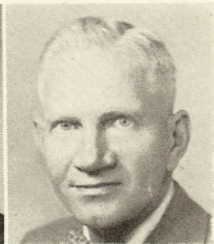

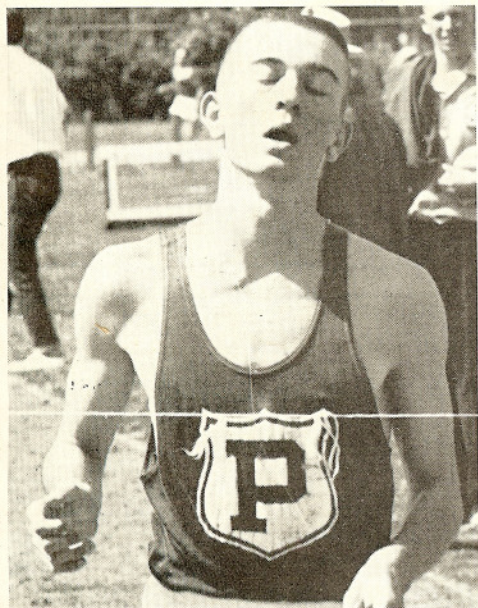

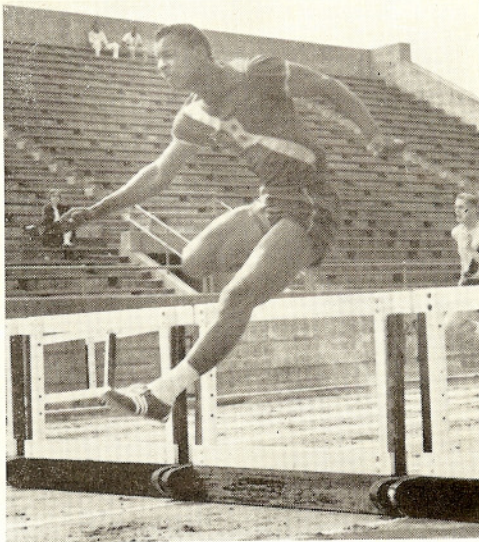

THE COMPETITION

Two vaulters, Helms of El Dorado (Placerville) and Breck of Santa Barbara, are both above the State Meet record with their best performances of the current season, Helms having hit the tough 14-foot mark. Jim Brewer of Phoenix High, the National record holder, boosted that mark to 15 feet ¹/₈ inch a few weeks ago, but will not affect the vaulters today save to inspire them to go higher. If anyone cracks the winning chances of these two, Hendrix of Riverdale, with a 13'7" mark, and Aguirre of Belmont (13'8³/₈"'), look like Helms' and Breck's toughest competition. Helms is the 1956 defending co-champion.
