## Mathieson Guides | Sports Champions

Fremont High School's smashing varsity division victory in Friday night's Santa Clara Valley Athletic League track and field championships at Sunnyvale was only the second such accomplishment for the Indians in the 19 league meets held since the circuit was formed in the Fall of 1928. The first SCVAL meet was held in 1929. No records are

available concerning a 1933 meet, and the league suspended activities during 1942 due to the war.

Marty Mathieson. Fremont's huge at hie tic director, has coached both championship indian teams. His 1948 varsity set a team scoring record in scoring 1041/2 points; and that mark was erased this year as the '49 con-

tingent rolled up 143 points. Fremont scored 20 points more than the other six SCVAL schools combined. Santa Clara was second in team tabulations with 45 points.

Fremont also won the Class C championship with 71 points to second place Washington's 54½. In the two divisions the Indians established a total of six new records.

Johnny Mesa, Fremont act, who won the 100, 200, hop-step-jump, and ran anchor on the 880-yard relay team, set a new mark in the hop-step-jump. Mesa propelled his body 44' 7" in Tuesday's trials to wipe out the 42' 10" standard set in 1944 by Bluford Thornton of Los Gatos, Mesa won the event in the finals although he did not compete. Henry Martin won in similar fashion in the broad jump. He cleared 22' 4\\\2'' in the trials. Charles Sedgwick topped the 120yard high hurdles in :15.7; and Charles Gonzales raced the 180yard low hurdles in .21.1. Vie Fidium, Martin, Gonzales, and Martin won the relay in 1 33.2 in the finals, equalling their record set in Tuesday's trials The previous record had been 1:334, set in 1941 by Mountain View's Harold Fullride, Charles Garvich, Craig Holden, and Elbert Levens, Billy Moore set a Class C record in the 120-yard low sticks, ripping off a fast :15.3.

Other records set in the 19th annual meet: 120-yard high hurdles, Class B. :16.5, by Tom Snowden of Los Gatos; 180-yard low hurdles, Class B, :22.1, by Charles McBain of Campbell; Pole Vault, Class D, 10 ft., 38-in., by Maurice Boos of Mountain View; 120-yard low hurdles, Class D, :15.7, by Alfred Guzman of Santa Clara.

championship with 73<sup>1</sup>½ points, 3½5 more than runner-up Fremont. The Panthers also won Class D with 71 points to Gilroy's 31 7/10.

Mathieson, a six-foot, five and one-half inch, 235 pounder, has not confined his championships to the cinder sport. Last Winter the Indians won their first SCVAL basketball varsity title, and are a good bet to repeat next season. Only Guard Glenn Wallin will be lost via graduation. Fremont won the 130-exponent cage title in 1948, and also the 120-exponent track crown.

In the SCVAL baseball campaign which ended last week, Washington High School of Centerville claimed its third diamond pennant. In garnering their second straight, the Huskies finished two games ahead of runner-up Santa Clara.
