

VALLEJO NEGRO CLEARS 6:6 1-4, TOO LATE

FOURTH TRY

Berkeley Winner in Sectional Meet

EDWARDS FIELD, BERKELEY, May 14.—Vernon Higbee of Vallejo unofficially cracked the world's interscholastic high jump record and three meet marks were broken here yesterday as Berkeley High School won the 24th annual North Coast section track meet of California Interscholastic Federation.

Higbee officially won his speciality at 6 feet, 3 inches, but had the standards set at 6 feet 6¼ inches in order that he could make an attempt at the world's record held by Willis Ward and set in 1931 at a Detroit prep. On his three tries, Higbee failed, but on a fourth attempt, after the competition was over, Higbee succeeded.

Higbee showed promise of breaking the mark as he barely missed 6 feet 7½ inches in the North Bay League meet.

Three other marks were broken.

RECORD MILE.

Art Schneider, star Alameda runner, covered the mile in four minutes 33.4 seconds to break the old mark held by Scott of Tamalpais by two tenths of a second.

Mike Frankos, Vallejo football thrower, erased the record of 202 feet 8 inches held by Vic Bottari, ex-Vallejo boy and a member of the California Rose Bowl championship football team, by throwing 209 feet 2 inches.
