# Fontana, Compton Tie for CIF Title

In a team race that went right down to the concluding 880 relay, Fontana tied Compton for the championship in the wind-buffed CIF track finals yesterday in Long Beach Memorial Stadium.

Compton trailed, 13-12, going into the final event but Tarbabe anchor man Johnny Moore held off Fontana's John Lacey at the tape to throw the meet into a 17-17 tie.

The most surprising development was last year's State Meet winner, Long Beach Poly, failing to place a single entrant in next Saturday's State finals at Palo Alto. The first three finishers in each event qualified.

## CIF Record

A national interscholastic half-mile record didn't come off as Bonita's Ray Van Asten and Buena Park's Jan Underwood had to fight a tough headwind. But it was a thrilling race that saw Van Asten win in 1:53 flat, a CIF record.

Underwood led most of the way. But Van Asten jumped him on the final turn and proved too strong.

Riverside's Robert Bonds was the meet's only double victor. He took the high hurdles in 14.1 and the lows in 18.7. Two sophomores were winners.

## Thornton Out-Kicked

La Habra's Bruce Bess out-kicked Torrance's Mike Thornton in a 4:20.5 mile, while Glendale Hoover's Forrest Beaty upset Lacey in a 21.1 furlong.

Top marks afield were a 24ft. 5 3/4 in. broad jump by Compton's Walter Roberts and a 60ft. 8 1/4 in. shot-put by Gene Nettleton of Atascadero.

All results are unofficial until a photo review of the finishes, Tuesday.

One of the top marks of the day was turned in by Bee pole vaulter Mike Graves of El Cajon. Graves, just a junior, cleared 14ft. to break his own CIF record.

# Ulis Williams Sets Record in CIF 440

Compton's sensational Ulis Williams sped to a 47.7s. quarter-mile clocking and a new CIF record yesterday to highlight the CIF track and field semi-finals at Ramsaur Stadium.

His time was six-tenths of a second better than the old record of 48.3 seconds set by Steve Schwartz of St. Francis in 1958.

Running in Lane 1, Williams burned up the field with a sizzling 21.8s. first 220 and easily defeated Foothill League champ Nate Sims of Muir by 10 yd.

### Hopes Crushed

Long Beach Poly's CIF title hopes suffered a death blow when Steve Cortright failed to qualify in the 120 high hurdles. The Poly ace hit three hurdles and finished behind Walt Butler (Pasadena) and Jim Valmore (Leuzinger) in 14.2. Cortright ran 14 flat at Lakewood last week. Only four qualify in each event.

Poly's main competition, Compton, wasn't without its qualifying casualties as high hurdler Woody Prude and century man John Walker, who pulled a muscle 15 yd. from the finish of the 100, failed to qualify.

On the plus side for Long Beach, Willie Martin defeated Dave Archibald (Leuzinger) in a 48.9 quarter and Dave Schinnerer left the 880 field behind with a 1:56.2 clocking.

### Duel in Mile

A 23ft. 11in. broad jump by Compton's Walt Roberts and John Moore's upset victory of Forest Beaty in the 100 helped soothe the Tarbabes' wounds.

In a thrilling stretch duel, Gene Gurule of Artesia ran down Torrance's Mike Thornton in the mile. The little Artesia distance star made up 15 yd. on Thornton in the last lap. Both were timed in 4:23.3.
