Indoor Wrap-up:

MESA'S MIKE FRAY LOWERS JUNIOR COLLEGE 60 MARK TO 6.0

Mike Fray of Mesa (Ariz.) Community College brought the junior college indoor 60 record down to 6.0 in two steps at the Albuquerque, N.M. Invitational, January 28.

The Jamaican national ran second in his heat in 6.1 to break the 6.2 mark set by Pablo McNeil of Compton in the Los Angeles Times meet of 1965 and subsequently tied by Sonny Pitts of Long Beach CC last year plus this year by O.J. Simpson, while running for City College of San Francisco, Bob Brown of Allan Hancock, Ken Dugan of L A Pierce, and Jim Jasper of Howard County, Texas. (Jasper's is the only winning mark of the group.) All indoor records are unofficial.

Fray's 6.0 in the finals at Albuquerque was good for only fifth place, but it was, of course, a new record once again.
