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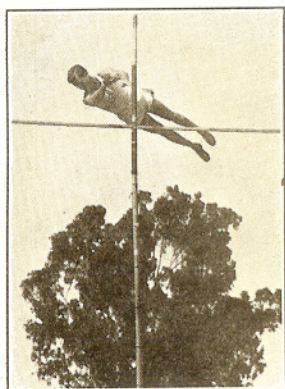


BENJAMIN EASTMAN

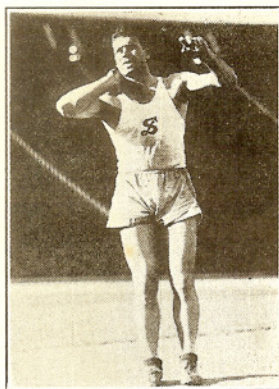
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"BLAZING BEN" is 6 feet 2 inches tall, decidedly blonde and possesses a pair of blue eyes. This is his fourth and final year at Stanford where he is the Cards' track and field captain. In 1932, Ben attempted an assault on the 800 meter and 880 yard world records in this stadium. Though bucking a strong wind he came through to smash both records into oblivion. Today Eastman runs 600 yards, which incidentally is mid-way between the quarter and half-mile races, and it will probably be the first time that that distance has been run on the coast.

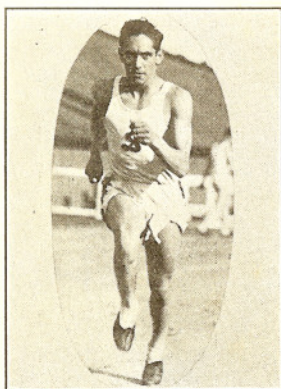

BILL MILLER, product of San Diego and Dink Templeton's coaching, rose to great competitive heights in 1932 when, vaulting against the world's record holder and the world's best, he won the Olympic Games championship with a vault of 14 feet, 1 inch. This year Miller has already vaulted 14 feet in three different meets. For more than two weeks he has not been in competition, and today may be his day for a new world's record.

HENRI LABORDE, Lowell A. A. A. discus champion, Stanford I. C. A. A. A. point winner in both shot and discus.

LES HABLES, King City boy, a great sprinter and 440 yard man. He has times of better than 9.7 seconds for 100 yards and 48 1-10 seconds for 440 yards to his credit.

ALDEN HERBERT, "Dink's" new low hurdle find, who may be national champion before the year is out.

BUD DEACON, San Diego boy, fourteen foot pole vaulter, who may replace Miller as U. S. A. Olympic champion in 1936.

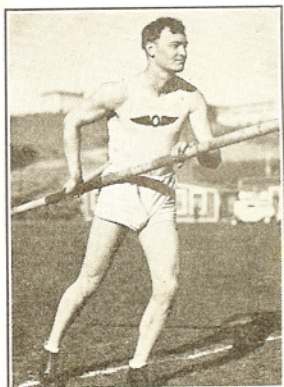

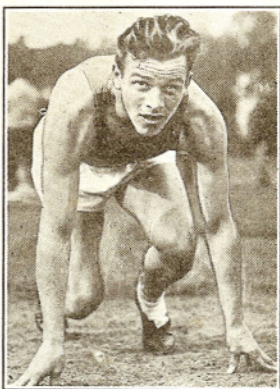

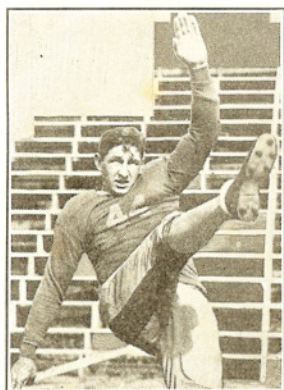

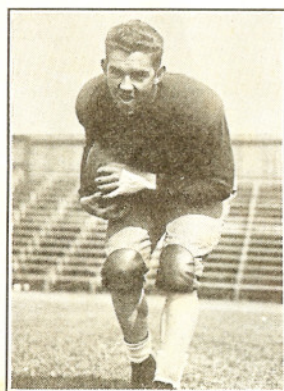

SPUD LEWIS is 27 years old, has brown eyes and brown hair, is 5 foot 8 inches tall and weighs 190 pounds. Spud graduated from the Lincoln High School in Portland, Oregon, and while there played baseball, basketball and football. The football team on which he was won the Pacific North West Championship. Spud then entered Stanford, played basketball when a freshman and sophomore, but majored in football. He graduated from Stanford in 1929.

In the game today he will use only a center, two ends and four backs, with general rules. Spud has had his team practicing under this system and he thinks that it will work out O. K.
