

# Board Meets to Talk Of Trip to Nationals; 6 Athletes Would Go

Manual Arts high school's athletic board was scheduled to meet with Coach Sid Foster today and decide upon whether or not to send a team of Artisan track and field athletes, who are champions of the state, to the national interscholastics at Chicago late this month.

The matter probably rests with Coach Foster and as he favors going east if it is possible for him to take an entire team, Los Angeles will very likely again be represented in the Chicago championships.

It would be necessary to raise at least \$1000 and the possibility of so doing among the students of the school was the principal topic of today's discussion.

It is unlikely that Coach Bill Paige's Hollywood high school champions of Southern California will make another try or that Coach Ray Walker will go east at the head of a troupe of Huntington Beach athletes this month.

Coach Foster's athletes won the state meet in Taft Saturday by a fairly comfortable margin. The Artisans collected 26 points to 12 for Hollywood and 17 for Huntington Beach, a very creditable showing on the latter's part. Bakersfield finished fourth with nine and the Southland on the whole walked off with all the plums of the meet.

The men Manual would send would be the same who competed so successfully at Taft. Junior Hansen would run the sprints and quarter; Lee Hansen, the distances; Watson in the discus; Requa, the hurdler, and the record-holding relay team composed of Williams, Borgfeld, Hanford and Requa.

Hanford placed third in the century and was nosed out in the quarter by a couple of feet by Talbot, a northern star. Little Gaudet of Lincoln was third.

Hansen won the mile, defeating Carnahan, the very fast miler of Riverside. Watson placed second in the discus to Patton of Riverside and Requa won the low hurdles in fast time.

There were many features Saturday. Lee Barnes of Hollywood scraped the sky to win the pole vault at 12 feet 11 3/4 inches. This pleasing athlete is cinched for the Olympic team.

Henry Coggeshall, Poly's state champion high jumper, went over 6 feet 1 inch to win.

Ross Nichols, curly headed youth from the beach town, one of Walker's proteges, created a new national interscholastic record in the high hurdles. He was clocked in 15 3-10 seconds.

## TRAINER BRYAN STILL BELIEVES IN JIM BARBER

BERKELEY, May 12.—"Cap" Bryan, athletic trainer at California, still holds the opinion that Jim Barber is one of the fastest sprinters in the west.

He scoffs at the explanation that the Bear short-distance runner was in a slump against Stanford, saying that it was his lack of confidence that beat him.

"There is no reason in the world why Barber shouldn't be classed with the best of them," claims Bryan. "He has everything necessary for a crack sprinter, and has shown his true speed in practice and in unimportant meets.

"But he hasn't the heart of a competitive athlete and simply worries himself sick before a big race.

"I think, with added confidence, he should overcome this fear, however, and then we will see a real foot-racer."
