

Piedmont Captures Track Title

Harry Bell Scores Double Victory

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, May 4.—(AP)—Led by Capt. Harry Bell, who raced to a double victory in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, Piedmont High School today captured the track and field championship of the North Coast section of the California Inter-scholastic Federation.

The winners scored 22 points, finishing only a single marker ahead of Alameda High. San Jose High School, with 18 1-3 points, took third place and Berkeley High, fourth, with 17.

In addition to Captain Bell's sprints triumph, Piedmont captured two other first places. Larry Stevens loped to an easy victory in the half mile and Jim Brophy won the low hurdles.

Two meet records went by the boards during the afternoon.

Wren of San Jose set a new broad jump mark of 21 feet 8 inches and McCann of Santa Rosa tossed the discus 134 feet 1 3/4 inches for another new record.

Berkeley High Trackmen Win C. I. F. Battle

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Apr. 30.—Four records were broken here this afternoon as Berkeley High School won the thirteenth annual North Coast Section track and field meet with 18 points.

King City and Palo Alto scored 14 points each to tie for second.

Other scores were as follows: Hollister 12 1-5, Centerville 11 1-5, Martinez 9, Petaluma 8 1-5, San Jose 8, San Mateo 7, Menlo 7, Santa Cruz 6 1-5, Piedmont 6, Eureka 5, Brentwood 5, Healdsburg 3 1-5, Redwood City 3, Santa Rosa 3, Alameda 3, San Rafael 3, Tamalpais 3, Sebastopol 3, Hayward 2.

New marks were made in the mile, javelin, 880 and high jump.

White of Petaluma clipped 3.0 seconds off the old record in the mile when he won by 30 yards in 4 minutes 39 seconds. The former mark, 4:42.6, was made by Ford of Tamalpais last year.

Scott of Eureka cleared the bar at 6 feet 1 inch in the high jump to break the former mark of 5 feet 11¼ inches made by Filmer of San Francisco Poly last year.

Dwarte of Centerville broke his record by throwing the javelin 167 feet. The old mark, 165 feet 2¼ inches, was made last year.

DOUBLE WINNER.

Churchill of Hollister and Akers of Petaluma, who placed second and third, also beat the former record. Moran of Piedmont broke the tape inches ahead of Jensen of Martinez, in the half mile, to set a new record of 2 minutes 17-10 seconds. The old mark was 2:02.6, made by Becker of Berkeley last year.

Hables of King City was the only double winner of the day, when he broke the tape in the 100 and 220. He won by three yards in 10 1-5 seconds in the century, after getting away to a poor start. Hables won the furlong by twenty yards in 22.6 seconds.

Nash of Menlo school scored a decisive victory in the quarter-mile, which he won by eight yards in 52.8 seconds.

Neikirk of Palo Alto made a game bid in the last fifty yards and cut down the distance but

could not overhaul Nash. It was the splendid work of the Berkeley broad jumping pair—Carlson and Mansell—which was largely responsible for the transbay team's victory. These boys placed first and second to turn in eight points with marks of 20 feet 7½ inches and 20 feet 4½ inches.

BERKELEY HIGH EASILY WINS NORTH STATE TRACK MEET

Yellow Jackets Get Revenge for One Point Defeat of Last Year When Palo Alto Nosed Them Out— Three Records Broken.

STANFORD STADIUM, April 30.—The Berkeley High school Yellow Jackets revenged themselves today for a one-point defeat last year by walking away from all opposition in the North Coast section track and field meet, winning with a score of 18 points from a field of 33 Northern California high schools.

While Berkeley grabbed the important honors of the day, a "pint-sized" gentleman from King City—Lawrence Hables—gathered the individual honors for the afternoon in one of the most spectacular exhibitions seen here since the days of

Ernie Sudden of Lick-Wilnerding.

Hables got a bad start in the century but pulled up on the field and was going away when the ribbon broke. He was clocked at 10:2-5. In the 220 he showed the flashiest pair of spikes the boys witnessed all afternoon and left the crowd 15 yards in the rear and as he set the pace to win in 22:2-10.

On the strength of Hables' showing King City was a strong contender until the final event, but they could not muster team to run the relay and Berkeley won without a struggle.

The Yellow Jackets piled up points in a number of events, scoring eight in the broad jump and taking places in four other events. Palo Alto, last year's champion, who beat Berkeley by a single point, took advantage of a number of upsets to make a showing and captured third place in the meet.

Three N. C. S. records were lowered, the most startling being a high jump record of 6 feet 1 1/4 inches by Scott of Eureka. Scott won the event at 5 feet 11 7-8 inches, which was a new record, but he kept jumping and finally quit through sheer exhaustion after the bar had been raised to 6 feet 1 1/4 inches.

Moran of Piedmont set a new mark in the half mile, running it in 2 minutes 17-18 seconds. The former mark was held by Becker of Berkeley at 2:6-10. Dwarze of Centerville smashed his own record
