INSTRUCTIONS FOR COACHES & CONTESTANTS

Coaches please warn contestants not to wear track spikes on gym floor.

Do not leave valuables in clothes left in gym, They may be checked at the gym office until after the meet.

Only one preliminary call will be made for each event 10 minutes before the start of the event.

Coaches please sit in the stands during the evening finals. A section will be reserved near the finish.

One manager will be allowed on the field, but he must remain in the enclosure with his team. His manager's ribbon will admit him to the stadium through the north gate.

Only contestants in track suits will be allowed on the field. Present your number at the north gate for admittance. Please stay in the enclosure until your event is called. Contestants eliminated in the afternoon trials will be admitted to the stadium for the evening finals by presenting their number at the north gate.

Coaches will be admitted to the stadium by presenting their ribbon at any gate.

All lanes in the 440, 880, and mile will be drawn by schools before the start of the event.

The relay will start in front of the south stands. The first two runners will run in lanes - the third runner may break for the pole.

The 440 will start at the north east side of the stadium under the oak tree and will finish at the east end of the straightaway on the south side. Contestant may break for the pole providing he is a full seven feet in front.

Mr. Roland Logan, of the Logan Athletic Trainers Aids, will be the official trainer and first aid man for the meet. If you desire his assistance feel free to call on him.

Towels will be furnished for those taking showers. They are not to be taken out of the drying room.

OFFICIATING DIVISIONAL MEETS

Officiating in our Divisional Meets on May 11 is of outstanding importance. In recognition of ability and careful training, we attempt to pick the eight best boys in Southern California in each event and bring them together at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 18 to select our champions for the year.

The final step in the process of selecting the eight boys to compete in each event is taken at our Divisional Meets on May 11. These five meets held on five different fields and officiated by five different sets of judges, timers, inspectors, etc., are subject to variations which cannot be eliminated.

To cut down these variations to the smallest extent possible officials at these five Divisional Meets are asked to read carefully the following suggestions and directions and follow them as closely as possible.

FIELD EVENTS

High Jump and Pole Vault

(1) Record carefully the starting height and each succeeding height as the event proceeds. When a competitor clears the bar put a check in the proper place after his name. When he misses put a zero after his name. When the event is finished measure with steel tape, if one is available, the exact height of the winning attempt, and record this on the card.

Important—In the pole vault and high jump every competitor must continue until he has missed three times the last height that he tries. The eight best marks made May 11 will determine the eight boys to compete May 18 at the Coliseum. It is possible for all eight boys to come from the same Divisional Meet.

Broad Jump, Hop-Step & Jump, and the Shot Put

Use a steel tape if one is available. Record fractions of an inch to the smallest fraction possible.

N.C.A.A. rules are printed on the back of the Event Cards in field events.

As each competitor in field events performs by himself it should be the practice to adhere definitely to the letter of the rule.

TRACK EVENTS

In track events if a boy deviates from the strict letter of the rule he should not be disqualified by the Referee unless it is shown that his deviation from the rule has (a) helped him, or (b) has hindered some other competitor. For example—a boy stepping out of his lane, to the right, in rounding a curve can gain no advantage to himself and unless he interferes with someone else should not be disqualified. In races run in lanes a boy must finish in his proper lane, to avoid confusion among the judges.

Timing

Importance—There are two outstanding reasons why accuracy of timing at our five divisional meets is important. Records made are accepted as new C.I.F., Southern Section records. Beyond the first place boy in each Divisional Meet others to compete in the Finals are picked on times made.

Difficulties—In timing an ordinary race a timer watches the tape and snaps his watch when the winner breasts the tape. At our Divisional Meets the timers must in addition to operating his watch take definite note of the boy he timed, and he must also get the boy's name, school and number. The timers who time 2nd, 3rd, or 4th must work without the aid of the finish tape depending on the finish line on the ground only and must do a judge of finish work in noting the place of the boy timed.

Cautions Suggested—Watch the starter. Pay no attention to the runners. Start the watch when the smoke of the gun is seen. Watch the tape or finish line as the race ends and snap the watch as the runner finishes. Watching the race often leads to anticipating the finish and the time shown will be too fast.

Special Rules

Eight timers will be provided, if possible, for each Divisional Meet. This will allow for two timers on each of four places. In order that the procedure at each of the five Divisional Meets may be as uniform as possible head timers are asked to follow the directions given below.

1. When two timers do not agree record the median time.
2. When two timers differ only one tenth of a second record the slower time.
3. When runners finish less than a yard apart it may be necessary to record the same time for both but the place of each in the race should be recorded. We want no ties if possible.
4. Observe as closely as possible the distance between runners. This may aid when watches seemingly disagree.
5. In all cases of seeming disagreement the head timer's decision is final.

Relay Races

The relay races at the Coliseum on May 18 will be run in lanes for the first 440 yards. At the Divisional Meet this order will be followed if possible.

Hurdles

If the hurdles are legal (require an eight pound pull to overturn) there are no restrictions as to the number that may be overturned. If hurdles are not legal (and most high school hurdles are not) in races of 70 yards or less two hurdles overturned disqualifies the competitor. In races of over 70 yards three hurdles overturned disqualifies.

Washington High, Los Angeles, Captures Track, Field Meet Held In Visalia Mineral King Bowl

Led by Hugh McElhenny's first place performances in three events, the powerful Washington high track team from Los Angeles won the California State Intercollegiate Track and Field championship Saturday in Mineral King stadium before a crowd estimated at 4000.

The Generals chalked up 24 points to edge out last year's champions from Redondo Beach by a four-point margin.

McElhenny paced off the 180-yard low hurdles for a first place and a record in this newly added event, then grabbed firsts in the 120-yard lows and the broad jump.

Jefferson High of Los Angeles shared top spot honors by grabbing third place with a total of 17 2/3 points. Glendale Hoover was fourth with 14; Jordan of Los Angeles, fifth, with 13, and Compton, sixth, with 11 1/2.

Other finishers were as follows: Roosevelt (Fresno), 7 1/2; Coalinga, 6; Pacific Grove, 5; La Jolla, 4; San Mateo, 4; San Diego, 4; Cathedral (Los Angeles), 4; Excelsior (Norwalk), 3 1/2; El Cerrito, 3; Poly Tech (Long Beach), 3; Corcoran, 3; Carmel, 3; Visalia, 2; Delano, 2; Dorsey (Los Angeles), 2; Tulare, 2; Bakersfield, 2; Wilson (Long Beach), 2; Madera, 2; Modesto, 1 1/2; Belmont (Los Angeles), 1; Beverly Hills, 1; Banning (Wilmington), 1; Hanford, 1/2; Hamilton (Los Angeles), 1/2; Mark Keppel (Alhambra), 1/6; Whittier, 1/6, and Gardena, 1/6.

Visalia's points came in the 100-yard dash when Paregien grabbed a fifth and in the 880-yard relay when the Visalia team, consisting of Abercrombie, Paregien, Green and Hubbell, took a fifth in this event.

Only record to go on the books was McElhenny's time of 19.3 in the 180-yard low hurdles, an event which was previously run over 220 yards. The L. A. star ripped off a 14.5 in the 120-yard high jumps and leaped 22 feet 10 1/2 inches to take his third first place in the meet. He was also a member of the Washington high relay team which copped a fourth.

Of his team's total of 24 points, McElhenny accounted for 13 1/2. He was presented with the award for the highest individual score of the meet. His team received the team trophy, won last year by Redondo Beach, another Southland team.

Second highest individual scoring went to Bradley of Glendale, Hoover. The Glendale ace copped a total of 11 points of his team's total of 14.

Seth Van Patten, commissioner of the southern section of the CIF, formally opened the track meet. The Visalia Post of the American Legion flag bearers hoisted the flag atop the flagpole in Mineral King Bowl to the strains of the National Anthem played by the VUHS band, resplendent in their new uniforms.

The meet got under way promptly at 7:30 p. m. under the expert direction of C. R. "Moose" Dibrow, who has staged several big track affairs, including this year's state and valley track meets.

Joe Louis, Here To Referee Boxing Go, Reiterates He Will Quit Boxing In 1948

Joe Louis is going to retire from boxing next year. He reiterated this intention Saturday night while in Visalia to referee promoter Louie Miller's wrestling exhibition in Civic auditorium.

But the world's champion hasn't the faintest idea what he will do when he packs his boxing gloves and punching bag in the old trunk and call it quits.

"Will you settle down on your farm in Michigan and raise cattle?" (now Babe) who is now in Europe, a Times-Delta reporter asked him. "I don't think so," Joe answered in his easy way. "I haven't made up my mind, though. Time enough to think about it later, after I've finished out the year and maybe defended my title another time or two."

Joe, who has defended his title 23 times—oftener, he says, than all other heavyweight champions put together—may fight on the west coast in his next championship appearance.

The Brown Bomber says he may

meet the winner of the Wolcott-Maxin go. Frank Sinatra, the crooner who's turned promoter, will bring these heavyweights together in Southern California on June 23.

"Frankie has offered me a good deal to meet the winner, out here on the coast," Joe explained.

Louis says he considers Maxin, Wolcott and Jos Babe the only heavyweight contenders of much consequence on the horizon right now. Babe, who is now in Europe, recently knocked out Bruce Woodcock, the British champion. He's due to fight again in Europe before returning to the states.

The Bomber, now 33, has fought 220 fights, more becoming a professional, not counting more than 500 exhibitions during the war. He's held his title, under Queensbury rules, longer than any other heavyweight champion.

"A heavyweight can fight well until he's 34," Joe said. "I'll be 34 in 1948. That's as good a time as any to retire."
