DR. FRANK W. THOMAS

Dr. Frank W. Thomas, a long-time friend of the West Coast Relays and of college athletics in general, retires this year after 22 years of service as President of Fresno State College.

Dr. Thomas came to Fresno State College as a member of the education faculty in 1917. In 1927 he was named President of the College, succeeding Charles L. McLane. During his administration the college has more than tripled in size, both in physical facilities and student enrollment.

Under Dr. Thomas' friendly guidance student government at Fresno State College has developed into one of the most democratic of any college or university in the country.

For his encouragement and cooperation, without which the West Coast Relays could never have reached their present magnitude, this program for the 22nd Annual West Coast Relays is respectfully dedicated to Dr. Frank W. Thomas.

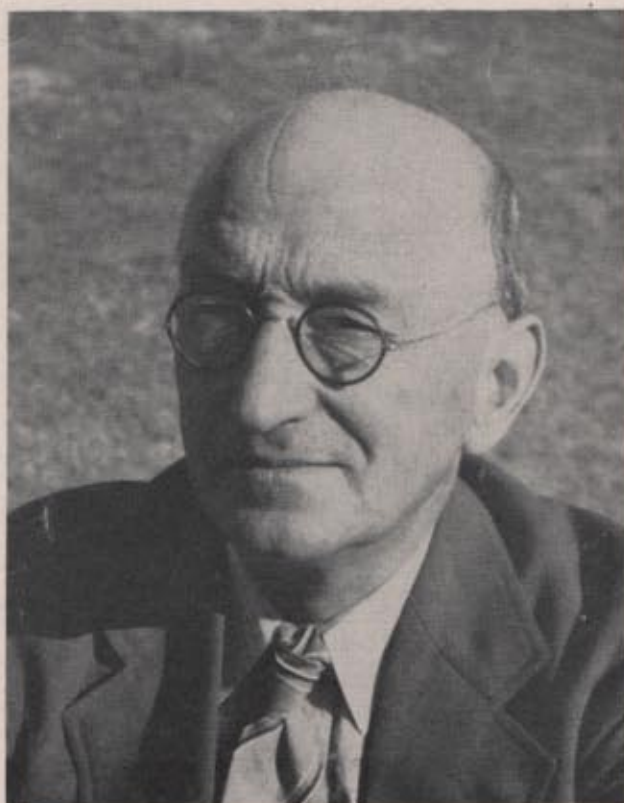
EMORY RATCLIFFE

Honorary referee of the 22nd Annual West Coast Relays is one of the men most closely connected with the founding and development of the meet, Emory Ratcliffe.

This year Mr. Ratcliffe is retiring as head of the social science department at Fresno State College after 33 years in that position. Throughout those years he has been keenly interested in the development of the Fresno State College athletic program, and has served on the Games Committee of the West Coast Relays for virtually every running of the meet.

His interest in Fresno State athletics is exemplified by the fact that Mr. Ratcliffe coached the first football team at the college, in 1921. The stadium in which this meet is being held today was named for him.

The 22nd Annual West Coast Relays salutes a valued friend, Honorary Referee Emory Ratcliffe.

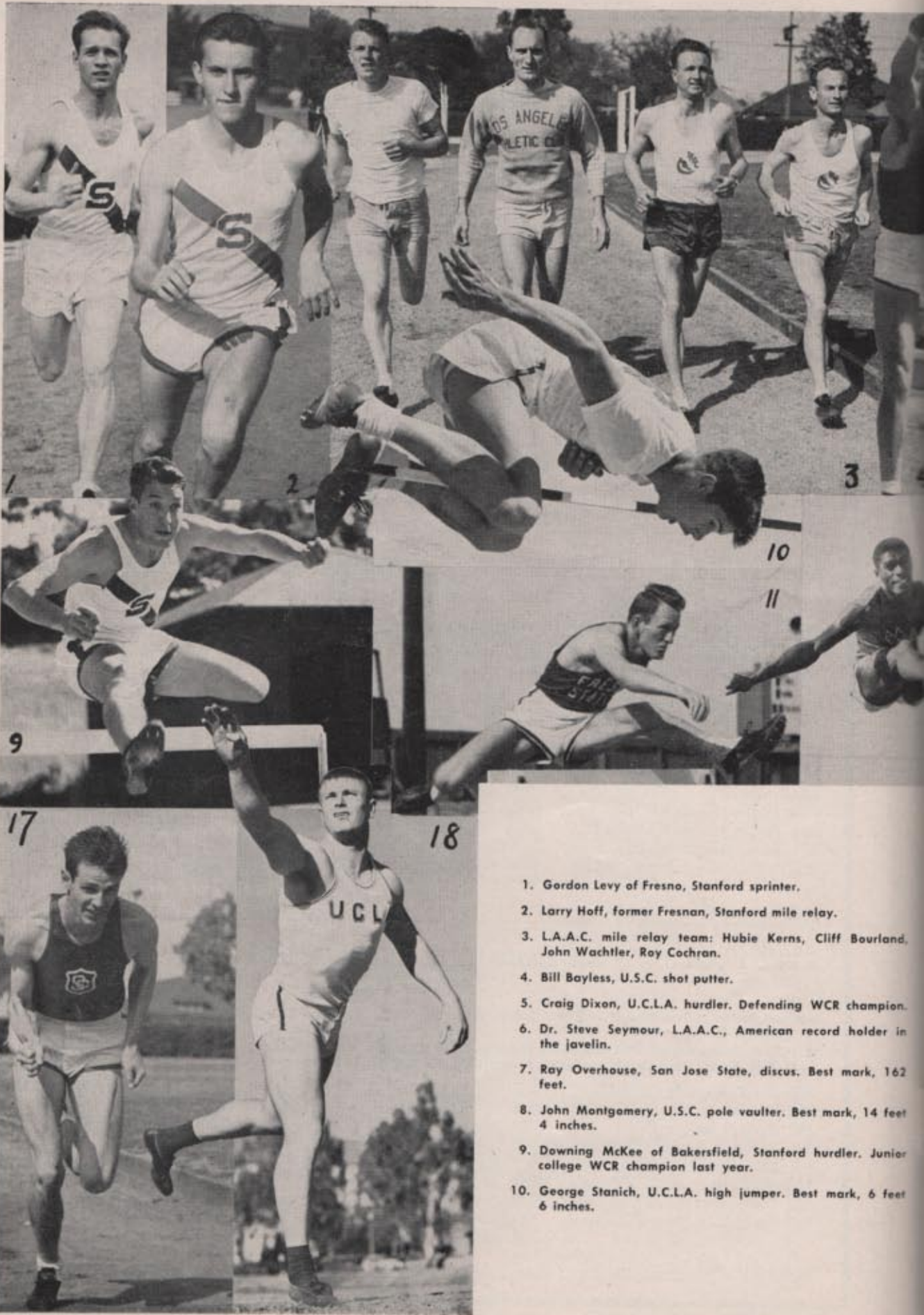

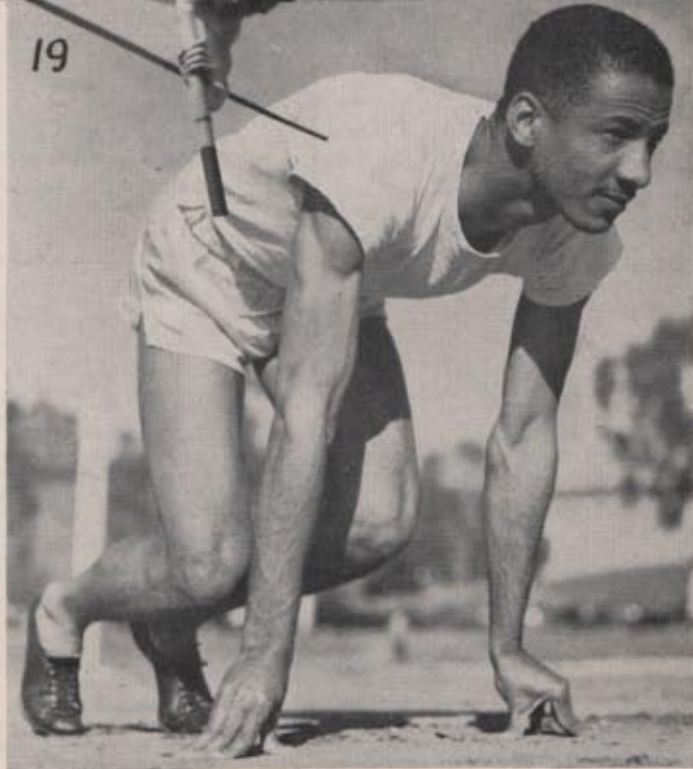

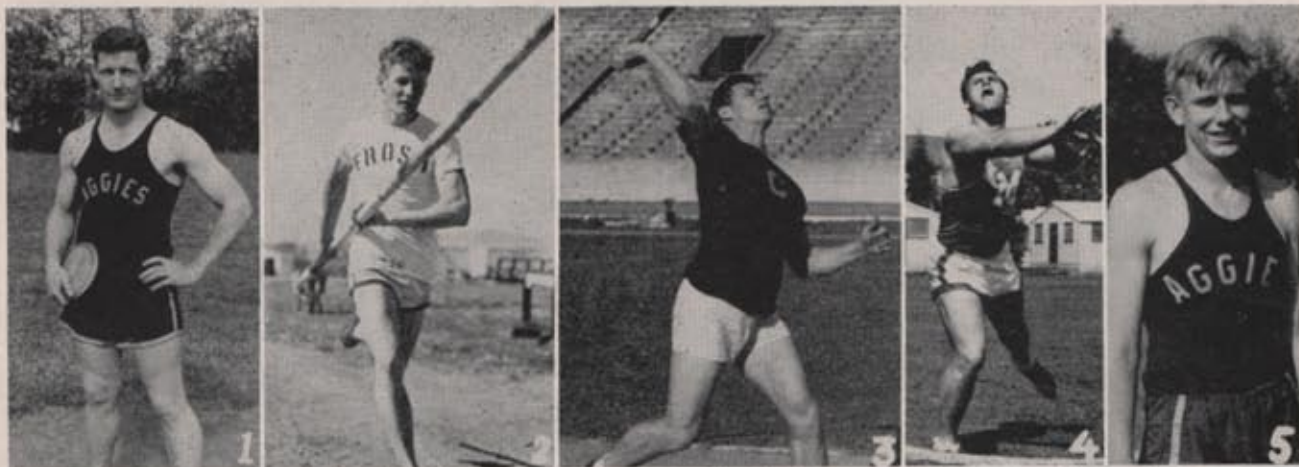
