

Clan Surprise Runner-Up

Reiss of Burlingame
Is Individual Star;
Sets Two New Marks

ANTIOCH, May 18.—Alameda County League track teams grabbed the lion's share of the points here today in the North Coast Section, C.I.F., meet, which Berkeley High won, amidst the sound of breaking records.

Berkeley, which has won the meet nine times in the past 16 years, scored only 14 points—but that was easily enough to win for them. Piedmont finished a surprise second with 11½ points, while Pacific Grove was third with 10½; San Jose and Burlingame tied for fourth, each with 10 points.

As for the other County Loop schools, Richmond tallied 7 points for eighth place, Alameda made 4 points for fourteenth place, Hayward made 2 points for twenty-first place, and Albany scored a point for twenty-second place.

FOUR RECORDS BROKEN

No less than four records went by the boards during the running of the unlimited division.

These new record holders, along with the first four men in each event, qualified for the State C.I.F. meet and will travel to Visalia for the big event, which takes place Saturday evening under the arches.

Irving Moore of Piedmont shattered the existing mark in the pole vault when he cleared 12 feet 11½ inches. The old record was made last year by Walters of Pacific Grove at 12 feet 9¾ inches.

Moore cleared the record vault on the second attempt, then went ahead and shot at 13 feet 2½ inches, but fell just a little short at this height.

Perhaps the outstanding single competitor here today was Ed Reiss of Burlingame, the one-man team.

Reiss set two new N.C.S. records, and scored all of his school's points. He first scampered over the 120-yard high hurdle yards ahead of the field to win in 14.8 seconds, clipping 1-10th off the mark set by Johnny Cowles of King City last year. Cowles tied for second today, with Walter of Pacific Grove.

ALSO WINS LOW HURDLES

Reiss then went ahead a little later to establish a new mark in the 220-yard low hurdles. He rambled over the timbers in 24.4 seconds, beating the old mark of 25.2 set by McLean of Santa Cruz in 1933.

The fourth record to fall was in the first event, the half mile, when Lane of San Rafael braved the scorching sun to thrill the crowd with a 1:57.3 time. The mark better the former record of 1:58.5 held by McCurdy of Tamalpais since 1933—the oldest record on the books.

The remainder of the marks were good, but not good enough to break existing records. Taix of San Jose won the century in :10.2; Brasher of Richmond won the discus with a heave of 134 feet 4 inches; Krug of Berkeley headed the quarter-mileers in :51.5; Walter of Pacific Grove won the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet 8 inches; Valador of Mendocino won the mile in 4:38.3; Taix repeated in the 220 with a time of 22.1 seconds; Emerson Chapman of Berkeley tied with Brown of Vallejo in the high jump at 5 feet 11½ inches; Steele of Santa Rosa won the shot-put with a toss of 53 feet 11 inches; and the Piedmont team walked off with the relay.

50 SCHOOLS TAKE PART

Some 250 competitors from 50 schools took part in the day-long meet, which found trials being run off in the morning, and the final laps in the afternoon, 'neath a blistering sun, in this little city.

A Class 'C' meet was also run off, which was won in a walk by San Jose, which scored 26 points.

Hayward and Monterey tied for second place with only 9 points each. Richmond was the only other County Loop team to score in the limited division, tallying 2 points for tie for twelfth place.

Since this division has been changed this year, all of today's marks go into the books as records.

The class has been made smaller in size of the athletes. However, some of the times and distances today bettered previous records.

SEVERAL RECORDS FALL

Noriel of Petaluma won the 120-yard low hurdles in :13.9; the old mark was 14 seconds flat. Perkins clipped a tenth off the 440 mark by winning in :54.1, while San Jose also clipped a tenth off the relay mark by winning in :45.4.

Tablayo of Monterey won the pole vault at 11 feet 1¾ inches, a better old mark of 11 feet ¾ inch, and Jiminez of Hayward leaped 21 feet 5 inches in the broad jump, the old mark being 20 feet 4¾ inches.
