Eugene, Ore., May ~~19~~ -- Host Oregon, scoring 113 of its points in just seven events, ^{for} a come-through more than a little reminiscent of its 1964 NCAA victory on the same track, "stole" the AAWU championship from ~~the~~ Southern California and UCLA. *Performance-wise, it was one of the greatest conference meets in history anywhere.*
More than 10,000 ~~and~~ fanatics went wild at the splendid effort, achieved mostly on a 1-3-4 finish in Friday's steeplechase, 1-2-3s in Saturday's mile and 880 and 1-2 in the shot put. With 3-4-5 in the ~~three~~ mile, ~~the~~ Oregon scored 80 points in four middle distance-distance races and with a second in the discus and 2-5 in the javelin, 33 points in the throws.

Oregon wound up with 129 points to 107 for USC and 87 for troubled defending champion UCLA, which nosed out Oregon State by just ~~three~~ points. It was a tremendous show in ^{generally} calm, ~~85 degree~~ weather as nine meet records tumbled and two were tied.

Lennox Miller, USC's brilliant sophomore reaching a late-season peak, was the individual standout, winning both the 100 and 220 in record times, 9.3 and 20.6. He had run a ^{windy} 9.2 in Friday's preliminaries and set the 220 mark then, matching it Saturday. Oregon's Neal Steinhauer won his third straight shot put title and advanced his meet record to 66-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ and USC's Gary Carlsen won the discus for the second time and beat Dave ~~the~~ Weill's meet mark with 191-0. Miller anchored USC to an easy 39.9 in the 440 relay against weakened UCLA, Oregon soph Roscoe Divine led the mile sweep in ^{4:00.0} ~~flat~~ and UCLA did salvage three records with Ron Copeland's 13.5 in the highs, Dick Railsback's 17-1 in the pole vault -- OSU's Dennis Phillips also cleared it but Bob Seagren didn't -- and Dick Selby's 241-9 $\frac{1}{2}$ in the javelin. OSU's Steve Pancoast matched

the 440 record of 46.3 and Cal's Paddy McCrary equalled Roger Johnson's 50.9 in the intermediates as he upset USC's Geoff Vanderstock and the two-time champion, Johnson.

(Washington State's Gerry Lindgren, still bothered by stomach problems, and this time the heat too, successfully defended his three-mile title with a slow-for-him 13:37.6. Oregon's Wade Bell was the 880 winner in 1:47.6, one tick off Morgan Groth's excellent meet record and other champs were Stanford's Bud Walsh in the long jump at 24-6 $\frac{1}{2}$, UCLA's Gerald Lee in the triple at ~~50-4~~ 50-4" (on which he sat back), OSU's Dick Fosbury in a strange~~y~~ below-par high jump (6-9), Oregon's Bob Williams in the steeple and Washington in an anti-climactic mile relay. Each of the ~~seven~~ eight teams had at least one victory.

(There was the usual amount of coaches' complaining -- particularly about the tartan-over-plywood horizontal jump and javelin runways -- but nothing serious. There was only one "incident," and, like all that ~~happened~~ seem to occur here, it ~~was~~ involved an Oregon man. WSU's Larry Alberg, driving for third in the three-mile, had to shove past Oregon's Norm Trerise, who moved out a lane just as Alberg came up. But it was Alberg who was disqualified.

(Oregon's victory started shaping on Friday, a combination of steeplechase success and USC-UCLA troubles. Williams timed a sharp 8:51.4 as he ran away from Cal's Bob Price in the last 700 yards and Coach Bill Bowerman's singular emphasis on the event paid off again; Oregon runners have won every AAWU steeple. But perhaps more significant were the others' troubles. UCLA lost Harold Busby, who pulled a muscle in his 100 heat, and Tom Jones, the double defending ^{sprint} champion, ^{who} failed to qualify in either ^{short event.} USC's Earl McCullouch, one of the long jump favorites, was bothered by a leg cramp and failed to qualify there while javelin ~~team~~ ^{team}

favorite John FitzSimons managed only 225-8¹/₂ and missed out on the finals. Incidentally, although Selby was defending champion, his 241-9¹/₂ ^(Friday) was by almost 10 feet his best throw of the year -- and was his only throw in the competition that would have ~~qualified~~ for the finals.

Saturday, Copeland gave UCLA a fourth in the 100 and fifth in the 220 (SC'S Miller and Fred Kuller were 1-2 both times), but the 440 team was less than great without Busby and Coach Jim Bush scratched the mile team with Copeland already tired, ~~enough~~. McCullouch did run the highs (no prelims) on Saturday, and did a great job despite the injury, getting off extremely well and leading Copeland for six hurdles before settling for second in 13.7. ^{to 13.5 for the winner} But failure in the 880 and mile did the most damage to USC's hopes. Those, of course, were also the races that did it for Oregon, in fact and in inspiration.

Every lap of the mile got faster, Dennis Carr and Dave Roberts leading in 62.5, Arne Kvalheim forcing the middle two laps ~~in~~ at 2:03.5 and 3:02⁰ and Divine and Dave Wilborn taking over on the fourth. Divine ran a 57.3 last lap for 4:00⁰ while Wilborn clocked by far his best, 4:00.1. Kvalheim had 4:01.6. Carr passed ^{UCLA's} Rick Romero for fourth, but the ^{in a career best of 4:02.5} effort ruined him for the 880, which Bell broke open easily in the backstretch of the last lap. ^{to win in another personal peak of 1:47.6.} Oregon's Jere Van Dyk asserted himself at the front of a struggling pack in the homestretch to claim second in 1:49.2 and ^{teammate} Mike Oruincan burst to third in the ^{in 1:49.4} final strides. ~~Seven~~ Seven runners beat ^{1:49.8} ~~1:50~~.

The pole vault went longest, as usual, and provided intense drama. Railsback, ^{Oregon States} Phillips and ^{USC's} Seagren were down to one try apiece at 17-1 when Phillips climbed over, his second 17 ^{foot} clearance ever. Railsback was next, and made it easily, ^{for his second time over 17 feet} focusing all pressure on Seagren. Bob's no stranger to pressure, but he didn't get a good jump. He did have the satisfaction of seeing his week-old collegiate record of 17-4¹/₂ stand up as neither Railsback nor Phillips came really close at 17-5.
