

Paly captures Class B title; Burlingame varsity triumphs

Paly High's Class B trackmen beat out Sequoia by one scant point to capture their division title yesterday at Peninsula Athletic League track and field finals in San Jose.

Burlingame — as expected — ousted Lincoln from the varsity throne the Lions had occupied for six years. San Mateo wrapped up the Class C crown as expected.

The scoring:

Class C—San Mateo 35, San Jose 26 $\frac{1}{4}$, Burlingame 11 $\frac{3}{4}$, Sequoia 10, Jefferson 5.

Star of Coach Hod Ray's Li'l Vike aggregation was Ole Holsti. Ole provided the only record-breaking performance of the day and one of his team's two firsts by winning the 660 in 1:26.1. His time smashed the record of 1:27.3 set by Sequoia's Larry Broeren last year.

Floyd Kumagai turned in the best come-through for the small Loren Sorenson to win the broad jump. In addition to his broad jump second, Sorenson took third in the 150 and fourth in the 75 to rank as Paly's high point man of the day.

Others who chipped in for the title were Herc Smith, who lost only by the thickness of his spectacles to Burlingame's Don Redmond in the low hurdles; Bob Brand, who placed third in the 330 although badly jostled at one point; and Ron Plough, who tied for second in the high jump.

The Paly relay team of Sorenson, Kumagai, Smith, and Don Hodgkin almost nipped the flying Sequoia quartet.

Sequoia's Class B sprinters shared honors, Don Austin winning the 75 and Erle Barnett taking the 150. Austin tied the record and Barnett shaved it, but their marks—and all others in straightaway races—were not allowed because of a stiff tailwind.

In copping two firsts and two seconds and anchoring the winning relay, Barnett and Austin nearly downed Paly by themselves.

Burlingame had little trouble in the varsity meet, thanks to the efforts of Ron Dawson, Dick Van Der Beets, Jim McIndoe, Dick Rittenmeyer, and Bob

Hamilton. Coach Vic Mangini's men scored in every event but the discus.

San Mateo took second, mainly through the efforts of Sprinters Al Tinker and Bob Doe and three shotputters led by Ron Gile.

Dave Conway, Larry Broeren, and Floyd Bumbaca accounted for Sequoia's third place. Conway unofficially clipped four-tenths of a second from the low hurdles mark set last week by San Jose's Frank Harrison, and came through for a second in the 100.

Broeren stood off a strong finish by Kenny Marlin of Burlingame to take the 880, and Bumbaca closed fast in the quarter to move up from fifth to second at the finish.

Jack Herring threw the discus out over 130 feet to pin down the single first for Lee Cox's defending champions from Lincoln.

In the thriller race of the day, Jefferson's Joe Zanobini defeated last year's co-champs, Bob Green of Lincoln and Paul Bowen of Palo Alto, in a 4:36.2 mile. Zanobini breasted the tape several yards ahead of Green.

Bowen led most of the way until the first turn of the final lap but faded badly in the stretch. It was the first defeat in PAL competition in two years for the redheaded Paly ace, who has been suffering from a cold and bruised arch.

Coach Ray Allee's versatile Bearcat combination of Mel Kani, Elmer Yamada, Ted Adkins, and Lee Ridgeway was too much for the opposition in the Class C meet.

Paly Trackmen Win Class B Crown Ole Holsti Establishes New 660 Mark

Palo Alto's lightweight trackmen turned the tables on Sequoia and came home with the Class B championship last week. Led by Ole Holsti and Loren Sorensen, they edged out the Cherokees by one point, 26-25. The varsity did not do so well winding up in seventh place with a total of 8 1/3 points. The track and field finals were held at San Jose.

Burlingame, as expected, took the varsity title with San Mateo and Sequoia runners-up.

Ole Holsti broke the PAL 660 record in placing first in that event with a time of 1:26.1. The previous mark was made in 1949 by Sequoia's Larry Broeren, who turned the distance in 1:27.3.

Floyd Kumagai came through to upset Loren Sorensen in the broad jump. Sorensen however, emerged as high point man for the Vikings. He placed third in the 150 and fourth in the 75, and ran a portion of the 440 relay which ran second to Sequoia.

Herc Smith lost by a hair to Burlingame's Don Redmond in the 120 yard low hurdles.

Bob Brand placed third in the 330 although slightly bumped at one point. Ronnie Plough tied for second in the high jump to round out the Vike Class B scoring.

Sequoia's two speed merchants, Don Austin and Erle Barnett took first and second in the 75 and then reversed themselves in the 150, Barnett placing first with Austin coming in second. This, coupled with their laps in the winning relay, almost beat the Norse single-handedly.

In the varsity events, Burlingame scored in every event but the discus to land way out in front at the conclusion of the meet. The Panthers were led by hurdlers Jim McIndoe and Dick Van Der Beets,

sprinter Ron Dawson, and broad jump Bob Hamilton.

Paly's Paul Bowen, suffering from a cold and a foot ailment was defeated in the mile by Joe Zanobini of Jefferson and Bob Green of Lincoln after leading most of the way. It was the first loss the carrot-topped Viking ace has suffered in his two years of PAL competition.

Brick Armstrong, John Stewart, John Vipham and Al Lynch were the other winners for the Green and White. Brick came through in fine style to grab a fourth spot in the 220. John Stewart took third in the high jump while teammate John Vipham had to be content for a tie for fourth. Placing third in the pole vault was Lynch's contribution to the Viking cause.

San Mateo, led by former Jordanite Mel Kani, copped the Class C championship. Paly did not enter into Class C competition.

Holsti set a new PAL record in the 660, turning the distance in 1:26.1. Herc Smith lost by a hair in the low hurdles, Floyd Kumagai beat out teammate Loren Sorensen in the broadjump, and Ronny Plough tied for second in the high jump. Varsity point-getters included Brick Armstrong, John Stewart, John Vipham and Al Lynch. Paul Bowen, suffering from various physical ailments, had to be satisfied with a third in the mile.

Burlingame Is PAL Champ

SAN JOSE, May 5.—Burlingame amassed 44 $\frac{2}{3}$ points to win its first Peninsula Athletic League track title in seventeen years at the league meet today.

Team totals were: Burlingame 44 $\frac{2}{3}$, San Mateo 29, Sequoia 18, Lincoln of San Jose 17, San Jose 16, Jefferson 10, Palo Alto 7 $\frac{1}{3}$, South San Francisco 1.

Dave Conway of Sequoia snared the 180-yard low hurdles in 20.4, four seconds better than the old record, but a new mark was not recognized because of a wind.

Palo Alto captured the Class B crown and San Mateo snared class C.
