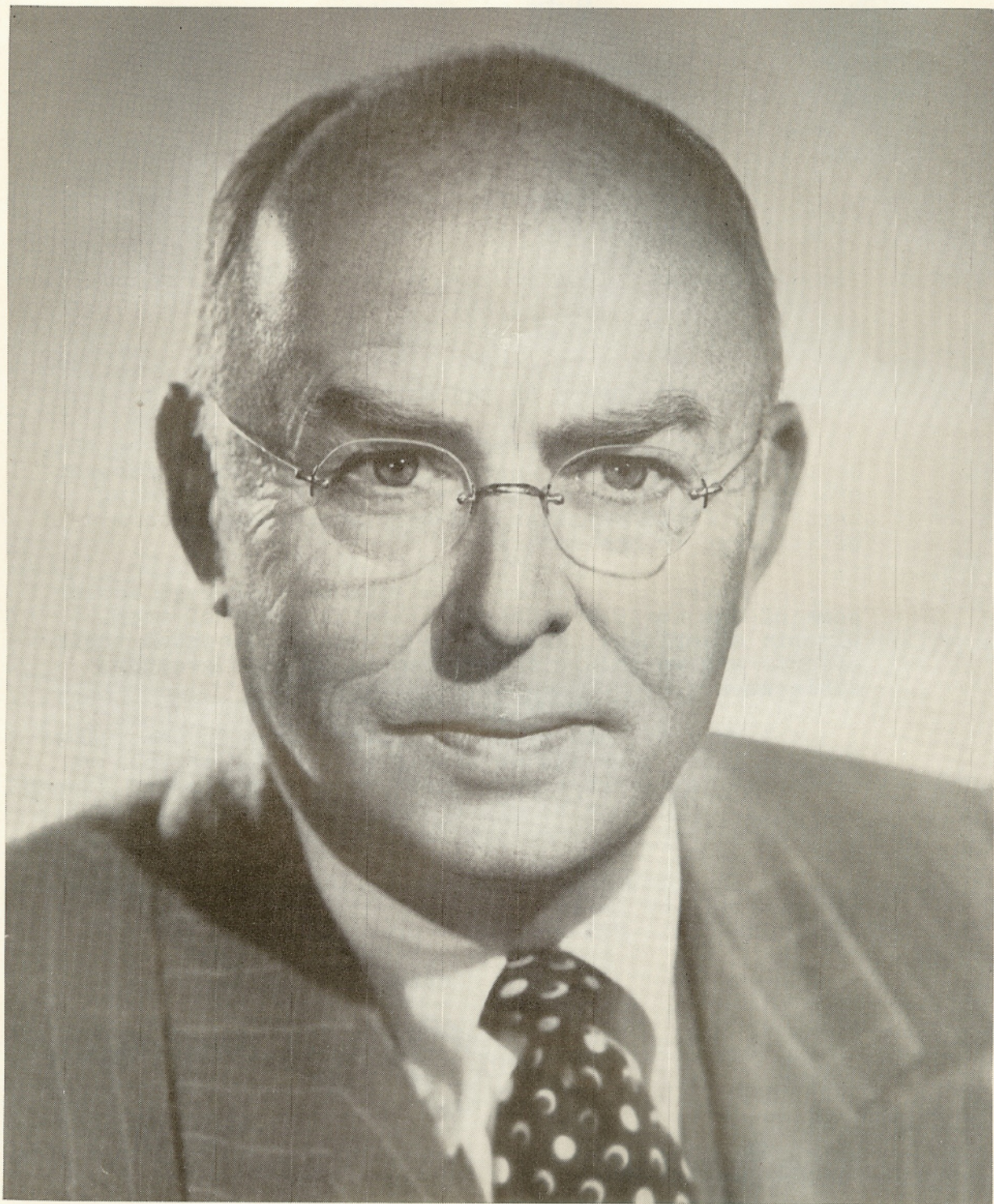
We welcome our out-of-town guests and we thank the citizens of Fresno for their fine support. May the 1957 West Coast Relays be the greatest one ever held.
