AT. VIEW TRACK **EAM NOSED OUT 3Y GILROY SQUAD** N ANNUAL MEET

Gilroy high school's track and ield team nosed out the Mt. View igh school squad by one-third of a wint to win the annual Santa Clara Valley League championship yester-

lay afternoon at he Fremont high ichool in a meet hat was filled with thrills and not decided until the relay was run.

Before' the 880 relay was run Mt. led View with 351-6 points: Gilroy was second with 31%, and Los Gatos third 🕷 The St with 29 1-2. Gilroy team of Bonito, Hollen-LOUIS DUINO beck. Gerholdt. and Walsh, easily copped the relay to give them five more points. Mt. View was barely nosed out of third place by Fremont and took but one point and lost the meet by the narrowest of margins. Los Gatos placed second and took three points.





DOUBLE WINNERS.

Kohle and Easterbrook of Los Gatos and Cox of Gilroy were double winners. Kohle copped first in the 880 and mile runs; Easterbrook won high point honors for the day by taking first in the 220 low hurdles and high jump, and third in the broad jump. Cox took both first places in the shot put and discus events.

All of the running events were close and filled with thrills. In the 880 and mile events Kohle was pressed hard to win. Each time he nosed his opponents out at the tape. In the half-mile Nichols, Kohle's team-mate, gave him a tough battle and in the mile Howard of Santa Clara was right on Kohle's heels.

The meet was well handled and run off with little delay. Coach A. S. Cakebread of San Jose State was official starter, and Coach Geddes of Fremont was referee.
