VARSITY TENNIS PROSPECTS

Larry Brooks once again heads up Oregon's tennis for finishing second in the Far West singles championship for the second consecutive year.

Brooks posted a 12-4 dual match record for the Webfoots, playing the number one singles position. He is joined on the roster by senior Don Semel, number three singles last year, and junior John Ehrhart, who handled the fourth singles position for the Webfoots.

Brooks has a very steady performance, posting a 12-4 record for the dual matches. Semel compiled an 11-5 dual match record and advanced to the quarterfinals in singles play at the tournament.

Three veterans will form the backbone of Coach Dick Williams' 1963 squad and will be blended with a group of promising newcomers.

Dick Stark (7-2) and Mike Brundage shared the number one singles spot on the freshman team a year ago with Brundage holding down that position whenever available.

Brundage, a highly-regarded quarterback prospect, divided his time between spring football practice and tennis last year and may do the same again this season.

Other sophomores who figure to bid for varsity berths are win Leagon, undefeated in nine frame matches last spring; Al Trexler (3-4); and Dick Courreges, who lost his first match and reeled off eight straight wins.

Another newcomer is James Lee, a transfer from Monterey Junior College.

DICK WILLIAMS TENNIS COACH

Dick Williams, starting his seventh season as Webfoot tennis coach, has parlayed his own net prowess and unlimited enthusiasm into a winner. The Duck men's coach rose from scratch seven seasons ago and culminated his resurgence of Oregon tennis last year, posting a 12-7 dual match record over the past two seasons.

Williams is a stranger neither to tennis nor to the University of Oregon. He came to Oregon from Hollywood, California, as a member of the Webfoot varsity net team during the 1940s.

The Oregon tennis coach served as the director of the Erb Memorial Student Union, but that position did not enter into his business in Eugene, and now is director of Development for the University.

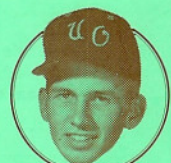

Watch These Webfoots

MEL RENFRO, hurdles-broad jump—Renfro vaulted into track performance at last year's NCAA meet when he grabbed a second place finish in the 120-yard high hurdles with a 13.8 clocking and soared to third place in the broad jump with a leap of 25 feet 11¼ inches. Both were all-time bests for the amazing Renfro, who does his best under pressure. An All-American in both football and track, Renfro appears headed for even better efforts this spring.

KEITH FORMAN, distances—Forman finished fourth in the NCAA meet in the mile a year ago, competed in the Russian-American meet and sped to a 3:58.3 clocking to rank as one of the nation's top milers. He again figures to be among the country's leading collegians in this event and also gives the Webfoots solid support in the two-mile, where he has been timed in 8:55.9.

DAVE STEEN, shot put—Steen ranks as the finest shot putter in Oregon history. He holds the official school record of 58 feet 7¼ inches and was credited with a toss of 61 feet 5½ inches in the Oregon Invitational Indoor meet this winter. Steen was fifth in the NCAA meet last spring and should move up in the placings this year.

TERRY LLEWELLYN, high jump—Llewellyn boasts a best effort of 6-9 in the high jump despite standing only 5-7 in height. He was extremely consistent at 6-6 or better last spring and climaxed the season by tying for second in the NCAA meet.

LES TIPTON, javelin—Tipton placed fifth in the NCAA meet and upset collegiate champion Jan Sikorsky of USC in the Oregon-Trojan dual meet, proving he's a solid performer in clutch situations. His throw of 238-4½ against USC was his best mark of the year. Tipton may also be used in the high hurdles this season.

CAL DEAN, center field—Dean earned all-Northern Division rating last year as a sophomore, hitting .312 for the entire season and doing a tremendous defensive job in center field. He has an exceptional eye at the plate, good speed and a strong arm. Dean suffered a severe ankle injury last summer, but appears to have recovered and should be ready to go this spring.

ROBBIE SNOW, pitcher—Snow led the Webfoot pitching staff in earned run average last season with a 1.35 mark while posting a 4-1 record. He closed out the season with a four-hit shutout win over Oregon State and looms as the key man on the Oregon mound staff this spring.

SANDY NOSLER, first base—Nosler led the team at the plate last year, compiling a .330 average for the entire season. He rates as a top-notch defensive performer and his fielding skill and experience should help anchor the youthful Oregon infield. Nosler also performs for Coach Steve Belko's basketball team.

LARRY BROOKS, tennis—Brooks figures to make a serious bid for the Far West singles championships after finishing as the runner-up as both a sophomore and junior. He will be playing his third consecutive season as Oregon's number one singles performer.

JOHN HEDLUND, golf—Hedlund comes to the Webfoot varsity with impressive credentials after holding down the top spot on the freshman team a year ago. Among his accomplishments last summer were winning medalist honors in the Oregon Amateur and sharing medalist honors in the Pacific Northwest Amateur.

BILL BOWERMAN, VARSITY TRACK COACH

Bill Bowerman, one of the nation's leading track coaches, joined the Oregon staff in 1948 and is now in his fifteenth successful season as the Webfoot coach.

During his career at Oregon Bowerman has developed the Duck squad into a powerful unit which has dominated Northern Division competition and produced outstanding individual competitors in sectional, national and international meets.

Bowerman has produced 15 NCAA individual winners, 17 champions in the PCC and 74 in the Northern Division championship competition. In six of the last 10 years his Ducks have finished in the top 10 in NCAA competition, climaxing this climb to national prominence by capturing the national collegiate title in 1962.

The Webfoot track coach is chairman of the NCAA track and field rules committee, past president of the NCAA track and field coaches association, and was assistant coach of the 1959 United States Pan American track and field team. His recent experiments in the development of rubberized asphalt runways and improved lighter track shoes, have attracted national attention. In 1955-56 he conducted clinics in Pakistan under the auspices of the State Department.

He is a firm believer in interesting large groups in track and field and still supervises the intramural track program he organized at Oregon in 1949, as well as a state-wide summer program for competitors of high school age and under.

He began his coaching career in 1935 at Franklin high school in Portland and a year later went to Medford. In the next nine seasons his track teams won eight Hayward Relays and three state titles.

In addition to fine track teams, Medford also had one of the state's better football teams under Bowerman. In seven years his grid clubs won 64 games, lost eight and tied three. This record included three state titles and three undefeated teams.

Bowerman is an Oregon graduate, earning his degree in 1935. He participated in football as an end and halfback and in track as a quarter-miler for the late Col. Bill Hayward.

During World War II he served four years with the 10th Mountain Division and was discharged as a major. He is married and the father of three sons.

Varsity Track Prospects

Oregon's mighty track and field team, defending NCAA champion, is posed with the age-old problem facing any champion when it swings into action.

The problem is easily defined. Maintain that top national ranking against the determined challenge of a half-a-dozen top-flight collegiate teams.

It's never easy to stay at the top of the heap and Oregon's hopes of successfully defending the NCAA title have been dealt several staggering blows.

Gone are Jerry "Tiger" Tarr, NCAA high hurdle and 440-yard intermediate hurdle champion, and Dyrrol Burleson, three-time national collegiate mile champ and NCAA meet record holder. Coach Bill Bowerman expected these two standouts to depart, losing them by the natural route of graduation.

Also missing, however, is sprint ace Harry Jerome. He was expected back to compete as a senior, but a ripped leg muscle, which required surgery, has forced Jerome to the sidelines this spring and possibly forever.

Jerome is co-holder of the world record in both the 100 yard and 100 meter dashes, won the 220-yard dash and finished second in the century at the NCAA meet and was a cinch double winner in any Oregon dual meet.

Add up the points Tarr, Jerome and Burleson contributed to the Oregon cause in the NCAA meet and it comes to 48. That's over half of the 85 the entire Webfoot contingent managed.

Even with these losses, however, the Webfoots are strong. Possibly strong enough to repeat as NCAA champions. Bowerman counts seven point getters from last year's national meet on the roster, including the great Mel Renfro.

Renfro, an All-American halfback in football and a prime candidate for the Heisman Trophy this fall, grabbed second place in the high hurdles with a 13.8 clocking and earned third place in the broad jump with a leap of 25 feet 11 1/4 inches.

He's a genuine two-sport All-American and few, if any, athletes in the country can claim the same credentials.

Oregon's other returning place winners are Keith Forman, fourth in the mile; Terry Llewellyn, tied for second in the high jump; Mike Lehner and Clayton Steinke, third and fourth respectively in the steeplechase; Dave Steen, fifth in the shot put; and Les Tipton, fifth in the javelin.

This group is joined by lettermen Ted Abram and Archie San Romani in the middle distances, Barry Adams and Vic Reeve in the distances; Jerry Larsen in the shot put, and javelin tossers John Burns, Ron Gomez and Garry Reddaway to give the Ducks a solid nucleus of veterans.

Top-rated newcomers are half-miler Ray Van Asten, named junior college athlete of the year by Track and Field News, pole vaulters Gerry Moro and Bob Watson and quarter-miler Bob Bruce.

A detailed evaluation of each event follows:

SPRINTS—The unexpected loss of Jerome leaves the Ducks without an experienced sprinter. Top prospect is sophomore Dave Blunt (9.7-21.5). He's joined by sophomores Dick Fyock and Dave Crowe, both up from last year's freshman team, and sophomore Homer Hope, transfer from Yuba Junior College.

440—The Webfoots could surprise in this event, perennially a trouble spot. Junior letterman Ted Abram, better known as a half-miler, is the only experienced performer available, but sophomore Al O'Leary (49.9), junior college flash Ray Van Asten, and junior Bob Bruce, who ran under 47 seconds around one turn at Hancock JC, could make the Webfoots a threat at this distance.

880—Oregon presents an exceptionally strong lineup here with

Van Asten (1:48.6), Abram (1:50.1), junior letterman Archie San Romani (1:49.5) and senior Lewis Powell in tow. Van Asten should be one of the nation's top performers in this event after a sensational season at Mt. San Antonio JC.

MILE—Despite the loss of Dyrrol Burleson, the nation's top collegiate miler for three years, the Webfoots are powerful in the mile. Keith Forman (3:58.3), finished fourth in the NCAA meet last spring, and once again rates as one of the nation's leading collegiate performers. San Romani (4:03.1), defending Far West champion, senior Vic Reeve (4:02.9), Clayton Steinke (4:10.7), and Barry Adams (4:15.9) provide experienced and capable support. Sophomore Dan Tonn (4:20.7) adds fresh talent to this imposing cast of milers.

TWO-MILE—Virtually the same group that handles mile duties will be used in the longer two and three mile events. Forman (8:55.9) was the Far West three-mile champ and wee Mike Lehner (9:01.6) captured the Far West steeplechase crown last spring. Lehner and Clayton Steinke (9:09.9) finished third and fourth respectively in the steeplechase at the NCAA meet. Reeve (8:47.1), Adams (9:46) and Tonn (9:38.4) provide even more depth in the distance runs.

HIGH HURDLES—Jerry Tarr's loss will be felt, but the incomparable Renfro (13.8) could be the best collegiate hurdler in the nation. Only Tarr defeated the great Duck athlete in the NCAA meet. Les Tipton, better known for his javelin efforts, may also be called up here, along with sophomores Vernon Fox (15.0) and Stan Shepardon.

INTERMEDIATE HURDLES—The substitution of the 330-yard intermediate hurdles for the 220-yard lows in dual meet competition may cause some established hurdlers concern. The Ducks are relatively inexperienced here with Bruce Carrington, a non-letterman junior, Fox and Carrington expected to carry the load.

SHOT PUT—A strong event for the Ducks. Dave Steen (58-7 $\frac{3}{4}$), fifth in the NCAA and Far West champ, returns along with veteran Jerry Larsen (53-6). Also on hand is Dick Brown, a standout as a freshman, who is ready to go after returning from the U. S. Naval Academy.

DISCUS—The Ducks need some help here with the loss of steady Jerry Stubblefield to be keenly felt. Steen is an adequate performer here with a best of 167-5 $\frac{1}{2}$, but beyond him there doesn't appear to be anyone else.

BROAD JUMP—Renfro (25-11 $\frac{3}{4}$) is the Webfoot hope in this event. The magnificent Duck was Far West champ and third in the NCAA meet as a sophomore and figures to improve. His assistance comes from sophomore Ron Stassens. Renfro and Stassens will also be used in the hop, step and jump.

HIGH JUMP—Terry Llewellyn (6-9), who jumped 14 inches over his body height last spring, and transfer Paul Stuber (6-11) head up this event for the Webfoots. Llewellyn tied for second in the NCAA meet a year ago and was consistently over 6-6. Javelin tosser John Burns (6-3) also steps in here occasionally and will aid Llewellyn along with sophomore John Jost.

POLE VAULT—The Webfoots could have their best group of pole vaulters in many years. Letterman Marty Frank (14-8) should be more consistent this year. He could easily be passed, however, by sophomores Gerry Moro (14-9) and Bob Watson. Moro cleared 15 feet in an informal meet on his fourth jump last spring.

JAVELIN—Oregon's strongest field event with four capable lettermen and a promising sophomore on hand. Tipton (238-4 $\frac{1}{2}$) was fifth in the NCAA meet and Burns (236-11) was extremely consistent. Left-hander Ron Gomez had one throw of 244-1, while Gary Reddaway tossed the spear 221-2 $\frac{3}{4}$. Sophomore Mike Hodges moves into this classy company with a 206-9 effort his best performance with the freshmen.
