### BEAR SPIKERS ON THE ROAD; DUAL AGAINST OREGON SATURDAY

BERKELEY ---- California will hope that its strength in the jumping events can offset Oregon's power in the distances this Saturday when the Bears and the Ducks meet in a PAC-8 meet at Hayward Field in Eugene, Oregon.

The Bears swept Southern Cal in the triple jump, went one-two in the long jump, won the high jump and placed two-three in the pole vault last Saturday in the Los Angeles Coliseum. Sam Bell's jumpers will virtually have to repeat these point getting performances to offset the 880-mile-talents of Wade Bell, Roscoe Divine, Mike Crunican and Arne Kvalheim.

Included in this meet will be the 3000 meter steeplechase and the three mile will be substituted for the two mile. The Bears have a slight edge in the steeplechase with Bob Price, fourth place finisher in the national championships last year, while the Ducks have fine strength in the three mile.

California got best of life performances last Saturday from long jumpers Stan Royster (25-3 3/4) and Jim Kennedy (24-10). Both of these jumps were aided by an excessive six mile-per-hour wind so Royster's jump will not count as a University record.

Jim Kiefer with a best of life 48-7 led a Cal triple jump sweep; sophomore Ron Byers chipped three seconds off his all-time best mile with a 4:10.2, and Greg Miguel equalled his all-time best in the pole vault and set a Bear varsity record with a 16-<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> leap.

Willie Nutt gave Cal fortunes a big lift with his 6-8 win in the high jump, and he is being counted upon for a victory this Saturday over Oregon's Larry Sanguras, a 6-8 jumper as a freshman last year.

Cal must concede Oregon points in the shot and discus, where Neal Steinhauer is awesome, and, the Bears are relying upon Devone Smith and Price to stem Oregon's tide of strength in the 880 and steeplechase.

Cal must also get victories from Larry Hengl (440), Paddy McCrary (440 IH), Pat Weddle (220), and the mile relay team, and not get overpowered in the 100, the javelin and the discus if the Bears are to win.

## CAL FROSH SPIKERS HOST POWERFUL SC STRIDERS, ATHENS CLUB SATURDAY

BERKELEY --- California's fine freshman track and field team steps out of its class this Saturday. The Cubs will host the defending national AAU champion Southern California Striders and the very talented Athens Club in a 1:30 pm triangular in Edwards Stadium.

Coming to town with the Striders are the number one and number two ranked decathlon men in the world, Bill Toomey and Russ Hodge, the national collegiate mile and two mile record holder Bob Day, America's greatest triple jumper Art Walker; 270' javelinist Stuart; 1:46.9 halfmiler Ted Nelson, the number seventh ranked quartermiler in the world last year Bob Frey (46.3), seven foot high jumper Lew Hoyt, two 180-foot discus throwers, America's third best ever three and six miler Ron Larrieu; 16-4½ pole vaulter Mel Hein and other talented stars.

The Athens Club will counter with world ranked long jumper Darrell Horn, 7-foot high jumper Gene Johnson, 180-foot discus thrower John Bakkenen, 16-foot vaulter Phil White, a trio of outstanding hurdlers Larry Livers, Al Rockwell and Tom Wyatt, Scottish sprint ace Menzies Campbell, who's sprint duals with Strider Larry Dunn and perhaps Cal freshman Jim Smith could highlight the day.

One Bear freshman will be favored however, and that is high (high) jumper Clarence Johnson. The Cub yearling has climbed 7-½ and has been over the magic mark his last two outings (he has competed in only three meets, clearing 6-10¼ in his initial meet).

Smith, the Southern CIF 100 and 220 champion last year for Upland High School, has lifetime bests of 9.6 and 20.9 for the 220 straight. He has been bothered by a leg injury which is cleared now. He hasn't run a competitive 100 although twice he has brought the Cal frosh from way behind to victory on his anchor leg in the 440 relay.

Other Cubs who could be competitive with the veteran club performers are halfmiler Jerry Tallon, who's 1:52.9 last Saturday makes him the third fastest Cal freshman in history, Cub two mile record holder Bob Waldon, 9:10.0.

Miler Wally Mattingly (4:13.2 last year) and high hurdler Randy Weil (14.6) are others who should show well.

## Duck Shot Putters

### Top Pacific Eight

Oregon's shot put twins Neal Steinhauer and Bob Foskett stand one-two in the weight event, Pacific Eight track and field statistics showed Thursday.

Steinhauer also has a second place standing in the discus event behind USC's Gary Carlsen.

"Super Duck," who became the world's second best shot putter of all time with a put of 68-11 $\frac{1}{4}$  in Sacramento more than two weeks ago, leads Pac-8 entries with the vastly improved Foskett second with a 59-10 effort.

Foskett's all-time best came last week in the non-scoring meet involving the Ducks, Athens Athletic Club and Santa Clara Youth Village.

The Trojans' Carlsen leads the discus event with a 192-7 $\frac{3}{4}$  effort, while Steinhauer has a 187-3, which also came last weekend at Hayward Field.

## North Favored In A-1 Relays

Over-all strength is expected to carry North Eugene to victory in the Lane A-1 Relays Friday at Silke Field with Cottage Grove and Thurston the chief threats to derail North in the prep track meet.

The annual meet begins at 3:30 p.m. with field events and the 210-yard high hurdle relay, the other running events slated for 4 p.m. at the Springfield High track.

For the first time in the meet's history, there will be no individual events.
