

SOUTHERNERS HEAD FIELD WITH FOURTEEN POINTS

Hoover High Places Second With 13 3-4 Points; Raitt Paces Winners

The muscular arms and legs of Raitt of Fullerton High School paced the southern team to a fourteen-point victory in the annual state track and field championships at the Fresno State College Stadium last night.

Hoover High School of Pasadena was second with 13 3/4 points.

A double victory for Raitt in the shot and football throw with a new state record of 220 feet in the football toss, plus a second place in the 40-yard dash by Miller brought victory to the Fullerton team, a darkhorse in pre-meet dope. Muir Tech of Pasadena, the favorite, placed fourth with 11 points.

Mild summer skies afforded perfect weather for cinder and field performances, there being three present state marks tied besides the one broken by Raitt. The 220-yard dash mark tied by Price of Excelsior in 21.2 was the only mark not to win approval. Bob Frick of San Ramon tied the century mark, running a beautiful 100 in 0.8. The 800 mark of 1:57.8 by Wood of Carpenteria was approved by the officials.

Price's 220 was disallowed after some consultation because of a slight wind at his back.

In a thrilling finish in the half-mile race Wood of Carpenteria High School, a favorite to win, outdid himself to tie the state record of 1:57.8, now held by Satterfield of Manual Arts and in effect since 1931. In the last lap the lead changed several times. Ray Young of Santa Cruz took the lead as they passed the west track stands. Hawkins of Visalia put in his bid as the large field rounded the south side. However, the pack closed in and Wood sprinted ahead as they neared the tape. Sinclair of Perris High School was a surprise second and Young had to be satisfied with third. Marques of Visalia put forth his efforts too early and trailed in fourth.

Frick's Run Thrills

Speeding down the outside lane next to the stands Frick of San Ramon High School tied the state interscholastic 100-yard dash record held by Frank Lombardi of Los Angeles in 0.8 seconds. Trailing Nelson of Pasadena as he went into the last twenty-five yards and running in easy style the meet favorite gathered his strength to edge out Nelson in a close finish that had the stands on their toes. Gregory of Jordan, who won his heat in 0.8, was third.

Davis of Inglewood won in the 220-yard low hurdles in the time of 24.2. Vickery of Chaffey was second.

Lindell of Monrovia headed the field in the 120-yard high hurdles winning by a wide margin over Hawkins of Santa Ana in 18 seconds flat. The time, while not fast, was exceedingly better than expected.

Third Mark Tied

Leaving the two favorites Frick of San Ramon and Friend of Tulare trailing far behind on outside, Price of Excelsior, raced to the tape in 21.2 seconds in the 220-yard dash to be the third man to tie a state record in the meet. His time of 21.2 equaled that of George Anderson, present University of California sprint star, who first set the mark when competing for Muir Tech at the state meet in 1933. Hellman of El Monte was on his heels for second. Friend placed 4th, but Frick bogged down early in the race to be completely left out of the running.

With a wildly cheering group of spectators urging him on to a new 40-yard state record, Howard Upton of Turlock High School, failed by five-hundredths of a second to set a new mark in the quarter. He finished well ahead of the field in 45.9. Upton took the lead from the

first starting on the second leg from the inside. He opened up as he rounded the southeast turn, but tired as he neared the tape.

Raltt of Fullerton put his team into the meet lead with a double victory in the football throw and the shot. He threw the football 220 feet to break the existing record of 203 feet 7 inches held by Gudmudsen of Inglewood. His mark in the shot was 55 feet 5 1/4 inches which did not come up to the record of 55 feet 10 inches as had been expected. The mark, however, was very fine for high school competition. In the football throw Friedman of Santa Monica and Manuel of Vacaville, both broke the records in their throws.

Bayer of Paso Robles staged a mighty sprint to take the lead from Schuyler of Carpinteria in the mile in the fast time of 4:30.4. Schuyler ran a fine race but could not keep up the pace as he approached the tape.

Montgomery of Ede Monte out-classed a snappy field in the broad jump with a mark of 23 feet 3/4 inch, less than a foot separating the winner from the fifth place man, who had a mark of 22 feet 4 1/2 inches.
