects are for a hard-fought and interesting meet.

Sacramento Improved.

Sacramento High's chances of winning the California Interscholastic Federation's track and field meet to-morrow looked bright to-day as the result of the showing made by three members of the Purple and White team in practice yesterday.

At first it was thought Lauren Upson would not be able to compete in the meet because of being out of school for a time, but he spent extra time on his studies and will be able to compete to-morrow. Upson took fourth place in the pole-vault last year at the State meet and he has greatly improved this season. It looks like five points in this event for Sacramento because no other Northern Section man has equaled Upson's mark this year.

Watson and Lockhart In.

The other two men Coach Clarence Parker thought would be unable to place in the meet were Earl Lockhart, star miler, and Archie Watson, who takes part in the high-jump. These two first string men were not counted to take places because both of them have just recovered from the influenza, but a surprise was sprung yesterday in practice. Lockhart made fast time in the mile and Watson did good in the jump. They are looked to sure point-winners.

Sutter City Strong.

The fight to-morrow looks to be between the local and Sutter City teams because as the teams form these two schools have most all of the best records for the year. Sacramento has the edge because of its victory over the Sutter City team by the margin of one point early in the season, but the Purple and White team will have to do better to-morrow if it expects

to come out on top, as Sutter City has greatly improved. This was shown by their performance last week in a section meet.

In Trimble and Fleming, Sutter City possesses a pair that will be hard to beat. Trimble has been making fast time in the hurdles, and has been making record distances in the broad-jump in all of the meets that he has taken part in this year. Fleming is looked upon as a first place man. He has been having things all his own way so far this year and he has also made some good time in both the 100 and 220 dashes.

Although Sacramento has no man in the hurdles to compare with Trimble, it has Charles Willie, who is able to furnish him competition in the broad-jump. While Willie has not yet equaled Trimble's mark he has come within inches of it, and he is making a better jump every time he competes.

Adams vs. Fleming.

Fleming will have to make record time in the sprints if he expects to beat Wilbur Adams, the Purple and White Dash star. Adams and Fleming have been both making about the same time in the dashes. Adams is figured by most of the local dopsters to come out in front of the Sutter City star. He has tied Fleming's record in the 100-yard dash, and has beaten his time in the 220-yard dash by of a second.

Sacramento has no entry in the hurdles or the 880 events but she expects to get enough points in the other events to bring home the bacon. The Purple and White is strong in all the rest of the events.

Tattl in Weights.

Joe Tattl is expected to make points in the shot and discus events because he has been heaving both of these for distances that have come close to all the marks made so far this season.

Kenneth Pollack, who is a find of the year, is expected to place in the 440-yard run. Pollack has bettered in practice meets the best time any Northern man has so far made and it would not be a surprise if he came home a winner in this event.

Frank Whippen, Willard Warner, Charles Will, Revere Cole, Tilden McKee are athletes Parker will take to the meet. Whippen make good high in the pole-vault; Warner runs Lockhart a close race in the mile and also throws the discus; Will and Cole press Adams in both the sprints, and McKee has a record of twenty-two feet in the broadjump.

If the meet depends upon the relay the winner in all probability will be the Sacramento High School because no school in this section of the State has been able to come close to the time of the Sacramento relay team which is composed of Adams, Wilson and Willie.

The meet is expected to be the closest in history of high school track and field in this section of the State and in all probability a large number of records will be shattered.
