CALIFORNIA'S FINEST PREP TRACKMEN COMPETE TODAY

California's finest track and field prep spike talent will converge on East Los Angeles College Stadium today for the 43rd annual State C.I.F. High School Track & Field championships. The State meet, always a "class affair," figures to be one of the best this year, with possibly six records destined to fall.

In order to avoid "doubling up" on lanes and to eliminate qualifying heats in the 440, 880, and mile, these races will each be run in two sections. In each section race, every runner will be timed by three watches and the placings computed on the basis of fastest times. This could help the record on slaughter, since no one figures to "run just to win."

East Los Angeles Stadium is a pretty fast track, if its periodic crosswinds do not crop up, and meet officials foresee the possibility of new State C.I.F. records in the 220, 440, 880, 180-yard low hurdles, shot put, discuss, and possibly the mile run.

Many of the top prep spikesters in the country are in the field of entries, which includes more than 250 standouts from the state's nine C.I.F. sections. Such greats as Forrest Beaty, Glendale Hoover sprinter; Ulis Williams, Compton quarter-miler; Bill Mackey, East Bakersfield low hurdler; Bill Pace, El Rancho (Whittier) shot-putter; and a flock of fine half-milers and milers are just the icing on the cake.

In the sprints, Beaty, whose 20.2 220 in last week's Southern Section finals broke the national interscholastic record of 20.6, set by Muir's Mel Clipper in 1958, faces defending State champ Bill Cowings of Fowler (9.7 and 20.9), who has been held back by a gridiron injury this spring; Ralph Turner (9.6 and 20.5) from Burroughs (Burbank); Sam Workman (9.7 and 21.2), from Taft;

and L. A. City champion Artur Brownlee (9.6 and 21.4) of Jefferson. Beaty's best in the 100 in 9.6.

Williams, who unfurled a fantastic 46.1 440 last week, is out to defend his 440 title against the boy who pressed him last year, Castlemont's Ray Saddler (47.7). Ulis shattered the national prep mark of 46.6, held by Dave Mills of Lakewood, O., as well as eclipsing the 46.5 of Ted Nelson (Andrews, Tex.), last month. Leuzinger's Dave Archibald (47.0), and Muir's Bruce Anderson (47.2) add to the calibre of this field and the State record of 46.7 should be broken.

Another "loaded" event is the 880 where 10 entries have run under 1:55. Top credentials belong to Orange's Bob Delaney (1:53.4), Van Nuys' Paul Turnquist (1:53.5), South Gate's Bill Sheue (1:53.7), and Jefferson's Oscar Forney (1:53.8), but this could be anybody's race. The State (and national) record of 1:51.9 was set by Bonita's Ray Van Asten in 1960, but a brisk first 440 pace will obliterate it.

The mile features Morgan Groth of Alhambra (Martinez), who clocked 4:14.4 in last week's North Coast finals; Bruce Bess of La Habra, winner of the Southern Section in 4:15.1; Culver City's Doug Calhoun and Torrance's Mike Thornton ran 4:13.8 and 4:15.2, respectively, earlier this year.

In addition, Santa Clara's Bert Stringer (4:18.1), Serra (San Mateo) ace Tom Tuite (4:17.8), and Santa Fe's Jim Peeso (4:18) have bettered 4:20.

Easily the favorite in the low hurdles will be Mackey, who placed fifth last year, but has bettered the State record of 18.8 numerous times, with his 18.4 being under the national mark, too. Seven others have run

In the highs, no one figures to approach the meet record-13.9-but Bunny Brown, San Bernardino and Abe Johnson, McClymonds, Oakland, have both run 14.2 and four others have done 14.3—Steve Holloway, Armijo; Gary Gaskill, Carlmont; Ron Stewart, Gardena; and James Tucker, Centennial.

Pace muscled the 12-lb. shot 65 ft. $2\frac{3}{4}$ in. last week for the best U. S. effort this season, but he'll be challenged by Don Castle of Cubberley, Palo Alto (64-3), El Segundo's Mike Bianco (63-11 $\frac{1}{2}$), and Grossmont's Ed Speed (61-6 $\frac{1}{4}$). The State record of 64-0 $\frac{3}{4}$ doesn't figure to hold up under the strain!

El Cajon's Mike Graves is the certain choice in the pole vault, his 14-3 $\frac{1}{2}$ mark almost five inches ahead of all the rest. Next in line are Steve Staus, San Gabriel, 13-10 $\frac{3}{4}$; Al Cirino, Arcadia, 13-10; and Vern Williams, San Pedro, 13-8 $\frac{3}{4}$.

As usual, the high jump is rated "wide open," though San Marino's Lew Hoyt has the best mark, 6-7 $\frac{1}{2}$. A raft

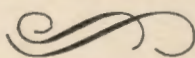

Another record almost sure to fall is the discus, in which Los Altos' Bob Stoeker (186-11) is far ahead of the mark of 178-8, set by Alex Darnes of SF Poly. Two other North Coast entries, could also menace the present record.

The 4-man 880-yard relay record is 1:25.9 and that one could be broken by the time Centennial (1:26.1) gets through.

Also scheduled are special relay races—the four-man mile, eight-man mile, class B four-man 660, and class C four-man 440.
