

Record Broken

Lincoln hurdler Herb Marshall broke one record and equalled another during the All-City prep track semifinals at Kezar Stadium yesterday.

A 130 division performer, he set a new mark when he covered the highs in :08.9 and tied the low standard of :13.7.

Dan Hawkins of Mission, also a Class B competitor, ran the 75 yard dash in :07.8 for another all time best.

All-City Track Meet

Poly Easy Victor Over S.I., Eagles

Poly, with one clutch performance after another, swept to nine first places and an unexpectedly easy win in a record-filled All-City track meet at Kezar Stadium yesterday.

The Parrots racked up 61 points to overwhelm St. Ignatius, second with 36 5/6. Washington, expected to press Poly for the varsity title, suffered as many let-downs as the Parrots did come-throughs and finished third with 35 5/6.

Lincoln won the 130-pound title, its first track crown in any division and Galileo took 120-pound laurels.

Nine records were broken or tied in all, but the one that seemed certain to go — the mile — was not among them. Ben Tucker of Poly, who ran under the mark in every dual meet, ran three brilliant laps but a stiff wind in the backstretch and a 74-second final quartet ruined his chances.

Varsity records fell in the 880, where St. Ignatius' Tony Ferrigno ran 1:59.0, and the discus, where Alex Darnes of Poly cracked his own mark for for the second time in a week with a 170-1 1/2 toss.

Ferrigno and Mike Gibeau of Lincoln, supposedly his chief challenger, battled shoulder to shoulder through a sizzling 54 second first lap. But it was too much for Gibeau.

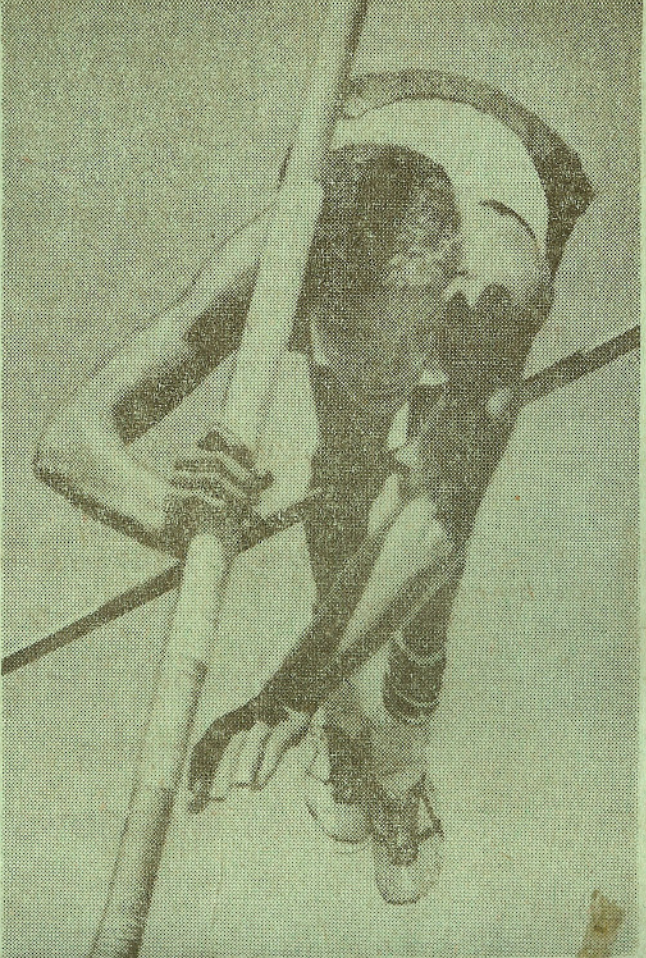

6th Straight Year

Poly Spikers Prevail Again

KEZAR STADIUM, May 21.—Poly's Parrots got double winning performances from hurdler Tom Piggee, weight man Alex Darnes and sprinter David Henderson as they captured their sixth straight All-City track and field meet this windy afternoon before 5,000 sun-splashed fans.

The champs, coached by Bob Braghetta, youngest head coach in town at 25, showed an abundance of speed and muscle to roll up 61 points. St. Ignatius was second at 36½, followed by Washington with 35½.

From a standpoint of record breaking performances, the big showdown was one of the best in the meet's 34-year history. Nine marks were broken, counting two that fell in the trials, and two others were equaled.

Accounting for new varsity standards were Darnes, with a 170-1½ discus throw; his pole-vaulting teammate, Bob Ely, who cleared 13-6½ in the qualifying round; and St. Ignatius' Tony Ferrigno, half-mile victor in 1:59.0.

Poly's busiest man was Piggee, who also took third in the broad jump and ran a leg of the second place relay for a total of 14 points—high for the afternoon. He won both hurdle tests last year, too.

A "too fast" first 440 (one minute even) and brisk breezes prevented Poly's Ben Tucker from besting the mile record of 4:28.6. Tucker, who has been flirting with 4:20 throughout the season, prevailed by 75 yards in a slow 4:30.9.

Ely showed real class in taking the pole vault at 13-6.

Lincoln took the 130 Division battle with 57½ digits and Galilee earned the 120 Division crown by tallying 32½.

Top lightweight was Al Raine, member of Mission's 130 squad, who put the shot 52-8¾ for a new high, and tied the 75 yard dash low of :07.8.

Mission Lightweight Sets Shotput Record

Mission's Alvin Raine set a new 130-pound AAA shotput record with a toss of 52-8 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches with a 10-pound ball in yesterday's windy All-City trials at Kezar Stadium.

RAINE'S mark eclipsed the former record of 52-5 $\frac{1}{2}$ set by Gene Noss of George Washington High last year.

No other city marks were broken, although Poly's 130-pound John Thomas broad-jumped 22-4, only a quarter-inch off the city mark.

STRONG winds greatly hampered the varsity performers, especially in the distance events.

Washington led varsity qualifiers with 17 going into tomorrow's semifinal round and four cinching berths in Saturday's finals.
