

Cunliffe Gallops 880 in 1:47.8

LOS ANGELES, April 30 (UPI)—Stanford's Ernie Cunliffe ran the Nation's second fastest half mile this year in 1:47.8 today just 40 minutes after he had won the mile in a double-dual track meet against Southern California and Occidental College.

Despite Cunliffe's performance, Stanford was beaten by USC, 82-48 and by Occidental, 68½-62½. Southern Cal did not compete against Occidental. The Trojans beat Oxy

earlier this year in a dual meet.

Cunliffe, America's chief middle distance hope in the Rome Olympic games, was never pressed in the 880-yard run. He ran the first 220 in 25.5 seconds, the 440 in 51.6 and had a final 220 of 29.6.

His time was just one-half second off his own national best mark of the year, but the chunky runner was not satisfied and said he would have done better had not the mile

race at Occidental's Patterson field been so tiring. He ran the mile only to win and was timed in 4:12.23, almost 12 seconds slower than his performance last week when he pushed Dryol Burleson of Oregon to 3:58.6 mile, fastest ever run by an American.

Cunliffe turned around and beckoned to teammate Norm Lloyd in the final 100 yards to spur Lloyd on to second place and was only a yard ahead of the other Stanford runner at

the tape.

Southern California's Jim Brewer pole-vaulted 15 feet ¼ inch for the best effort of his career. It was the first time he had cleared 15 feet since vaulting 15 ft., ⅛ in., as a Phoenix high school boy.

Dallas Long came out fourth best in the shot put on a long-distance-telephone basis against the other three of "the big four of shot putting" who were competing in the Drake relays. Long, of

USC, won easily here with a toss of 60 ft., 5¾ in., but Bill Nieder won at Des Moines with a throw of 63 ft., 11½ in.

Charlie Dumas, the Nation's second best high jumper, captured his specialty with a leap of 6 feet 11 inches. He tried to equal the jump of John Thomas in today's Penn Relays of 7 feet 1½ inch, but missed. He just brushed the bar on his second leap to indicate the rivalry with Thomas will be close.

Injuns Bow To USC, Oxy

LOS ANGELES, April 30. — (AP) — Stanford's running star, Ernie Cunliffe, grabbed the laurels from shotputter Dallas Long of Southern California as the two competed with their teams against Occidental in a double dual track and field event today.

For Cunliffe, it was a losing cause, however, as Stanford went down to defeat.

Both Southern California and Occidental—who were each competing with Stanford but not, technically, with each other—defeated the Indians.

25TH STRAIGHT

USC scored 82-48 and Occidental 68½ to Stanford's 62½. It was the Trojans' 25th straight and Occidentals' seventh straight victory over Stanford.

Sophomore Long, who has done 64 feet 6½ inches, could do only 60-5¾ in winning the shot and he trailed rivals Bill Nieder, Parry O'Brien and Dave Davis, who were competing in the Drake relays.

Cunliffe won the mile in 4:12.3 and 30 minutes later captured the 880 in 1:47.8.

Last week Cunliffe ran the mile in 4:00.4, but he was never seriously pressed this hot afternoon. His 880 was slower than his previous best of 1:47.3 and Cunliffe later said the mile took more out of him than some of his previous attempts in both races.

DUMAS FAILS

Charlie Dumas, the first man to break the seven-foot mark in the high jump, won

at 6-11. During the event it was announced that John Thomas had jumped 7-1½ in the Penn relays.

Dumas made three tries at the same height. He missed but was fairly close to skimming the bar on his third try.
