TROJANS WIN FIRST NCAA INDOOR TITLE

Hurdler Earl McCullouch and two-mile relay runners Rich Joyce, Dave Buck, Dennis Carr and Carl Trentadue were the chief heroes as USC scored 26 points to win its first NCAA indoor track championship Saturday night in Detroit's Convention Arena. Oklahoma was runnerup with 17 points and Kansas third with 16.

McCullouch, indicating he's headed for an outstanding outdoor season, had a brilliant series of races in winning the 60-yard high hurdles. His opening heat time of 7.1 set a meet record followed by his semifinal and final clocking of 7.0, not only an NCAA mark but the fastest ever by a Trojan indoors and but two tenths slower than Hayes Jones' world record established in 1964.

Carr, showing great recuperative powers, came back 20 minutes after reeling off a 2:58.7 1320 in the distance medley relay to contribute an important 1:52.7 carry as Troy's two-mile team outfinished Michigan in 7:30.1.

Sophomore anchorman Trentadue brought home the victory in 1:51.8 after soph Joyce had led off with 1:53.0 and No. 2 man Buck returned a 1:52.6 split. Manhattan finished third in 7:31.0, Fordham fourth in 7:34.6 and Villanova, anchored by Dave Patrick, fifth in 7:45.3.

SEAGREN SETS NCAA RECORD

Bob Seagren gave Troy its third first place of the NCAA indoor meet with his record performance of 17 1/211, breaking the mark set last year by Bill Fosdick. It was Seagren's 15th indoor competition of the season and his sixth clearance of 17 feet or more. He boosted his own world indoor record to 17'3" in Cleveland's Knights of Columbus meet Feb. 18. Teammate Paul Wilson finished second at Detroit, clearing 16'4", and Fosdick added a fifth-place point with a 15'6" effort.

Carr's fast three-quarter-mile carry put USC in the distance medley relay lead, but anchorman John Link (4:08.4) succumbed to fast finishes by Kansas State's Conrad Nightingale and Villanova's Patrick. Kansas State's winning time was 9:44.6 with Villanova second in 9:45.1 and Troy third in 9:50.1. Other Trojan splits were Craig Grant 1:53.0 and Roger Wolff 50.0.

Also collecting Trojan points were Lennox Miller (6.3), fourth, and 0. J. Simpson (6.3), fifth, in the 60 behind Charlie Greene's winning 6.0.

High hurdler Paul Kerry qualified for the semifinals with a 7.3 heat in the 60 highs, but failed to survive the semis.

I don't know if T&FN was personally represented at the recent NCAA indoor track championships but here are the observations of one track nut that was there.

Ryun and Patrick proved that a person cannot run two tough races within a couple of hours of one another. Without taking a thing away from Patrick in the 880, it was not a fresh Jim Ryun that competed in the half mile. Only 2 hours before, Ryun had run a qualifying mile race. It was evident after 1½ laps that nobody was going to catch Patrick. He had a commanding 20-25 yd lead by that time and still as fresh as ever. He simply sprinted the entire race. I'd love to see Patrick and Ryun hook up in an 880 when both are rested.

But if Ryun had tried to pull an iron man stunt on Friday, it was Patrick's turn on Saturday. After anchoring the distance medlay to 2nd with a 4.00:6 mile, Patrick came back only 30 minutes later to attempt to anchor the 2 mile relay. Jumbo Elliot should be shot for even permitting this. Patrick collapsed at the end of the race. After one lap it was evident that Patrick simply could not hack it.

The runner who perhaps enjoyed the most success with an iron man stunt was Dennis Carr. Carr ran a very good 1320 in the distance medlay and then came back 30 minutes later to run an excellent 3rd leg on the 2 mile relay.

The closest race of the meet was the 2nd semi-final heat of the 60yd HH. In that race Coleman, Butler, Shy and Flowers finished in a virtual dead heat. I was at the finish line (where else would a track nut be) and I could not determine who finished lst or 4th. It was that close. Twenty minutes later, after studying the photos, the judges claimed that Flowers finished 4th.
