Westminster Miler Carl Trentadue Runs 4:08.5; Poly Dethrones Muir

Carl Trentadue, a shy, reticent schoolboy miler from Westminster, is one of those runners who could care less about how much time it takes him to run his race. He just runs, that's all.

On a cool, placid Friday evening at Cerritos College, Trentadue ran his way into CIF immortality when it took him only 4 minutes 8.5 seconds to cover four laps in

the CIF Southern Section track and field finals.

Overshadowed by Trentadue's performance before a crowd of 9,440 was the race for the varsity team championship, which wasn't really much of a race at all.

In a confirmation of what had been expected by everybody before hand, Long Beach Poly dethroned Muir, 30-20.

It was the fifth CIF Southern Section title for Poly,

which got considerable help from John Hubbell, whose 63-0½ shot put is the CIF's best of the year and Manuel Murrell, who won the low hurdles in 18.8 and placed second in the long jump.

"I just can't run a pace my coach tells me to run," said the smooth striding senior runner in the wake of an epic high school mile run in which he shattered the re-

cord of 4:12.8 which was set two years ago by Arcadia's Tracy Smith.

"My coach (Jack Hedges) tells me to run my first lap in a certain time, my second lap in such and such a time, and so on. But I just can't pay any attention to it."

At his workout Thursday afternoon, Trentadue was told by Hedges that he could give a commendable account of himself in the finals by running this sequence of quarter mile clockings: 61.0, 64.0, 63.0 and 60.7.

As it was Trentadue accelerated strongly with about 250 yards to go and was timed in 57 seconds for his final lap. At the finish, he was about 20 yards ahead of two milers from San Marcos High, Bill Schabram and Dennis Savage, who also dipped under Smith's record in 4:11.9.

Surprising Time

Trentadue, who had a wool sun cap pulled snugly over his head ("It's a fad at our school") after the race, said he was surprised at his time, which is two tenths of a second better than that of Chula Vista's Tim Danielson, who ran 4:08.7 last week.

"Gee, I thought I had run about 4:15 or 4:16," said Trentadue. And that isn't too bad, either, for a guy who was discovered running in a gym class two years ago.

Now, he and Danielson will be solid threats to defeat the defending state mile champion, Mike Ryan of Wilcox High in Santa Clara, in the State meet next weekend at Bakersfield College.

What's more, Poly's half-mile relay team came close to handing Muir it's only defeat of the year, but finished second in a photo finish. Both teams were timed in 1:27.5 when Harold Busby nipped Poly's Fred Muench at the wire. However, the finish is subject to a review on film.

The season's finest Southern Section performances also were registered in the half-mile, in which Sierra's Dick Joyce clocked 1:51.2 to almost break the CIF record and in the 440, in which Bolsa Grande's Randy Julian was timed in 47.9.
