He turned in the fastest time ever recorded for a high schooler 3:04.9. This was unquestionably the outstanding individual performance of the day in one event, especially considering the fact that Angell Field has been a very slow track since it was plowed up three weeks ago.

## Cheatham Honored at Palo Alto 60

PALO ALTO-Jim Cheatham of Menlo-Atherton and the Los Altos distance medley relay quartet shared top honors in the second Palo Alto Easter Relays Wednes-day at Stanford's Angell day Field.

Cheatham won the outstanding individual's award by winning the broad jump at 22-ft., 9-in. and running on three winning Bear relay teams. Los Altos' foursome of Dave Boore, Ren Potter, Chris Miller and Robin Ruble garnered its trophy by running 10:25.6, fourth fastest time in his-

Cheatham barely edged Ruble for the individual presentation. While anchoring the Los Altos team, Ruble clocked 3:04.9, fastest 1320 ever for a high schooler.

Other good relay legs in-cluded Harry McCalla's 1:55.9 half-mile for Berkeley in sprint medley; Mike Chilton's 1:57.8 half-mile relay, Ben Tucker's 4:21 mile for S.F. Poly in distance medley and Tod 49.4 Ragsdale's quarter mile in mile relay.

Palo Alto's 8:02.5 two-mile relay clocking is the fastest recorded in the U.S. this year while the 13-ft., 3-in. vault tie by San Lorenzo's Ken Bowen and Burlingame's Lee Thompson is best in Northern California
