

# HOLLYWOOD IN SECOND PLACE

*Wilson and Warburton Are Heroes for Victors*

*Three C.I.F. Marks Beaten and Two Equaled*

*Prep Athletes in Sparkling Finale at Coliseum*

Two pee-wee runners—Jimmy Wilson and Irving Warburton—who between them captured the 100, 220 and 440-yard dashes, were the prominent figures in San Diego High School's march to the State interscholastic track-and-field championship at the Coliseum yesterday afternoon.

The team from San Diego rolled up a total of 22 3-4 points, which was more than enough to win. Hollywood was closest with 16 1-2, Santa Ana, with 11; Jefferson, 10 1-2, and Los Angeles, with 9, trailed in the next three positions.

Of San Diego's winning markers, Wilson accounted for ten with wins in the 100 and 220, Warburton five in the quarter-mile, Miller five in the pole, Reed 3-4 by a tie for fourth in the high jump, and the relay team two with a third place.

### SPARKLING MEET

It was a sparkling meet in which twenty-one southern schools were represented and nineteen northern ones—a meet which saw the breaking of three C.I.F. records and the equaling of two others.

Those events which produced new records were the property of two boys from the north—Marty of Fresno, who leaped 6ft. 4 1-4in. to beat Darby Jones of L. A.; Poly Welch of Visalia, who clipped three-fifths of a second from the 880-yard mark, and Yancey of Compton, who broke the javelin mark.

Welch ran the half-mile in 1m. 58 4-10s. The old mark—1m. 58s.—was made by Lockhart of Sacramento in 1923. The old high jump record of 6ft. 2 3-16 in. was the combined property of Lassaletie of Fuente and Van Osdel of Compton, who made it in the State meet last year.

### YANCEY STARS

Yancey of Compton is the new record-holder with the spear. He tossed the toothpick 182ft. 35-100in. to beat the old record-holder, McKenzie of Oxnard, who last year registered a toss of 174ft. 4 7-8in.

Wilson in winning the 100 in 9 4-5s. and the 220 in 21 2-5s. equalled the record in the longer sprint which was hung up last year by Frank Wykoff of Glendale and Frank Lombardi of Los Angeles High School.

But it was Warburton's victory in the quarter-mile and the equaling of George Schiller's old record of 49 3-5s. which was the biggest surprise of the day.

Warburton placed fourth in

the southern meet two weeks ago, but yesterday he got out in front early, piled up a lead of five yards and held it with a fighting finish right up to the tape.

**WELL EARNED**

His victory was as well earned as that of his team—a victory that of his team—a victory which sees the two big championships of the year, the Southern California and the State, go south for the first time in years.

And in the State San Diego's winning total was almost identically the same as in the southern, the difference being the merest fraction of a point.

Warburton's first in the 440 made a difference, but it was offset by Dover, who, winner of the mile in the southern, went unplaced yesterday and failed to finish.

Dover, mere kid in years, set a terrific pace of 51 1/2 on the first lap and killed himself off. The whole field passed him up on the last lap, Baker of Huntington Park winning in a close finish with Roberts of El Monte, who was second to Dover in the southern. The time was 4m. 11 1/2-1/2, not far away from the record of 4m. 30s.

Weich of Visalia staged a terrific sprint in the stretch of the 300 and won by five yards. Webster of Webb School was caught in the rack and didn't get out soon enough to stick with the winner, although he was coming up rapidly and had plenty of reserve. Fears, Space and Obergfall were pretty much together. Weich won the event last year at Selma, and was third the year previous.

Wilson won both the short sprints handily—a two-yard margin. He jumped the gun by a yard in the 100, but it didn't make any difference because he had more than that margin at the tape.

**CONGER FAILS**

Ray Conger missed in his assault on the 100-yard mark by four seconds, the Illinois Athletic Club star finishing the exhibition event in 3m. 15 1/2-1/2.

Gilroy high school's track and field team nosed out the Mt. View high school squad by one-third of a point to win the annual Santa Clara Valley League championship yesterday afternoon at the Fremont high school in a meet that was filled with thrills and not decided until the relay was run.

Before the 880 relay was run Mt. View led with 35 1-6 points; Gilroy was second with 31½, and Los Gatos third with 29 1-2. The Gilroy team of Bonito, Hollenbeck, Gerholdt, and Walsh, easily copped the relay to give them five more points. Mt. View was barely nosed out of third place by Fremont and took but one point and lost the meet by the narrowest of margins. Los Gatos placed second and took three points.

Kohle copped first in the 880 and mile runs; Easterbrook won high point honors for the day by taking first in the 220 low hurdles and high jump, and third in the broad jump. Cox took both first places in the shot put and discus events.

All of the running events were close and filled with thrills. In the 880 and mile events Kohle was pressed hard to win. Each time he nosed his opponents out at the tape. In the half-mile Nichols, Kohle's team-mate, gave him a tough battle and in the mile Howard of Santa Clara was right on Kohle's heels.

The meet was well handled and run off with little delay. Coach A. S. Cakebread of San Jose State was official starter, and Coach Geddes of Fremont was referee.
