Another Houston Win

It was the cross country season all over again as Al Lawrence and Houston captured top honors in the second annual North American three-mile team race postal competition sponsored by Track & Field News.

Lawrence lowered the meet record to 13:59.0, just edging teammate John Macy, 14:00. Last year's winner and record holder, Paul Henden of the Vancouver Olympic Club, also dipped under his former mark of 14:09.8 with 14:02, a new club division record. The frosh-junior college division mark

was cut to 14:34. 2 by Allen Carius of Kansas.

In the team competition Houston ran 71:59, far under Vancouver's 1959 winning time of 74:34.6. Pat Clohessy, 14:10; Barrie Almond, 14:19; and George Rankin, 15:31, completed the team. Again, VOC improved on its record, doing 73:46.0 for first place in the club division. Kansas won the Frosh-Junior College division with a record 75:41.4. And honorable mention goes to the Newton Track Club of Vancouver. This all high school team ran 78:46.0, headed by 16-year-old Vic McNeil who ran 15:18 as a sophomore.
