Compton High Captures Southland C.I.F. Title

San Diego Nosed Out in Hard-fought Meet; Shoop, Morris Grab Individual Honors

Two happenings which definitely may be recorded as "unusual" in our Southern California parlance highlighted yesterday's California Interscholastic Federation track and field meet at the Coliseum.

Said happenings were (a) the almost complete absence of record breaking (not one varsity standard went by the boards) and (b) it rained.

Despite these two untimely occurrences, some 6500 fans were treated to a top-notch meet that saw Ernie Hartman's Compton High spike out San Diego for team honors, climaxing their triumph with a hair-raising win in the relay. The Tarababes tallied 22½ points to the Hillers' 19½. Santa Monica was third with 18.

RELAY THRILLER

Class B winner was San Diego Hoover with 27½. Glendale and Long Beach Wilson were next in line. Glendale took C honors with 21, while El Monte had 17½.

The baton-passing event, a four-man 880, was a real thriller. Compton and San Diego kept together until the anchor lap when Bob Estavillo of the Hillers spurred six yards away from Jim Jenkins as he started the furlong. Jenkins, however, slowly closed the gap. He was a couple of yards behind as they hit the stretch.

Estavillo held on gamely and it appeared that he was going to stay in front. But with 10 yards to go, the Tarababe bundled himself together and blasted across the line a scant inch in front of his foe.

RAIN FALLS

A few minutes previous to this, when the Class C relay was called, the rain which had been threatening all afternoon began to fall, sending the fans scurrying to tunnels, archways and other spots of refuge. However, it cleared away sufficiently to bring the crowd out of cover during the varsity relay.

High point man for the meet was Glenn Shoop of Long Beach

Jordan, who won the low hurdles, broad jump and tied for third in the pole vault. Only other double winner in the varsity division was Eddie Morris, Huntington Beach sprinter.

EASY VICTORY

Morris copped both of his events with ease. He was clocked in 9.9s. and 21.4s., winning by margins of three and eight yards, respectively. Jenkins chased him in both times.

Best event, aside from the relay, was the 880, in which Homer Philbrick of Ventura staged a magnificent stretch drive that put him in front of Santa Monica's Thermo Knowles. The latter, favorite in the race, began his sprint too soon and was an awfully tired boy as he crossed the line almost even with Philbrick.

The quarter-mile also brought some excitement. Duane Lewis of Compton outlasted his field

Gil Webb of Redlands looked good in winning the mile. He led from start to finish in the fast time of 4m. 31s. . . . A Class C vaulter named Al McArthur

went 12ft. 2 1/4 in. for one of the two new records . . . Frank Ferguson of Inglewood was upset in the pole vault by Burbank's Corwin . . . Art Minini of Paso Robles got off a nice heave of 54ft. 10 1/2 in. in the shot-put . . . Jenkins collapsed completely after the relay and had to be carried off the track . . . Another upset victim was Excelsior's Jordan in the high hurdles.
