

Jacobs Wins 880 In NCS II Track

While the best that a local team could do in the North Coast Section II track finals was a sixth by Burlingame, the top five placers in each event in the affair head for Leigh High of San Jose Saturday for the North Coast Finals.

Led by Mike Jacobs and John Friedman, the Panthers managed 14 team points behind such stalwarts as Sunnyvale, Wilcox, Carlmont and Los Altos. Wilcox and Sunnyvale tied for the title with 26 apiece to dominate the day's activities.

Hillsdale finished ninth with 11½, San Mateo and Capuchino finished in a tie for 26th with two points apiece.

Outstanding in the losing MPL cause were Mike Hickey of Hillsdale in the discus with a best-of-life toss of 173-6½ for a second place and Jacobs of Burlingame with a first in the 880 in a time of 1:59.5.

ONE OF THE real surprises of the windy day at Jefferson High School in Daly City was the showing of Hillsdale's Steve Kelly who managed a

tie for first with heralded Max Lowe of Awalt in the high jump. Both boys cleared 6-0 to tie for first.

San Mateo got a fifth from both Art Abernathy in the broad jump at 22-3½ and Paul Natusch in the discus with a toss of 159-10½.

Another relative surprise was the showing of Burlingame's relay team which finished third behind strong Carlmont and winner Sunnyvale.

Carlmont with six placers led the teams in men heading for Leigh Saturday.

Burlingame's Jacobs won the 880 in 1:59.5, while Friedman was third in the pole vault at 13-0, just ahead of Capuchino's Renfro, 12-6.

In Class B results, Burlingame's Mark Doswell won the 1320 in 3:16.5, with Hazard of Cap in third place.

San Mateo's Kacludis was third in the 75, Cap's Hawkins third in the high jump, followed by San Mateo's Tom Ichimaru; San Mateo's one man gang, Joe Caines, took a second in broad jump at 21-7½.

Pacific Grove's amazing sophomore, Johnny Johnson, broad-jumped 24-5 $\frac{1}{2}$, but was beaten by John Figueroa of Sunnyvale in both sprints in highlights of yesterday's North coast Section II track meet at Jefferson.

The North Coast III meet, scheduled for Petaluma, was rained out and will be made up Tuesday at Santa Rosa JC.

Figueroa steals track show; NCS finals on tap Saturday

DALY CITY — North Santa Clara Valley and South Peninsula Athletic League runners, jumpers and weightmen dominated the North Coast Section II track meet here Saturday and probably will do the same in the NCS finals at Leigh High School in San Jose Saturday.

Two N-SCVAL teams — Sunnyvale and Wilcox — tied for the team crown with 26 points each. Carlmont of the SPAL was third with 24 points.

The individual stars were nu-

merous but the brightest probably was Sunnyvale's John Figueroa.

He whizzed to wins in the 100 and 220 yard dashes and came from two yards back in the anchor leg of the 880-yard relay to get Sunnyvale the gold medal in that race too.

STRONG WIND

Figueroa's times were 9.6 and 21.3. The 100 time can not be accepted as a record because of gale winds that swept the Jefferson High School track and helped the runners.

However, the 220 mark was valid. It was run around a turn and Figueroa was running into the wind half the distance.

The only other allowable record of the day in the varsity division was a 24-5½ broad jump by sophomore Johnny Johnson of Pacific Grove.

Johnson also took a pair of seconds as he beat everyone except Figueroa in the dashes.

Both hurdles records were better but the times won't count because of the wind.

BLANKET FINISH

Swift little Simon Rapanut of Wilcox won the lows in 19.1. He was superb in form and was adequate in speed too.

Tom Gibbons of Campbell won the highs in 14.6. He whipped Dick Dwiggins of Woodside and Steve Boice of Los Altos in a blanket finish.

That was the closest thing to an upset all day. Mike Ryan of Wilcox and Ed Ortegon both posted easy wins in the distance races.

The best individual battle of

the day came in the quarter-mile where Overfelt's Lee Evans held off Claibon Mallet of Menlo-Atherton to win in 49.3. Mallet was timed in 49.7 — a personal best.

FAVORITES WIN

The weight events went, as expected, to Bob Brannan of Los Gatos (63-1¼ in the shot) and Chuck Smart (180-9 in the discus).

Big Burton Marks of Leigh, expected to challenge in both events, was ineligible and did not compete.

Max Lowe of Awalt, who has cleared 6-9½ in the high jump this season, had a perfect record up to six feet Saturday.

That was as far as the event went before all but five competitors were eliminated. High winds made it senseless to try for a higher height.

One place in the NCS finals still is in doubt. Andy Sears, Carlmont's 100-yard dash man, will get a chance to win a place in a special match race with Burt Warden of M-A on Tuesday.

QUALIFIERS

Sears was unable to run Saturday because of injury. He was voted a chance in the runoff by a committee of coaches.

The North SCVAL had the most qualifiers—23. Then came the SPAL with 14. The Midpeninsula was next with nine and the Mission Trail League had 7. The West SCVAL and Monterey Bay League each had five, the Mount Hamilton League four, and the north Peninsula three.

San Carlos edged Cubberley for the B title. The Cougars got a first place from Dave Locke in the broad jump.

Cupertino's Joe Houghton set a meet record by whipping the discus 151-7½.

Dan MacGraw of M-A hurried through the 75-yard dash in a swift 7.7.

JOHN FIGUEROA

Figueroa has won more track titles than you can count. Last weekend he won the 100 and 220 crowns in the NCS II meet and also came from behind to win the relay for the Jets. That race

gave his school a tie for the team crown.

John is the fastest runner ever developed on the Peninsula. He has consistently run 9.6 and 9.7 this season in the 100 and once, with the aid of wind, ran the 100 in 9.5 and the 220 in a phenomenal 20.5

Figueroa is not a one-sport man. He was among the leading players in SCVAL football, finishing fifth in rushing with 625 yards gained and 6.8 per carry average, fourth in scoring with 10 TDs in eight games, and fifth in total offense.

He made the all-SCVAL de-

fensive team as a junior and the offensive team as a senior.

Figueroa also played on the championship varsity basketball team in 1963 and was a member of Class C and B teams that won titles.

His only loss in track this year was to Jim Hines of McClymonds in the El Cerrito Relays. Figueroa will get a chance for revenge in the state meet at Los Angeles next month.

Also in June one of the four athletes from Sunnyvale will be named the best in the school. He'll compete for the Times trophy with top seniors from 13 other high schools.
