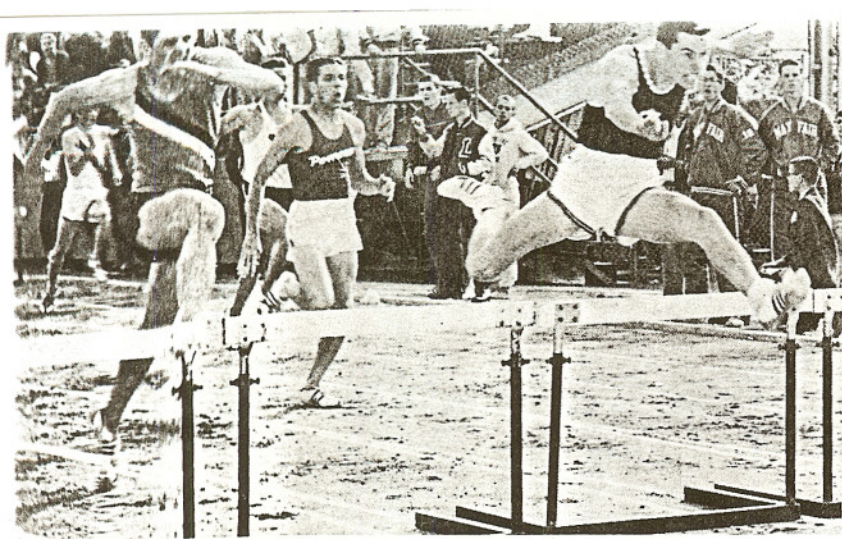


CLIFF HARPER . . .

Cliff Harper, one of the most respected men in the administration of high school athletics in the United States, serves as the State CIF Championship Track and Field Meet Honorary Referee for 1964. Mr. Harper's career in athletics spans more than three decades. He has been a high school coach, a principal, and for the past 15 years Executive Secretary of the Alabama High School Athletic Association.

Cliff Harper is an avid track and field enthusiast. Under his leadership, Alabama schools have increased their participation in track and field and raised the level of track and field performances in their state. He serves as the meet manager of the largest indoor meet held each year in the South, the Montgomery Invitational Meet, held in February. He is presently a member of the track and field rules and records committee of the National Federation for State High School Athletic Associations. He similarly serves as a member of the Joint National Track and Field Rules Committee, composed of high school, college, and university representatives appointed by their respective organizations. He serves as a member of the Governing Council of the USTFF.

The CIF, SS, is honored to have Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Harper with us on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the founding of the California Interscholastic Federation (1914-1964).

WORLD SERIES OF PREP TRACK AND FIELD ON TAP AT L. A. COLISEUM THIS WEEKEND

When more than 300 boys, eleven of whom have equalled or bettered national interscholastic records during the course of a season, converge on one location for a championship meet, an atmosphere of excitement is sure to prevail.

That's the setting in Los Angeles this weekend where the elite of the prep track and field world from throughout the state run head-to-head in the California Interscholastic Federation's State Finals.

Entries from 160 schools—302 boys—have qualified for competition in the 46th renewal of the CIF Track and Field Championships which will start on Friday with trials in all events but the discus and conclude on Saturday with the finals in 13 events.

Trials, beginning at 3:00 p.m. with the first heat of the 880-yard run, will trim the field to the top nine boys in each running event and the top dozen in the field events. Three heats in running events are on the agenda with the first three finishers advancing to the finals. A field of 16 is entered in the discus—the first event on Saturday's card—beginning at noon.

Dopesters figure Pasadena Muir, Long Beach Poly, Los Angeles Jefferson and McClymonds of Oakland, along with defending champion Fresno Edison, to be the chief threats for the team championship. Past records show that in the last six years 15 points would insure no worse than a tie for first place.

National record-breaking hurdler Earl McCullough of Long Beach Poly looks like the best bet for a double—if there is such a thing as a good bet in a meet of this calibre.

McCullough has run the highs in 13.7, tying the national record and the lows in 18.1, two-tenths under the listed national mark. Earl will be pushed by a pair of Southern Section stars—Roger Moody (13.7) and Steve Caminiti (13.7 and 18.1)—in his specialties. McCullough won both events in the Southern Section finals last weekend.

Sprinter Jimmy Hines of McClymonds HS, Oakland, with a 9.4 and 20.9 clockings will also be a threat for a 10-point performance. Both marks tie the listed national records, although the 220-yard curve mark is not officially recognized by the National Federation Records listings. Frank Bailey, also of McClymonds, high jumped 6-3 $\frac{3}{4}$ last weekend and is a new threat in that event.

Previously, high jump headlines had been dominated by Eddy Hanks of Hoover, San Diego, with 6-9 $\frac{7}{8}$; Mike Sloan, Anaheim, 6-8; Greg Heet, Lowell, LaHabra, 6-8; and Max Lowe, Awalt, Mountain View, 6-9 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Northern California musclemen Bob Brannen of Los Gatos (63-9) and Chuck Smart, Los Altos (183-6), dominate the shot put and discus events while the Southland has a monopoly on the pole vault with Paul Wilson, Warren, Downey, 16-0; and Tom Dullam, Buena HS, Ventura, 15-4, leading the high flyers.

Sophomore Johnny Johnson of Pacific Grove (25-2 $\frac{1}{4}$) and Bobby Bonds, Riverside Poly (24-11) will hook up in a dual for the long jump title while Bob Hose of Madison, San Diego (1:51.1) and Devone Smith, Compton (1:51.1) and Larry Arnett, Pasadena (1:51.6), shoot for that magic 1:50 mark in the half mile.

Mike Ryan, Wilcox, Santa Clara, is the featured miler in the State Meet with a 4:12.4 to his credit. Rick Romero, Burbank (4:14.0) and Dave Funderburk, Vista, San Diego (4:14.4), are also closing in on the 4:12 mark, while Sal Mendoza, Santa Ana (4:15.4), and Hill Daughtry, Glendale (4:15.5), are both capable of pushing the top three.

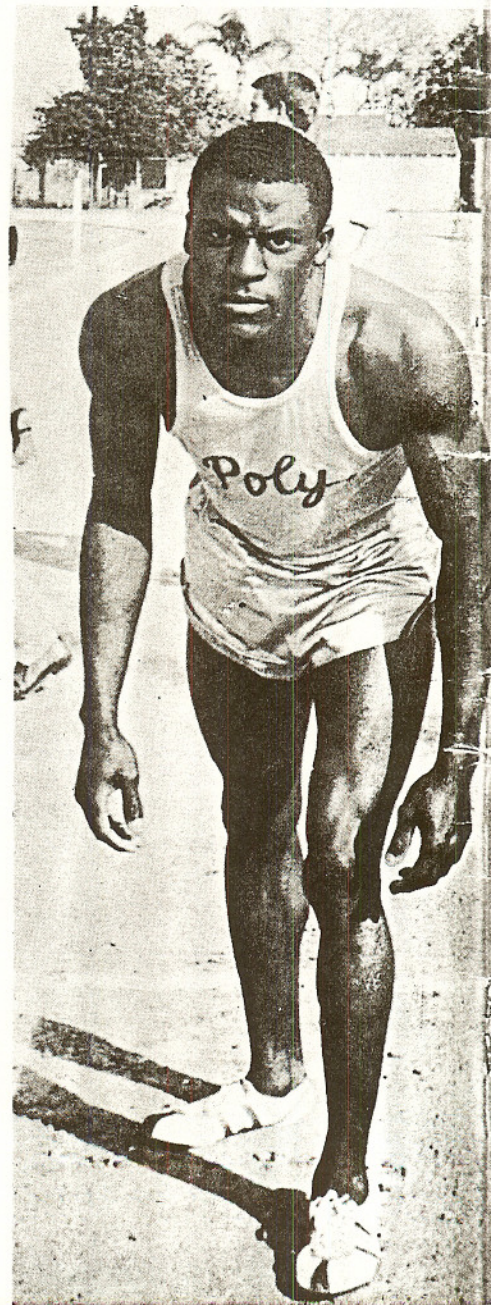
