

Track Crown

Riordan High School won its fifth straight championship by scoring 98½ points yesterday in the Catholic Athletic League track championships at Serra High School.

Four meet records were broken. Greatest improvement in a mark was recorded by Dominic O'Dominic of O'Dowd, who threw the discus 134-11, more than 17 feet beyond the old mark.
