San Francisco--In what was--for them--a generally unimpressive weekend, Pacific-8 track and field athletes bettered the previous best mark in only three events Saturday, the weekly Conference track rankings show.

In fact, in five events no mark was achieved which even qualified for the five-place rankings, the statistics released by Executive Director Thomas J. Hamilton reveal. But in the other 12, some tightening of the requirements for mention occurred.

The new best marks came in the triple jump, where last week's leader Gerald Lee of UCLA upped his best to 51-9, and now threatens the Conference record; in the 880, where Oregon's Wade Bell came up with his best race of the year with a 1:48.2 clocking; and in the mile, where OSU's Terry Smith clocked 4:02.0.

In the long jump, a general reshuffling occurred when it was learned after last week's rankings had been compiled that ranking long jumps by Cal's Stan Royster and Jim Kennedy had been wind-aided. Revised rankings take the lead from Royster and established Stanford's Bud Walsh as the pace-setter on the strength of his 25-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ effort.

Notable efforts of the week include: 21.1 in the 220 by USC's Fred Kuller, 21.2 in the same event by UCLA's Don Domansky; 46.7 by Domansky in the 440; 47.7 in the same event by teammate Gene Gall; 1:49.5 in the 880 by Oregon's Roscoe Divine; 14.0 in the high hurdles by UCLA's great Ron Copeland; 14.1 in the same event by Stanford's Bud Walsh; 52.7 in the intermediate hurdles by Washington's Dave Williams, 52.9 in the same event by OSU's Jim Lockard; 48-2 3/4 in the triple jump by Washington's Eric Klein; 16-6 3/4 in the pole vault by UCLA teammates Dick Railsback and Rick Sloan; 56-3 in the shot by USC's Steve Johnson; and 179-2 by Kirk Wassell of UCLA and 172-4 by Tom Grimm of Stanford in the discus.

Gerry Lindgren of WSU, who has not run a good race outdoors this season, is being bothered by an upset stomach. The little world-class runner is undergoing tests, but the trouble has not been identified, according to Cougar SID Dick Fry. When Lindgren gets back up to par, Pacific-8 distance running will be superlative.
