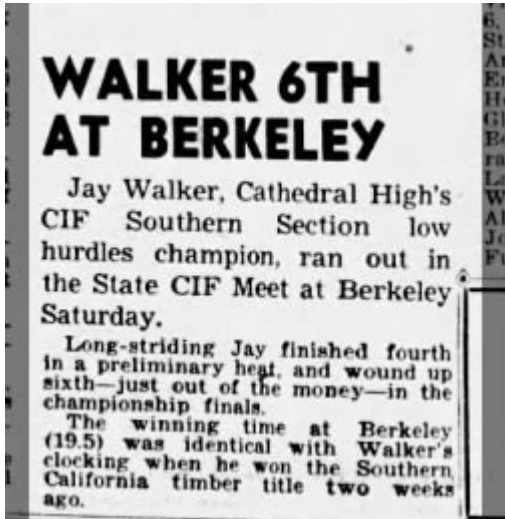

JEFFERSON RETAINS STATE SPIKE CROWN

BERKELEY, May 26—Jefferson High School became the first school in the 33-year history of the State CIF track and field championships to annex three straight titles as the Democrats came with a rush in the final stages to score 16½ points today at Edwards Stadium.

The Jeff triumph becomes more amazing in that losses of Sprinter Floyd Dennis, Miler Jimmie Walker and the relay team plus a severe spike wound to 440-Ace Al Moore had apparently rendered the Demos impotent.

Surprise performances by Bob Holland and Rosslyn Range in the broad jump and Vaulter O. W. Rhodes were responsible for the Democrat win.

Holland came through to whip a very disappointing broad jump field at 22ft. 5¾ in. Range nabbed a fourth while highly heralded Rollin Garrison of Compton and John Parker of San Diego fell one and two and a half feet below their best marks respectively.

Northerners Shine

Rhodes, a junior, wiggled over 12ft. 6in. on his final effort to provide his school with the necessary points to break the 13-point tie which they shared with Fresno. He went on to clear 12ft. 9in. to gain a tie for second behind Belmont's Clarke Merrill, who did 13ft.

Otherwise the Southland athletes gave their poorest State meet showing in years. Northern spikemen won six firsts excluding the discus which isn't on the Southland program.

Glendale Hoover's Bob Cuning and Leamon King of Delano split two interesting sprint duels. King, a freshman who recently turned 15, lost the century by four inches to Cuning in a good 9.7s. The Hoover whizzed the furlong until the final five yards when he broke stride. King edged past to win by two

feet in 21.4s. Quarter-mile honors went to Jack North of Long Beach Jordan. North's great stretch run carried him by Anaheim's Larry Kirchman in the final yard. The time was 49.7s.

Mark Threatened

An elongated junior from Fresno, Bernard Allard, barely missed setting a new national interscholastic high jump mark. After winning the event at 6ft. 5¾ in., Allard was over 6ft. 8in. only to brush it off with his knee. Five Southlanders tied for second at 6ft. 3in. Allard's teammate, Don Brinker, won a 14.5s. high hurdle decision by a chest over a slow-starting George Miller of Van Nuys.

A surprise winner in the lows was Glendale's Dick Clarke as he nipped Bob Daligney of Narbonne in 19.5s. Poly's well-balanced relayers scored an easy triumph in 1m. 30.9s.
