

125-lb. Squad Ties for Title In Berkeley

Making up for their upset in the PAL finals a week ago, San Mateo High school's tracksters took first place in the north coast section of the California Interscholastic Federation meet held Saturday at Edwards field, Berkeley.

Wins in 125

The Bearcat lightweight squad won the 125-exponent title in a first-place tie with Pacific Grove, totaling 19½ points while Sequoia was third, Berkeley and Palo Alto finishing fourth and fifth respectively. The Matean unlimiteds tied with Palo for fourth spot in that division which was won by the PAL champ, Abe Lincoln, of San Jose.

San Mateo's victory in the 125's was led by little Eddie Mack, colored star on this season's San Mateo team. Mack won the broad jump with the tremendous leap of 20 feet 5¾ inches and took a fifth in the 50-yard dash. Ugo Cauz, PAL 130's broad jump champ, took a fifth in that event.

Takes 40

Dick Leggett, who took a third in the PAL meet at Stanford, provided a second win for San Mateo by blistering the cinder with a 54.2 time in the 440-yard run. Mckel, San Mateo twenties star, took a third in this event. Bill Haycock was the other point provider for Vic Binsacca's Northern California high school champs, taking a second in the pole vault and a third in the shot put for the Bearcat.

In the unlimited meet, San Mateo's Bill Smith cracked the old NCS time in the 220-yard low hurdles with a sizzling 23.1 time, to provide one of two record runs of the day. The other record was set by Bob Chambers, the only entry from Los Gatos High. Chambers raced the 880-yard route in 1:55 flat. Jim Green of San Mateo took a second, while Bill Smith, with a third in the high hurdles, supplemented his record in the lows, and Odo Camerotto, with a fourth in the shot put, completed San Mateo's efforts in the meet.

Youth Sets 880 Mark

Robert Chambers, 17 year old Los Gatos High School senior, set a new North Coast interscholastic record when he covered the half-mile in 1 minute 55 seconds in the annual meet at the University of California's track stadium yesterday.

This broke the old mark of the North Coast section of the California Interscholastic Federation for the 880 yard run of 1:57.3, set by Lane of San Rafael in 1940.

Chambers, coached by Orin Matheny, ran the first quarter-mile of the half in 53 seconds. He said that his best previous time for the half-mile was 2:00.6.

The meet, in which thirty-three high schools competed, was won by Abraham Lincoln High School of San Jose with 25½ points. A close second was Alameda High School with 24½ points. Other school scores were:

Richmond, 18; San Mateo and Palo Alto, 14 each; Berkeley, 11¼; Hayward, 10; Crockett, Tamalpais and St. Helena, 8 each; Piedmont, 7¾; Vallejo, 6½; San Rafael, 6; Pacific Grove, 6; Analy, Los Gatos and Santa Rosa, 5 each; Salinas, 4; Napa, 2; Albany 1, and Healdsburg, ½.
