# Cubberly, Carlmont spikers win

Carlmont and Cubberley High School each leaped the last hurdle Thursday before their big meet next Friday that will decide the South Peninsula Athletic League dual meet championship.

Cubberley rubbed out Menlo-Atherton 71-41 and Carlmont had more trouble than expected in beating Woodside 65-48.

The heralded half-mile race between Jack Sandin of Carlmont and Teall Messer of Woodside never happened. Woodside coach Joe Greggans thought he would have a better chance of winning the meet by putting

Messer in the mile in a bid for first place.

But Greggans, Messer and Woodside lost out all around as Mike McCann of Carlmont won the mile by 20 yards in 4:31.8. Messer was second.

That left Sands to an easy win in the half mile and that's exactly what he did. He won by 15 yards with his nearest rival teammate Ken Nickols. Sandin's time was 1:58.4, a superb effort considering the cold and wind and lack of competition.

Carlmont coach Loren Lansberry expected to win by a

wider margin but had several runners out with illness.

Andy Sears was the big point winner for the Scots. He won the 100 and 220, anchored the winning Carlmont relay team and took a third place in the board jump.

Woodside scored easy wins in both the Class B and C meets. The best performer for the Wildcats in the B meet was English-born Mike Platz who won the 660-yard run in 1:28.9. That's two seconds faster than he ever has run the distance before.

Cubberley swept the first two events—the high hurdles and

half mile—to open up a quick 18-0 lead over Menlo-Atherton.

The times and distances in almost all events were poor because of bad weather. Claibon Mallet of M-A, Jack Chambers of M-A, and Jim Eshelman of Cubberley were double winners.

Mallet won the 100 and the 440 and Eshelman took the low hurdles and the pole vault. He cleared 13-0 in the vault which was very good considering the wind.

# Woodside spikers tie with Palo Alto

Junior Brian Hea of Woodside High School ran a sparkling anchor lap in the 880 yard varsity relay Friday to enable the Wildcats to tie Palo Alto in the feature South Peninsula Athletic League track meet, 56½-56½, at Woodside.

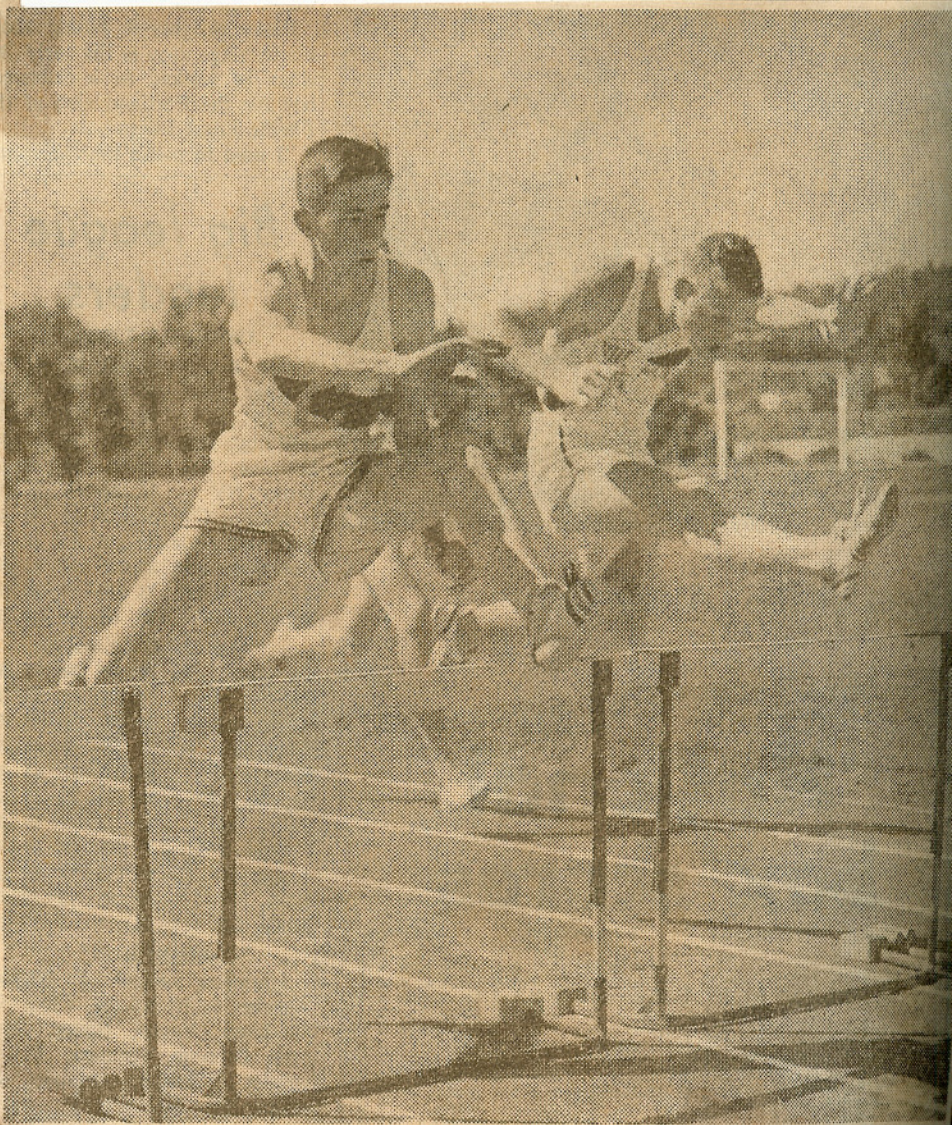
