IN PREP practice duels this week, former Serra High standout Jim McNutt set a new San Carlos High record when he blazed the mile in 4:27.9 in a 67-46 win over San Mateo's Bearcats.

Messer Runs 880 in 1:56.8

A "Man and the Challenge" type experiment by Woodside High track Coach Joe Greggans and junior distance ace Teall Messer paid off yesterday.

Messer, appearing in late-season form, clocked 1:56.8 in the half-mile run for the high light of area nonleague prep track action. Woodside slipped by Mid-Peninsula League power Aragon 58-55 in San Mateo.

Messer's mark equaled the best in Northern California this season.

MPL aspirant Hillsdale had better luck, racking up 73 points to Sequoia's 37½ and St. Francis' 27½ to win a triangular battle at Hillsdale. Serra opened its Catholic Athletic League season on a sour note, losing to Riordan 60-53 in San Francisco.

Bellarmino scored 65 points to Alameda's 37 and host San Leandro's 38 to win its triangular also.

Realization that Messer was capable of holding his own with touted teammate Brian Hea or most any other half-miler in the area sent Greggans and his charge to the drawing board last week after Teall had beaten Brian with a 2:00.8 effort.

Result was a Friday workout in which Messer had approximate 38.0 and 1:25.0 clockings in the 330 and 660 in an intra-squad meet after rain had cancelled Woodside's bout with Cubberley.

Messer then figured he'd break the "two-minute barrier" soon by attempting a 56.0 first lap and try for 60 seconds in the final lap.

Yesterday his rough splits were 55.0 and 61.8, according to Greggans, and the 1:56.8 was the fastest of Teall's life by four seconds.

Ralph Likens' 4:28.0 mile for Hillsdale and a 12-6 pole vault effort by St. Francis' Pat Butler were the day's other top efforts.

HIGH LIGHTS: Sequoia Coach Al Smith felt his team "did a fine job" considering the many problems confronting it.
