THE COMPETITION

Consistency is the key to high jump competition in the State meet and consistency gives Dailey of Hayward the favorite's role. The junior has a best jump of 6'7" this season and won the North Coast meet at 6'4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " last week. He is always over 6'4". Other jumpers who have cleared 6'4" this year are Theus of Oakland Tech, Dumas of Centennial, the Southern champion at 6'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", and Thomas of Jefferson.
