

Scots Repeat As SPAL Champs

Several years ago, Carlmont High school was known as the door mat of the league.

Today, the trend has reversed and the Highlanders are feared in almost every athletic endeavor.

The Carlmont track and field team of coach Loren Lansberry proved its worth yesterday by sweeping to the 1963 South Peninsula Athletic league track championship under hazy skies at Stanford University's Angell field. It was their second straight SPAL Championship.

The Scots tallied 50½ points, compared to runner-up Cubberly's 46½ and Ravenswood's 40½. Carlmont had the title nailed down by the time the teams got down to the last event—the 880 relay. Cubberly grabbed that event but it wasn't enough to pull them up to the leaders who weren't even entered.

Andy Sears led the way for Carlmont, scoring victories in the 100 and 220 yard dashes. Sears blazed the 100 in 10 flat and came back to win the 220 in 21.9.

Highlight of the afternoon was the pole vault event in which Cubberly's Jim Eshelman soared over the cross bar at 14-1, a new meet record and one of the best prep vault marks posted in Northern California this year. The old SPAL meet mark was 13-7½.

San Carlos' Jim McNutt grabbed the mile event as expected, traversing the four-lap route in 4:26.7 — three seconds slower than his all time best. Also prevailed, barely beating Ravenswood, 52-50. Woodside was third with 42 points.

Woodside's Brian Hea and Menlo-Atherton's Greg Druehl both turned in record-breaking performances. Druehl broke the 70-yard high hurdle mark with a 9.1 clocking, while Hea stopped the block at 1:22.8 in the 660. He also set a new record in the 150 yard dash with a run of 15.0.

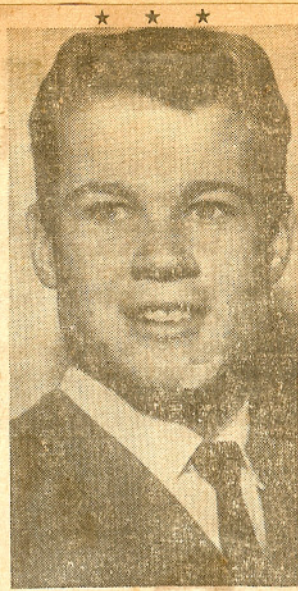

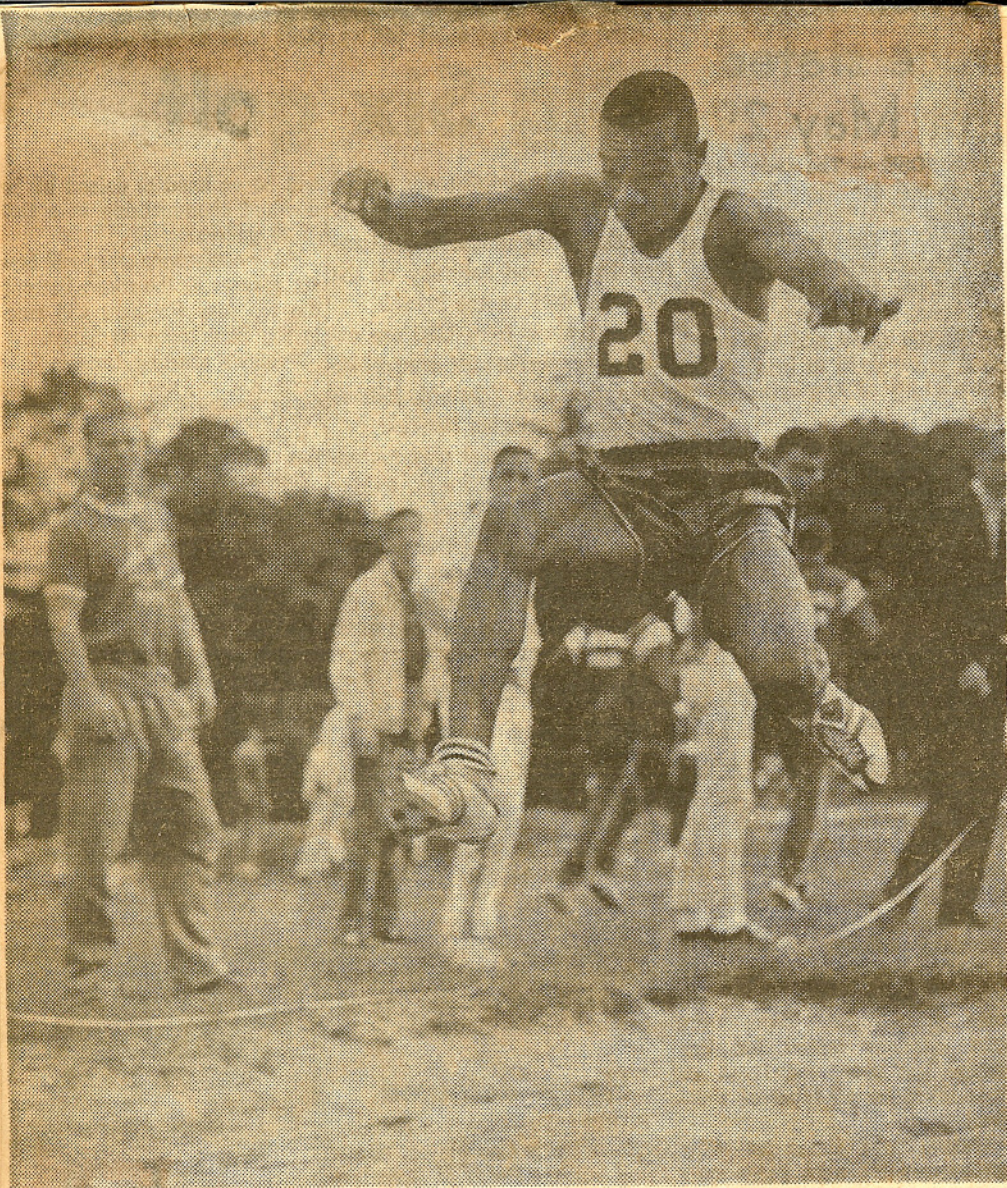

In the class B low hurdles another record was set as Ravenswood's Dwight Turner posted a 13.6 mark, one-tenth of a second better than the old mark. Turner also set a new mark in the B high jump when he leaped over the bar at an even six foot. Old mark was 5-10.

San Carlos and Cubberly tied for the Class C championship at 38 points each. The Don C's were led by Jim Leitner, Terry Evans, John Lilly and Bob Turner, who set a new meet record in the C 440 relay of 46.8.

Carlmont wins SPAL track title

Eshelman vaults 14-1

Jim Eshelman of Cubberley shattered the old South Peninsula Athletic League pole vault record with a vault of 14-1, but the Cougars still lost the SPAL team track title to Carlmont at Angell Field before an estimated attendance of 500 Monday afternoon.

Coach Loren Lansberry's Scots, SPAL champions for the second straight year, edged out Cubberley, 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ -46 $\frac{1}{2}$. Ravenswood, which picked up almost 30 points in the broad jump and hurdles alone, nabbed third place with 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ points.

CARLMONT WINS B's

Carlmont also won the class B team title with an upset victory over favored Ravenswood in the relay. In Class C competition, Cubberley took 14 of a possible 19 points in the shot-put to tie San Carlos at 38 points apiece.

Eshelman had comparatively little trouble in setting his new mark. Jim made five of his first seven vault attempts and soared over 14-1 on his first try.

Jim's vault did more than just break Palo Alto George Bardsley's old SPAL mark of 13-7 $\frac{3}{4}$ set

last year. He also topped by one-half inch the seven-year-old record for an area athlete. That was 14-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ set by Sequoia's Jim Matjeka at the El Cerrito Relays back in 1956.

MISSES AT 14-3

After clearing 14-1, Eshelman "rested" by running in the 180-yard low hurdles, where he placed second. He then returned to the pole vault to attempt 14-3, but he failed on all three tries.

Sprinter Andy Sears and juniors Dave Galbreath and Tom Grimm were largely responsible for Carlmont's win. Sears placed first in the 100 and 220 with times of 10.0 and 21.9. Galbreath and Grimm accounted for 13 of the Scots' 52 points with a stunning 1-2 in the discus.

Although no other varsity records were set, the following athletes performed magnificently:

- Frank Williams of Ravenswood in the high hurdles. He upset the dope-sheet by beating out Cubberley's Steve Schneider and Russ Smith in a good time of 15 $\frac{1}{4}$.

- Woodside's Bob Potter in the shot-put. Bob, a junior, threw 51-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ to top heavily favored Jeff

Edwards of Palo Alto by half a foot.

- Broad-jumper Elton Harrison of Ravenswood. Elton lead an excellent closely bunched field with a leap of 22-9 $\frac{1}{2}$. The first five broad-jumpers each bettered 22.4 Elton was also the top individual point-maker of the meet. He added a second in the 100 and a first in the low hurdles to account for 21 points by himself.

- Don Hoyt of Cubberley in the mile. Don was sick last Tuesday and did not compete in the trials. He was allowed in the finals under a "hardship clause" by all eight SPAL coaches, and he responded with a second-place 4:31.1 clocking. This bettered Don's previous best by more than seven seconds.

- Sequoia's Bill Johnson in the 440 and 220. He ran an excellent 50.1 to win the quarter-mile and placed second behind Sears in the 220.

Unlike the varsity competition, 11 meet records were tied or broken in the Class B and C events. Woodside's Brian Hea, Ravenswood's Bobby Washington, and Cubberley's Vic Weckiewicz set three of the most impressive records.

Hea lowered his own SPAL record in the 660 to 1:22.8 and is a good bet to win at the North Coast Section meet at Pittsburg on May 25.

Washington's broad jump of 22-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ obliterated the former record, set by him last week by more than a foot and a half.

Before that happens, though, Cubberley and Carlmont will decide the 1963 SPAL dual meet title in South Palo Alto Wednesday afternoon at 3:15. The Cougars will attempt to end Carlmont's streak of 34 consecutive dual meet victories.
