

M-A to enter pair in state track meet

Menlo-Atherton High School's talented pair of weightmen, Tom Strong and Bob Atkinson, today hold the distinction of being the only Midpeninsula track and field men that will still be in uniform this Saturday.

Strong, with a whirl of 148-2 in the discus, and Atkinson, with a toss of 56-4 in the shot-put, won their way back to Berkeley and the state finals with those performances in the North Coast Section meet at Berkeley last Saturday.

THE TOSSING twosome accounted for 13 of M-A's 16 points, a total that gave the Bears second place in what could be called Class A-2.

No one in the crowd of 2,000 at Edwards Stadium looked surprised as Berkeley rolled up a record 58 points to take the Class A-1 title. The Yellowjackets were in a division all their own. The next highest total was a meager 17½ by El Cerrito.

The buzzing Yellowjackets cleaned up in the dashes and hurdles. Cebron Russ was everything that the papers said he

would be. The tall tan terror ran away from Larry Guilford to take an easy win in the high hurdles.

It was the first defeat of the year for Santa Clara's Guilford. Dave Kilbourne of Cubberley, starting from undesirable eighth lane, placed fifth.

RUSS ADDED the broad jump and a second in the low hurdles to his list of honors before the day was over. Henry Allums of Berkeley won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and Fred DeWitt took the 440.

Allums completed a full day by combining with brother Nat Jackie Williams, and DeWitt to win the 880-yard relay.

Lone record of the day went to miler Keith Wallace of Piedmont. He chopped a second off the standard with a 4:26.5 timing. The old mark was set by Ron Larrieu of Palo Alto last year.

Class B honors went to Mira Monte High School. The Matadors one-man team, Dixon Farmer, accounted for all 18 points with wins in both hurdles and a fourth in the high jump.

PALO ALTO TIED with Fremont of Sunnyvale for fourth, each with 13 points. All of the Vike counters came in the 1320-yard run. John Northway threaded his way through a large field to win in 3:18.2. George Linn took second.

North Coast

Berkeley collected a record 58 points to capture the North Coast meet at Berkeley's Edwards Stadium yesterday. Alameda's great 1954 team had scored the previous high, 48.

Piedmont's Keith Wallace broke the mile record set by Palo Alto's Ron Larrieu last year by clocking 4:26.5 and Cebron Russ of Berkeley tied the :14.5 high hurdles record shared by Piedmont's Monte Upshaw and Alameda's Joe Griffin in 1954.

El Cerrito, runner-up to Berkeley, scored only 17½ points. Russ led Berkeley with first in the broad jump (23-7½) and second to Vallejo's Fred Fuller in the low hurdles.

Fred DeWitt of Berkeley defeated San Ramon's Bill McMillen in a :48.7 quarter mile.
