SPARTAN COACHES

Dynamic Lloyd C. (Bud) Winter is in his 13th season as head track coach at San Jose State, a distinguished career which has seen him consistently turn out one of the nation's better dual meet teams and regularly develop stars of international magnitude.

A one-man coaching, scouting and counseling staff, Winter still retains the energy and industry which marked him when he graduated from California in 1933.

Winter has less scholarship help than most of his opponents, and consequently less natural talent, but he has shown remarkable results in turning "also-rans" into point winners. The evidence lies in the record of 57 wins and 27 losses for a fine dual meet winning record of 67.9 per cent. His teams won five CCAA titles in six seasons before the Spartans left the conference, and last year San Jose upset Fresno State to win the first California State College championship.

On a national scale, his 1952 Spartans finished second to USC in the National Collegiates (NCAA) championship meet. Six of the eight Spartan national track champions were developed by Winter and he has had a man on each of the last three Olympic teams.

Bud is president of the American Collece Track Coaches Association and last year was chairman of the first International Track Coaches Clinic and was U.S. delegate to the International Federation of Track Coaches. A year ago, he represented the U.S. State Department on an around-the-world trip, during which most of his time was devoted to conducting clinics in India.

Winter is also in the process of writing a series of instructional books, the first of which, "So you Want to be a Sprinter", is already off the press.

COACHES (Con't)

Before coming to San Jose State, Bud had almost perfect records at Watsonville High School and Salinas (now Hartnell) J.C. while coaching both football and track. At Watsonville his team won four straight conference football titles and one varsity and four lightweight track crowns in four years. Moving to Salinas, his teams swept three league track titles and two grid championships in three years. Until 1952 he was also a Spartan football coach and is still considered one of the top scouts in the game.

Many fine performers have developed under Bud Winter. Hal Davis, the California Comet, was the world's outstanding sprinter under Winter at Salinas; Don Smalley, Billy Smith and Bobby Crowe also added to the Winter legend as developer of sprinters.

Bob Likins, two-time NCAA javelin champion; George Mattos, U.S. Olympic Games team pole vaulter in 1952; Lang Stanley, 1953 NCAA 880 champion; Discus Ace Woody Linn; High Jumper Herm Wyatt; Bob McMullen, 1952 NCAA and National AAU steeplechase champion, and Fill Priddy, 1952 NCAA pole vault co-champion, are other entries in Winter's book of champions. In addition, Willie Steele broad jumped 25 feet for Winter as a Spartan freshman before transferring to San Diego and later earning Olympic fame.

Bud's wife, Helen, was a schoolmate at California, and they are parents of Mickey, 17 and Janie, 14 and Kathy, 8.

SPARTAN PROSPECTS

Bud Winter probably faces the sternest challenge of his coaching career with the 1957 San Jose State track team.

There are some real hugeets on hand, performers capable of winning national titles, but they are few. Most of the squad is green or lacking in natural talent or both.

Overall, the Spartans should be excellent in the sprints and hurdles, above average in the distance events and fair in the middle distances. But the field events are a different story. The Golden Raiders will be strong in the pole vault but below average in every other field event unless someone shows rapid development.

Heading the sprinting corps is Ray Norton, who ran 9.6 and 21.6 last year while earning a spot in the final Olympic trials. Winter thinks he is ultimately capable of 9.4 or better. He'll be backed up by Garfield Finley, who ran 9.7 at E. Los Angeles J.C., Tom Lionvale, a 9.9 performer, Clint Redus, 9.7 at San Francisco C.C., and letterman Van Parish, who had one 9.8 last season.

Ron Giardina, who had a 21.3 clocking in the 220 last year was expected to be the top quartermiler this year, and a good one, but he suffered a pulled muscle in early workouts and may be out a good bit of the season. Other 440 men include service returnee Gene Tognetti (49.9), holdovers Ron Vavra (50.5) and Jim Hushaw (50.0) and Paul Valerie (49.0), transfer from Compton.

Tognetti (1:58) tops the half-milers although holdover Herb Stockman, distance men Fred Green and Mike Yeager, and Valerie will all take a crack at this stint.

Three top J.C. transfers figure to give the Spartans strength in the distances—Wes Bond (4:21 and 9:50), from Hartnell, Fred Green (4:22), Napa, and Mike Yeager (4:22), Compton. Also in the picture are letterman Bob Rush, 4:30 and 9:52, Ron Gross (10:20), West Contra Costa, Ken Napier (10:22), Bakersfield, and holdover Bob Tafoya (10:20), the latter reporting late after action with the boxing team.

PROSPECTS (Con't)

Redus (14.4 and 23.8) heads the hurdlers and should be one of the best. He'll receive support in the highs from his SFCC teammate, Ben Walker (15.0), letterman Wiley Schmidt (15.0) and Don Smith (15.1) transfer from Harbor. In the lows, letterman Van Parish (23.8) and Paul Webb will provide good depth.

Webb, also a pole vaulter (13-10), transferred from Sacramento two years ago but has been sidelined while obtaining medical clearance from an old illness. Also returning after a year out of school is Chuck Hightower, (14-4) who with 0.W. Rhodes and George Mattos gave San Jose State three of the 15 vaulters in the Olympic trails last year.

Glendale transfer Chuck Polizzi will provide most strength in the shot put (45-0), javelin (180-0), and discus (140-0), performances not calculated to win many points against most Spartan opponents.

Another versatile man who should be of some help is hurdler Walker who will compete in pole vault and high jump. Don Smith, (6-2), another hurdler, and Wilton Jones (6-0), from Shasta, will also high jump. Jones (22-0) is the only broad jumper unless sprinters Finley and Norton try this event. Lettermen Payne Green (23-4) and Harvey McCullough (23-5) are both on hand but neither is in shape.

Other discus men, in addition to Polizzi, are Milt Stewart (145-0), Modesto, Jim Pierce (127-0), E. Contra Costa, and holdover Al Jongewaard (130-0).
