Long Shows 'Em; Tosses Javelin 248-2

Right on schedule from a time standpoint, but about 2,000 miles off course, Leo Long, the former Stanford NCAA javelin champ, turned in his best-ever effort here Saturday, a spiteinspired 248-2 heave.

Although third in the national AAU meet in 1955 and second last year, both times representing the San Francisco Olympic Club, Leo was not taken to this year's nationals in Dayton, O., where his mark in Saturday's all-comer meet at Sequoia would have placed him third and probably given him a trip to Europe.

Long's mark, naturally, was the top performance in the local meet, which kicked off a series of summer all-comer meets sponsored by the Northern California Track and Field Association and the Redwood City Recreation Department.

The remaining meets tentatively are scheduled for Stanford's Angell Field, depending upon the outcome of a meeting between officers of the NCT&FA and Al Masters, Stanford athletic director.

Two athletes who placed in the AAU meet with marks lower than Long's, John Fromm of Pacific Lutheran and Bill Duckworth of Georgia, were named to go on AAU tour to European

He entered the meet unattached, claiming he no longer would represent the Olympic Club in future competition.

Before Saturday's meet, he told officials that he planned to get off his best-ever performance to prove he should have been sent to the nationals. He had been building up to the AAU for his best mark, he stat-

Next to Long, Saturday's best performer was San Jose State's Chuck Hightower, who cleared the bar at 14 feet in the pole vault, Ivan Hartsell former Salinas High star currently attending Hartnell Junior College, was second at 13-0.

Biggest disappointment of the afternoon was the mile race between Norman Lloyd, Stanford's English miler, and Ron Larrieu, former Palo Alto prep State Champ and 1957 State Junior College mile and twomile champ.

Neither seemed to care for the 94 degree heat and it wound up as a jog for 31/2 laps, with Lloyd outsprinting Larrieu for a 4:42.0 win.

The Los Angeles Striders' Bob Humphreys won the discus at 154-1 and doubled in the 12pound shot, taking it at 64-10.

Bill Morgan, San Francisco city prep mile champ this year, won the 5000-meter, run for the Achilles Athletic Club in 16:38. coming in 1:40 seconds ahead of second place Ray Mahanna.

A special/100-yard dash featured a father and son combo, with 18-year-old Heinie Hartwig Jr. besting 39-year-old Heinie Hartwig senior in an 11.33 race.
