Chico Panthers Roll to Victory in NSCIF Meet; One Mark Falls, One Tied

Thanks to the utmost cooperation of Mr. Weatherman, Northern California athletes put on a whale of a show at College Field Friday evening as favored Chico romped to victory in the varsity portion of North Section, California Interscholastic Federation, Track and Field Championships.

Ideal weather conditions prevailed as Chico rolled to 44 points to win the team title easily. Second place Orland had only 16 tallies, while Weed followed with 14.

Checking in behind the first four teams in the scoring department were:

Bishop Armstrong of Sacramento 10, Live Oak 9, Enterprise of Redding 9, Del Oro of Loomis 8, Yreka 8, Central Valley of Redding 8, Wheatland 7, Anderson 6.

Cofax 5, Lassen of Susanville 5, Portola 5, Red Bluff 5, Biggs 5, Fall River of McArthur 4, Mt. Shasta 3, Willows 2, Paradise 2, Corning 2, Modoc of Alturas 1, Trinity of Weaverville 1 and Greenville 1.

Despite the fact only one record was broken and one tied, most of the winners turned in times which exceeded their bests of the 1964 spring campaign. The meet was the finale for all those except the first place finishers who earned the right to compete in the state finals to be held in the Los Angeles Coliseum Friday and Saturday.

There were wins by favored competitors, surprises by some and despair for others.

The biggest mishap of the evening came when Herlong's Julius Dotson, favored to win the 40-yard run off his best of :49.6, fell 15 yards from the finish line while holding a five-yard lead. Dotson did not finish the race and missed out on a trip to the state meet as the event was won by Enterprise's Carl Lee, who ran his best race of the season at :51.3.

Chico and Orland produced the only double winners in varsity competition. As expected, defending sprint champ Bob Wallace won the century and furlong events in the times of :09.9 and :22.3, respectively. Wallace's time in the 100 equalled the meet record set in 1958 by Dick Lund and tied by Lund in 1959 and again in 1959 by Lassen's Joe Winchell.

Chico's Mike Borzage, one of the most improved thinclads in Northern California this spring, won the 120-yard high hurdles and 180-yard lows. Borzage turned in a :15.2 clocking to win the highs. The time was his best of the year.

Borzage came back to win the lows in :21.1 and equalled his best time of the season. In the low hurdles, Borzage was running stride for stride with teammate Doug Weaver when the latter hit a hurdle midway of the race and fell to the track.

Central Valley's John Silva suffered a slightly sprained ankle while warming up prior to competition in the pole vault but it didn't prevent him from coming up with one of the evening's finest performances.

Silva, who had won the Chico Invitational vault at College Field with a 13'2" effort, shattered the old North Section mark of 12'9 3/4" Friday evening with a 13'3 3/4" effort. Silva tried 13'5" three times, just barely missing at that height on his first two attempts. Weed's Dale Welch set the old mark in 1962.

Two of the more surprising winners were Portola's Gary Cole and Chico's Don Hall. Cole won the shot put event with a toss of 54'11 1/4" as favored Don Welch of Weed finished third behind Chico's Joe Triolo. Cole's effort was his best of the season and he lofted the iron ball 57' or better on two practice heaves.

Hall was picked for second place in the broad jump prior to the meet because Bishop Armstrong's Mike Monroe had won the Chico Invitational long jump at 22'8". Monroe was nursing a sore foot and could not match Hall's superb consistency. Hall moved Monroe into a second place finish with a leap of 22'3 3/4" — his best of the year. Hall had five jumps at better than 27' in meet competition.

Biggs' Dan Hagenbach won the high jump after a jumpoff with Chico's surprising Bob Lambert. At the conclusion of regular competition, both Hagenbach and Lambert were tied for first place with jumps of 6'. Since NSCIF rules prohibit a tie in section finals, a jump-off was necessitated because (Continued Page 12A, Col. 1)

CJHS's Jack Adee Wins Thrice in NSCIF JV Action; CHS Triumphs

A 14-year-old Chico Junior High School freshman Jack Adee by name—stole the show here Saturday night in the North Section, California Interscholastic Federation Junior Varsity Track and Field Championships.

Adee won three events and was the only multiple winner in the junior varsity division. Team honors went to Chico Senior High School as it edged Lassen (Susanville), 29-26 1/2.

Following the first and second place schools in order were: McCloud, 23; Chico Junior High School, 15; Shasta of Redding, 13; Del Oro of Loomis, 12; Pierce of Arbuckle, 9; Red Bluff, 7; Greenville, 7; Trinity of Weaverville, 6.

Anderson, 5; Modoc of Alturas, 5; Central Valley of Redding, 5; Dunsmuir, 3 1/2; Corning, 3; Durham, 3; Paradise, 3; Wheatland, 2; Enterprise of Redding, 1; Weed, 1; and Esports, 1.

All junior varsity marks recorded Saturday went into the books as records since this is the first year of official junior varsity competition in the North Section. In the past, teams have been classified A, B or C.

The new classification didn't seem to have any ill effects on the marks recorded in the competition. Adee turned in a :10.2 clocking in the 100-yard dash and leaped 21'4" in the broad jump to post two of the division's outstanding marks. Adee also won the 220-yard dash in :22.2.

Other outstanding performances were turned in by Martin

Robles (Lassen) in the 1,200-yard run, Jim Davis (Chico High School) in the 160-yard low hurdles and McCloud's Ted Nelson in the pole vault.

Robles and teammate Andy Gordon toured the 1,200-yard distance almost stride for stride until the former sprinted away to a 3:23.5 timing. Davis equalled his best time of the season in the hurdles as he was clocked in :18.4. Nelson bettered his own personal pole vault mark of 11'7" this season when he cleared the 12' mark.

Other winners included Bob Boone, McCloud (440-yard dash); Royal Miller, Chico (800-yard run); Perkins, Modoc (75-yard high hurdles); John Pryde, Shasta (shot put) and Don Chase, Anderson (high jump).

both competitors had missed the same number of times. After the bar had been lowered to 5'11", Hagenbuch won the event. Hagenbuch had cleared 6' in other competition, but the 5'8" Lambert had done just his height in previous meets.

Chico's Charlie Crabtree ended a brilliant Panther career by winning the 880-yard run in a fast 1:56.0. The time was Crabtree's best of the campaign and retained his unbeaten status. Yreka's Gene Bray finished second in 1:57.4 and will be back for a crack at the title next year as he is just a junior as is third place finisher John Roberts of Enterprise. Roberts was running his second competitive 880 as he played on the Hornet baseball team throughout most of the spring.

Bishop Armstrong's Daryl Haul was fourth in the 880 and Chico's Sam Simmons, a junior who ran 2:01.0, was fifth.

Weed's Lee Ferrero overcame Wheatland's Ron Fairman on the last lap and won the mile event in 4:34.4. Ferrero's previous best time of the season was 4:33.5, which he ran in the Chico Invitational.

Wallace capped an evening of fine performances when he ran the anchor leg for Orland's victorious relay team. Wallace was in fifth place when he got the baton, but made up 10 yards and won by six yards over second-place Del Oro. The time of 1:32.9 in the relay was the fastest in the North Section this spring.
