Jacobs 'Best Bet' In Prep Spike Finals

Only two Mid Peninsula League athletes will be among the elite band of high schoolers who converge on the Los Angeles Coliseum June 5-6 for the state track and field finals.

Mike Hickey of Hillsdale and Mike Jacobs of Burlingame are the pair who will represent the North County in the annual classic which pits the north against the south.

BOTH LADS made the championship grade by taking seconds in the North Coast Section finals held at Leigh high school in San Jose over the weekend.

Hickey with a second in the discus and Jacobs with a second in the pole vault both recorded their individual best-of-life efforts to spring into the state finals.

Still recovering from a painful back injury suffered two weeks ago, Hickey managed a toss of 174-11 to cop second

behind the first place toss of 179-2.

Jacobs, rapidly developing into one of the best 880 men in the business, was timed in 1:55.0 for a second place.

The hard-training Panther half-miler looked very strong at the finish of the race, leading onlooking coaches to rate him the best prospect of all Northern California entries in the state 880.

The locker room talk was that Hillsdale's Hickey is ready to grab headlines in his specialty and probably be asked to the Golden West Invitational.

Winner of the day's activities was a strong Sunnyvale team which nailed down first place with a strong performance in the sprints from John Figueroa.

IN THE class B division, Aragon's John Wilson won the pole vault with a leap of 12-6 and Joe Caines, a multi-purpose bundle of ability, took first in the 120 low hurdles with a time of 13.4.

Mark Doswell of Burlingame managed the only other North County first of the day for the Bs with a timing of 3:12.5 in the 1320.

Pittsburg won the Class B title with a total of 26 markers as Don Pierce broke the sole record of the day in the Bs with a 6-2 leap in the high jump to break the old record held by San Mateo's Terry Llewellyn.

Aces Advance To State Meet

SAN JOSE — Only four South Peninsula Athletic League athletes won positions in the California State High School Track Championships at the North Coast Section meet here Saturday.

Palo Alto half-miler Dennis Milligan and pole vaulter Steve Weed and Carlmont miler Mike McCann and vaulter Dennis Phillips qualified by finishing fourth or higher in the meet at Leigh High School here.

Five meet records fell, four in field events as Sunnyvale High brought the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League its first NCS team championship in history. The Jets, led by John Figueroa's double sprint win, edged another SCVAL squad, Wilcox of Santa Clara, 19-16 for the title.

Pacific Grove sophomore Johnny Johnson tied for third place all by himself, scoring 13 points in the sprints and broad jump. He carded the nation's best prep broad jump of the season, 25-2 1/4, and earned fifth place on the all-time broad jump list in erasing the 10-year-old mark set by Monte Upshaw.

Outstanding performance by an SPAL entry was in the Class B division, where Menlo-Atherton's Dan McGraw won both the 75 and 150 yard dashes in times of 7.7 and 14.9.

With McGraw scoring all their 16 points, the Bears took third place behind Pittsburg (26) and Berkeley (19). Division II champion San Carlos, led by John Lilly, Terry Evans and the 440 relay team, placed fifth with 11 points.

HIGHLIGHTS: Other meet records were 63-9 in the shot by Bob Brannen of Los Gatos, 14-6 1/4 by Mike Robinson of Pacific in the pole vault, 6-7 in the high jump by Max Lowe of Awalt, and a standard-equaling 14.3 by Ricky Rogers of Ellis in the high hurdles.

The shot and pole vault erased records held by SPAL athletes.

Milligan was fourth in the 800 in 1:55.4, best time in history by an SPAL athlete. Mike McCann broke the Carlmont school record in the mile with a 4:19.5 effort; he also was fourth.

Mike McCann was in second place with about 60 yards to go in the mile, but ran out of gas. "I just don't have the speed at the finish," he complained later.

Weed vaulted 13-9 and Phillips 13-6 for second and third behind Robinson.

Highest finish by an SPAL varsity track entry was third in the two mile by Carlmont's Martin McCann, who ran 9:40.4. He won't get a trip to Los Angeles June 5-6, however, because there will be no two mile event at the State meet.

Carlmont's 880 yard relay team was given fifth place when Pittsburg was disqualified. The team is an alternate for the state meet and Coach Loren Lansberry indicated he would take the quartet to L.A.

Menlo-Atherton quartermiler Claiborn Mallett, Woodside hurdler Dick Dwiggins and Cubberley shot putter Burke Mitchell also took fifth places. Mallett was timed in 49.5, making him the second fastest 440 man in league history. Dwiggins set a school record of 14.7 in trials.

The day's best received race was the two mile, where Logan's Ed Ortegon dued Carlos Prieto of Jefferson in a fantastic last lap and beat him by a step in 9:26.8. This is the first year the event was included and so the time established a meet record.

Hickey and Jacobs in State Meet

Bay Area contributions to the State High School track meet next week in Los Angeles should be among the best in that competition, if Saturday's North Coast Section finals were any example of talent.

In an excellently-run meet that lived up to all expectations, six new records were established and another equalled in sensational qualifying competition that sent the first four finishers to the state finals at Los Angeles Coliseum June 5-6.

Included in that group were two Mid-Peninsula League athletes, Mike Hickey of Hillsdale and Mike Jacobs of Burlingame, who came through with the best performances of their respective careers.

Hickey, still recuperating from the back injury that threatened to end his competition entirely two weeks ago, hurled the discus 174 feet, 11 inches for a second place.

Jacobs, a Stanford-bound "A" student, whose tactical know-how and running headiness belies his age, finished second in the 880 with a best-of-life clocking of 1:55.0.

Carlmont High School also placed two men in the state meet, vaulter Dennis Phillips, who scaled 13-6 and Mike McCann, a fourth place finisher in the mile, along with a relay team that was named as an alternate.

Sunnyvale won the varsity team title off the sprint efforts of John Figueroa, who won the 100 in 10 flat and took the 220 in 21.6. He also moved Sunnyvale's relay team from fifth to third on a great anchor leg.

New Record

The outstanding performance of the meet came in the broad jump, where Pacific Grove's sensational sophomore, Johnny Johnson, leaped 25-2 1/4 for a new meet record and the fifth best mark in high school history. Johnson also finished third in the 220 and fourth in the 100 for all 13 of his team's points.

Three other meet records

were also set in field events. Bob Brannen hurled the shot 69-3; Mike Robinson of Pacific upped the pole vault standard to 14-6 1/4 and Awalt's Max Lowe won the high jump at 6-7 after narrowly missing three times 6-9.

On the track, Mike Ryan Wilcox posted the best clocking in the state for the mile with a 4:12.4 record effort that won by 20 yards and Rick Rogers of Ellis tied the high hurdles mark with a 14.3 victory.

The most competitive race of the afternoon was the two mile, which set a new record in being held for the first time. Ed Ortegon of Logan beat Carlos Prieto of Jefferson by less than two feet with a 9:26.8 performance. Prieto, whose previous best mark for the event two weeks earlier was 10:07, was caught by Ortegon in the last 100 yards and finished second in 9:27.

Pittsburg won the class B title with 26 points, and had the only record breaker among the lightweights in Don Pierce, who high jumped 6-2 to break a five-year old mark set by San Mateo's Terry Llewellyn.

Menlo-Atherton's Dan McGraw won both sprints for 16 points and a third in team scoring. Aragon's John Wilson won the pole vault at 12-6 and Joe Caines of San Mateo was an easy victor with a 13.4 clocking in the 120 low hurdles. Burlingame's Mark Doswell won the 1320 in 3:12.5.

Pittsburg Cops Crown

Bee Spikers Claim One New Standard

Although competition was heated in most of the events, lightweight athletes were able to account for only one meet record in the North Coast Section finals Saturday at Leigh High School.

Don Pierce, a Pittsburg High sophomore who has scaled 6-3, cleared 6-2 at Leigh to claim the only new standard. Second in the competition was Cupertino's Dennis McCullough who was one of three to get over 5-11. He claimed the runnerup spot on fewest misses. McCullough is only a freshman and has scaled 5-11 on many occasions.

Pittsburg won the team crown with 26 points and Berkeley was second with 19. This was a reversal of the varsity meet which found Sunnyvale and Wilcox giving the SCVAL and the west bay a one-two finish.

The SCVAL had one winner in the lightweights, Jim Good-

enough of Los Altos taking discus laurels with a toss of 143-1 to 140-3 for runnerup Joe Houghton of Cupertino.

Joe Orsua of Sunnyvale placed fifth with a lifetime best of 3:16.5 for the 1320 and Fremont's Steve Pensinger was fifth in the 70 yard high hurdles with a 9.4 clocking.

Cupertino's 10 points netted it a tie for sixth place with two other schools.
