

VICTORY IN RELAY GIVES MOVIE LADS GREAT MEET

Klein's Victories in Sprints and Hansen's Defeats in Mile and 880 Tell Tale

Spurred on by the sensational work of Vic Klein in the sprints, Coach Bill Paige's nifty Hollywood High School track and field team captured the Southern California prep championship for the second consecutive year at the Coliseum yesterday afternoon, close to 15,000 highly emotional spectators witnessing the triumph over a field of some 300 entries. It was a great victory for the Foothillers and all of the glory was attained only by winning the final event, the relay.

Manual Arts, picked by most of the dopesters as the most likely winner of the meet, principally because of having handed Hollywood a trimming in the recent city meet, suffered reversals in all but three of their pet events and finished five points behind the winners. In spite of losing out in the races they had counted most on, the Tollers made a game showing and went down to defeat fighting to the last.

The meet had the large crowd of spectators wild-eyed throughout and when it came down to the relay with Hollywood just 1 3-4 points ahead of Manual, the fans were clawing each other in their excitement. Ensley got off to a fair start and held his own with the Lincoln runner, Manual being in third place. Traugher proceeded to step out like a runaway greyhound and gave Smith a three-yard lead on the next to last 220 yards. Klein took the baton from his mate fully five yards to the good and Manual was never in it, Lincoln finishing a fair second, with Huntington Beach right behind.

One world's interscholastic record was tied, one new State mark was established, four brand new records were hung up for Southern California and another was tied.

There were three outstanding upsets in the meet.

(1) The victory of Klein over Woodyard in both the 100-yard and 220-yard dash.

(2) The defeat of Hansen of Manual in both the mile and half mile.

(3) The failure of Lee Barnes of Hollywood to win the pole vault.

It was Klein's great running in the sprints that gave the Foothillers the edge over their rivals. The easy-going Hollywood ace trimmed Archie Woodyard in the century in 10 seconds and then stepped out and annexed the 220-yard event in the sensational time of 21.7 seconds, thus setting a new Southern California mark.

Hansen's defeats hurt the Tollers' chances the most of any upsets during the afternoon's festivities. Klein's victories did not rob Manual of points, but added to the Foothiller total. A wild young man by the name of Ed Gloege of Covina stepped out in front in the half mile and led the field to the tape in the startling time of 1m. 59.1s., thus establishing a new Southern California mark. Chesley Unruh of El Monte was a very good second with Hansen trailing for a third.

The mile added further woe to Sid Foster. Carnahan, a diminutive, broad-chested athlete from Riverside, took a hitch in his pants after the first lap, forged

to the front and held the lead for a brilliant victory in 4m., 34.3s., another Southern California mark going by the boards. Carlstrum of San Diego came in for second place with Hanson again placing third.

Lee Barnes got left out of first honors in the pole vault, principally because he persisted in going up too close to the bar. Smith of San Diego ran about true to form and won at 12ft. 4in.

Ross Nichols equalled the world's interscholastic record in the high hurdles by clicking off the race in 15.4 seconds. This time was a new Southern California mark. De Wolf Requa suffered the misfortune of kicking over the last barrier in his low hurdle race and his time of 24.7 seconds will not go down as a new record.

Charley Keppen's usually pleasant tenor voice was in even better shape than ever yesterday and his announcements were the best of the season. The high school kids persisted in bursting into uncontrolled vocal demonstrations throughout the afternoon and poor Charley was as limp as a deflated inner tube when the meet was over.
