way ran 10:48.8.

The time was considerably slower than the national record set three years ago by another Palo Alto team.

A Palo Alto B distance team won a second place. Members were Mike Lehner, Barry Evans, Grant Bennion and Steve Wheeler.

The next meet for Palo Alto is the Palo Alto district championship against Cubberley Wednesday at Hod Ray Field.

Poly Captures Final Race, Wins Relays

Poly captured the final event of the day, the 880 relay, to take a come-from-behind team victory in the ninth annual El Cerrito Relays yesterday.

The Poly quartet was clocked in 1:30.4 to edge Harry Ells and Richmond. The latter

had led in team scoring going into the final event, but the wind boosted Poly's total to 32 1/12, ahead of the Oilers' crush Jordan 30 1/12. Defending champ Berkeley was third at 25½. In the individual events,

Academic Athletic Association came up with several top marks. Jesse Searles of Poly bolstered his broad jump with a winning while Rich Briemle of Lincoln upset the field in the discus with a best-of-life throw of 137.3 %.
