

The Lions score 45 points to be runners up in PAL champion ship; San Mateo took first in the grueling battle.

Last Saturday the Lincoln track team clashed in the 20th annual Peninsula Athletic League track meet at Stanford. In Class A Lincoln Don Bowden broke Fred Frevert's league record by two and four-

tenths seconds. The Lincolnite's time of 1:57 is the fastest recorded prep time in the state. In the 220-yard dash, Hank Loumena of Burlingame upset Bob Knoth with a time of 23 seconds flat.

In the high hurdle battle between Del Kephart of Lincoln and Charlie Henderson of San Mateo, Henderson ran a swift 15 seconds flat, clipping Kephart by three yards. Kephart, though, ran the fastest in his career, Roger Stephens of Palo Alto took the mile in a fast 4.36.7 with Jack Jones of Sequoia, defending champion, tak-

### Lions Grab 2nd; Bowden Sets Record

Lincoln Halfmiler Runs 880 in 1:57

San Mateo ended a 20-year victory famine to score a resounding triumph in the 20th annual Peninsula Athletic League track meet yesterday at Stanford. The Bearcats scored 65½ points to capture their first cinder championship. Lincoln, paced by record-breaking Don Bowden, scored 45 points for runner-up honors.

The Bearcats also picked up second places in both the B and C divisions. Menlo-Atherton won the B class with 57 5/6 digits, while Capuchino emerged on top in the C class with 44 points. Willow Glen and San Jose placed fifth and sixth in the varsity, while the Rams were a close fifth in the B class and San Jose tied for fourth in Class C.

Although San Mateo took team honors, some of the top individual performances were turned in by local preps. Bowden was the only man to break a varsity record, while Willow Glen's Ron Frizzell and Bob Walrath eclipsed Class B

### Best 880 in PAL Meet

STANFORD STADIUM, May 2.-Don Bowden of Lincoln (San Jose) ran the fastest prep 880 in the State this season, 1:57.0, to highlight the Peninsula Athletic League track finals today.

The Lincoln junior won by over 25 yards in establishing a new league record.

Former mark of 1:59.4 was established in 1944 by Bill Frevert of Lincoln.

The team title went to San Mateo, which piled up 65½ points to Lincoln's 45, Palo Alto's 29½, Burlingame's 28, Willow Glen's 26, San Jose's 15, Jefferson's 13, Sequoia's 13, Capuchino's 5, Carlmont's 5, and Menlo-Atherton's 2.

Only double winners in the meet were Hank Loumena of Burlingame, Hank Kephart of Lincoln and Bill Henderson of San Mateo.
