

# Wilson Cops Track Title

### Long Beach Team Takes Southland Crown With 29 5-6 Points

LONG BEACH, May 15. (Exclusive) — Woodrow Wilson High School's all-around strength carried it to the 1937 Southern California C.I.F. track and field championship here this afternoon, when it outclassed all competition in the annual get-together of Southland high school squads.

John Gartner's Bruins amassed 29 5-6 points to steal the show from Alhambra and Muir Tech, who finished in a tie for second spot with 16 tallies apiece. The Wilson boys will be out to upset Jefferson's powerful outfit in the State championships next Saturday.

**MILE DUEL**

The varsity runners left it up to the Class B competitors to do all of the record breaking for the afternoon. Only three marks passed in oblivion, the lightweight hurdles, 220, and shot put being marked off the boards.

A crackerjack mile duel between Doug Meadowcroft of Santa Monica and Tom Cowger of Ventura climaxed the day's battles. The small beach runner managed to nose out his northern opponent in a thrilling stretch fight.

George Sangster of Muir Tech came through as expected in the low hurdles, but tripped and failed to place in the high barriers. Burdette Gandy, Wilson's crack sprinter, captured the 220. Bill Huntale of Oceanside was a surprise winner in the century, beating out Gandy by a foot.

**BUGBEE VICTOR**

Bill Bugbee of Montebello, who sat a new Southern California broad jump mark of 24ft. 3/4 in. in a tryout meet last week, soared 23ft. 7 1/2 in. to annex first place in that event today.

Hoover High of Glendale tallied 16 1/2 digits to nose out Long Beach in the lightweight competition, while Compton and Long Beach tied with 16 3/4 points for the Class C crown.

Johnny Fawcett of Coronado was another unsung varsity man to upset the day's total, when he nabbed the quarter mile in 51.2s. Inglewood's Pergande, odds-on favorite, pulled up in the home stretch after pulling a leg muscle. Pergande's running mate, Fran Bruno, managed to take the 880 after a hot stretch battle with John French of Wilson.

**DAVIES STARS**

Tommy Davies of Long Beach again stole the show in the Class C competition. The midget sprinter turned in an easy 10.4s. victory in the 100, and anchored the relay squad to victory in 45.4s.
