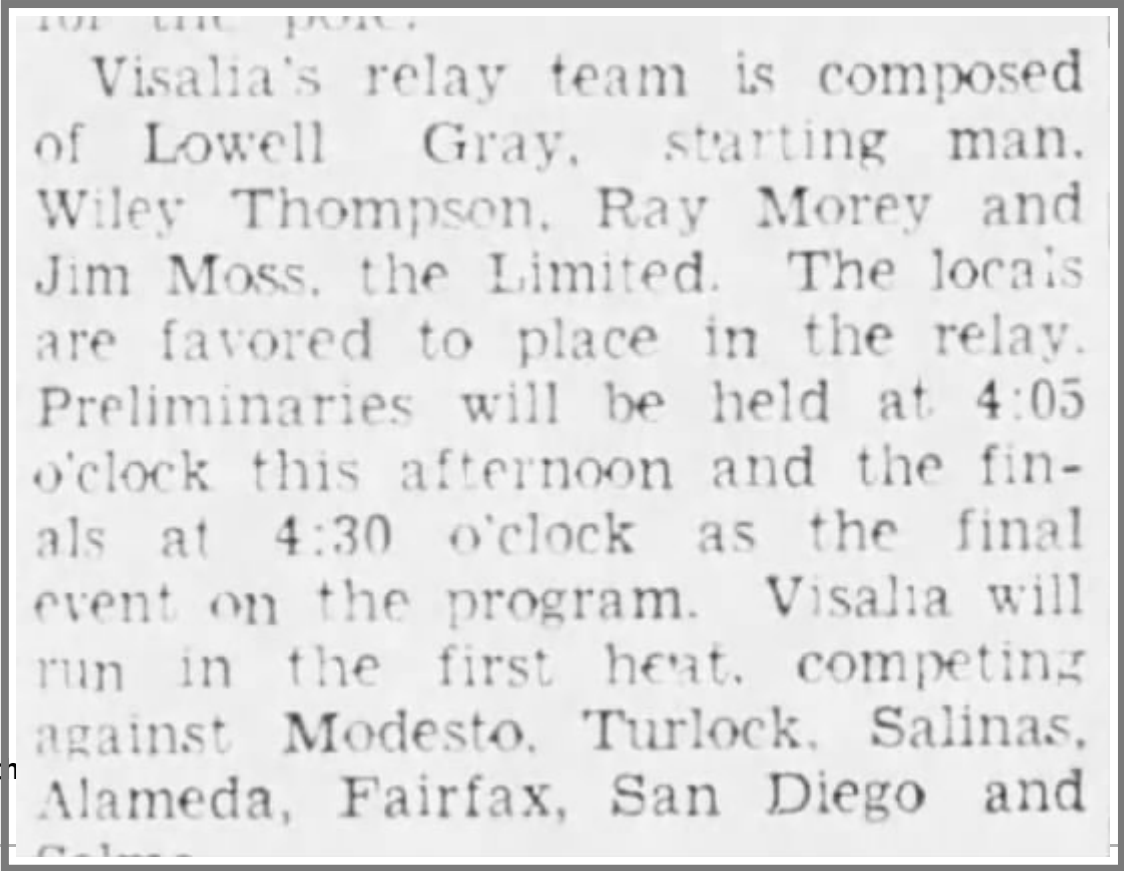

VISALIA, May 23.—Rolling up 19½ points, Coach Eddie Leahy's Poly Mechanics added the State

interscholastic track and field championship to their long list of achievements here today.

The Mechanics have not been defeated this season, having also won the Los Angeles City League title, as well as the Southern California meet cup.

The Sacramento Dragons, who tied for first place last year, were a fairly strong second, with 13 points, while Huntington Park tallied 11 digits for third place honors. Manual Arts and Fairfax tied for fourth with 9, sing out L. A. High, which had 8, and Pasadena and Compton, who scored 8 apiece.

Three new State records were broken and one was equalled as the crowd of 4000 fans looked on and cheered.

## SATTERFIELD STARS

The first mark to go by the board was the half-mile record of 1m. 58.4s., held by Welch of Visalia. Carl Satterfield, diminutive Manual Arts middle-distance star, won as he pleased in 1m. 57.6s.

The quarter-mile, which saw John McCarthy of Fairfax win in the record-breaking time of 48.7, was a thriller. McCarthy led all the way with Jimmy Luvalle of Poly passing Johnson of San Luis Obispo on the back stretch to finish within a foot of the flying Colonial star.

The old mark was held pointly by George Schiller of Poly and Irvin Warburton of San Diego at 49.6.

The other new record was in the javelin, Rowland of Hanford hurling the spear 179ft. 4in. Ken McKenzie, former Oxnard ace, and now competing under the colors of Southern California, was the holder of the old record of 174ft. 7-8in.

## LEAHY TRIES FAST ONE

After he had run a pair of 100-yard races and two furlongs, Walter Hopson was pulled out of the Poly relay team and Ben Siegel substituted. Poly won their heat in 1:37.7, with Siegel galloping the first lap. In the finals, which were run a half-hour later, Coach Leahy attempted to insert Hopson for Siegel. But other coaches objected and Siegel ran.

The Mechanics were very unlucky in the draw for lanes, picking number eight. Huntington Park, who started in lane seven, won the event with the

Mechanics second. The time of 1:29:6 equalled the State record held by L. A. High.

Poly scored according to dope all the way through the meet, with the exception of Siegel in the low hurdles, who failed to place. His holes caved in when he started and he almost fell going over the first barrier.

## HOW POLY SCORED

Hopson took third in the 100 and second in the furlong, with LuValle collecting second in the quarter. Matt Stankovich tied for first place in the pole vault with Joe Ramsey of Inglewood for 4½ more digits.

George Theodoratus, Sacramento's huge 240-pound weight tosser, took individual scoring honors with 9 points. He won the discus at 132ft. 1½in., and placed second in the shot with a put of 52ft. 7½in. All five men in the shot did better than 51ft. Theodoratus also won the sixteen-pound exhibition shot put for the Howard Drew trophy. He heaved the big ball 45ft. 5in. Points didn't count in this event.

Sacramento's other digits were taken by Swanston, who placed fourth in the quarter; Leman, who nosed in for a fifth in the mile, and the relay team, which also pulled in for a fifth.

## DRAPER SURPRISES

The 100-yard dash saw little Foy Draper of Huntington Park surprise with a victory over the favorite, Al Fitch of Pasadena. Draper was across the track from Fitch, who was watching Hopson too closely and didn't notice the pee-wee little dash man.

Ashley Burch of Jordan defended his State furlong title in great shape, winning by a foot from Hopson in 21.5s. Fitch was third in this race.

Don Carter, Franklin's sturdy weightman, repeated his 1930 State meet victory in the twelve-pound shot by heaving the iron pellet out 52ft. 10in.

Another defending champion who came through in fine shape was Phil Morentin of Visalia, who won the mile in 4m. 32.8s. He led all the way with Hotchkiss of Washington coming up to threaten him during the last fifty yards.

Helgold of Huntington Park cleared 6ft. 11in. in the high jump for only fifth place. The winner was "Jumping" Jacques of Santa Rna, who went over the bar at 6ft. 4 1-8in.

Johnson of L. A. High cleared 6ft. 4in., for second, with Fox of Belmont next at 6ft. 3in. Ball of Berkeley went over 6ft. 2in., for the fourth-place medal.

Fischer of Redlands scored a victory in the high hurdles, while Plat Smart, colored runner from Compton, walked off with the lows in 24.2s. Fischer's time was 15.5s.

## SOUTH SCORES HEAVILY

Southern California did very well in the meet, scoring 140 1-2 points while the north coast section tallied 31. The central division chalked up 23 1-2 with the north bay section trailing with 9.

In the first eleven schools, nine were from the Southland, only Sacramento, which was second, and Visalia, which tied for tenth, being near the top for the other end of the State. Summary:

# SIX NEW RECORDS HUNG UP AS NEW CHAMPS WIN BY ONE-SIDED SCORE

Cracking six records and winning 11 of the 13 events, the Mountain View Eagles yesterday won the Santa Clara Valley league unlimited track championship with a total of 83 1-7 points. The meet was held on the winners' home grounds.

Los Gatos high school, with 35 2-7 points, was second. Others finished in the following order: Santa Clara, 14 1-7; Campbell, 4 3-7, and Live Oak, 4.

## NEW MARKS.

The Mountain View lads set new marks in the shot put, discus, pole vault, high jump, broad jump and relay. Tom Marshall opened the afternoon's record breaking performances when he tossed the 12-pound shot 46 feet 10 1/4 inches. The former mark was 45 feet 8 inches.

Vic Boore, lightweight star, is credited with two of the records. He pole vaulted 10 feet 7 1/2 inches for a new mark, and later high jumped 5 feet 7 1/4 inches for another record. The old vault mark was 10 feet 4 1/2 inches, and the high jump record 5 feet 6 3/4 inches.

## DISCUS RECORD.

Raymond bettered the mark in the discus when he heaved the Greek platter 116 feet 2 inches to crack the old record of 115 feet 8 inches. The other new record is attributed to Jim Sohler, all around athlete. Sohler broad jumped 20 feet 3 inches for the new mark. He bettered the old mark by 1 foot 2 inches.

Sohler, Ray Fellows, Knight and McMahon composed the squad which contributed the 880 relay mark. The old mark was 1:40.6, and yesterday the quartet ran it in 1:36.8.

Mountain View was a heavy favorite from the outset, and the boys did not disappoint. Harris of Los Gatos won the mile and 880, the only events the Eagles failed to win. In both races he won by close margins.
